This law also kept him pleasant and affable, made him a good citizen and kept him on the "mourners bench so to speak, all the time. It also had its drawbacks, for many would prefer signing the petition until the last moment, in the meantime gulping free drinks at the expense of the saloon-keeper who wanted their signature to a petition. A special brand of whiskey known as "Hack Drivers Delight was used for free drink, and many barrels of this famous whiskey which was used by the saloon keeper for this purpose were consumed. This law was repealed ten or twelve years ago.
