Truman Seeks Greek Aid OK Before Mar. 31

President Asks Program Be Approved By Congress Prior To British Deadline

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26—The Senate Finance Committee today approved legislation placing House Speaker Joe Martin of Massachusetts first in line for succession to the presidency. The vote was 8 to 0.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26—President Truman said today he hoped Congress would okay his \$400,000,000 Greek-Turkish aid program before Mar. 31st, the deadline for Britain's withdrawal from Greece. A newsman asked Mr. Truman whether he would support a stop-gap loan to Greece if it became clear that there would be an unusual delay in acting on his request. The president replied that he preferred not to anticipate events.

The president said that Warren Austin, our UN representative, will cover the whole Greek-Turkish situation Friday in a speech to the United Nations Security Council. The president also announced that Ambassador Richard Patterson is not returning to his post in Yugoslavia. Mr. Truman gave no explanation of why Patterson is not returning to Belgrade.

President Truman told a news conference today that he is concerned over rising prices generally and that he hopes industry will cooperate to reduce them.

The Chief Executive declared that he hopes other industries will follow the example of firms like General Motors.

Golden Celery Is Bringing Price Of \$7.00 Per Crate

Golden celery, a scarce item in the winter vegetable list, is now bringing an FOB price of \$6.50 to \$7.00 a crate to growers here. Pascal variety is more ample in supply, but due to curtailment of shipments from western points, a sharp price advance in this variety is predicted.

Shippers here predict that not more than 350 cars of Florida celery a week will be sent to northern and western markets during the next three weeks.

The supply of winter cabbage, which was hard hit by cold weather coming after several months of unprecedented warmth, is about gone, and in its place is a fine quality crop of spring cabbage. This deal, say shippers, may last for the next six weeks.

Cabbage is now bringing between \$1.15 and \$1.25 per 50 pound unit.

March has been a very rainy month, with 6.12 inches of rain so far recorded by B. F. Whitner, weatherman. Normal rainfall for the period to date is 2.74 inches.

Radar Stations In Arctic Planned By U.S. - Canada

2 Of Aid-To-Navigation Bases Will Be Finished This Year

OTTAWA, Mar. 26—A joint United States-Canada plan to throw a radar screen around the far north today is seen as another long stride in the development of the Arctic wastelands.

Canada's External Affairs Minister, Louis St. Laurent, announced the joint plan to establish a series of long range radar aid-to-navigation stations in the Arctic within the next two years. Two of the stations in the system known as the "Ice Search" will be completed this year, and possibly another station next year.

"These stations are seen not only as materially increasing the potentialities of northern bases, but as an added force to United States power in the international political field."

In addition, President Truman's contemplated visit to Canada in early June is viewed in some Canadian quarters as a further demonstration of the close friendship between Canada and the U. S.

In his announcement of the Loran program, the Canadian minister said the United States has offered to assist Canada by supplying technical personnel until sufficient trained Canadians are available for replacement. The external affairs minister said this aid would make it possible to have the Loran stations constructed and in operation at an early date.

New Orleans Hit By Dairy Farmers Strike

NEW ORLEANS, Mar. 26—New Orleans ran short of milk today because of the dairy farmers strike. Milk sympathizers at Avoyelles, La., stopped a second Illinois Central passenger train and seized nearly 5000 gallons of milk.

Armed men had already seized some 30,000 gallons of milk in the same area. The dairy farmers are trying to restore a price cut in milk that was ordered two days ago.

PHILIPPINES OKAY BASES
Manila, Mar. 26—A treaty providing for United States military bases in the Philippines Islands was ratified by the Philippine senate. Two senators opposed the treaty on the floor, but left before the vote was taken and the final tally read: 15 for, none against.

Clayton Cites Essentials Of Lasting Peace

Under - Secretary Of State Says Stable Economy Through- out World Vital

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26—The House of Representatives today considered the Republican-backed tax-cutting bill as it is. This means that no amendments can be tacked on to the measure. The action represents a victory for those who are sponsoring the bill.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26—Under Secretary of State William Clayton today said that peace cannot be stable or lasting under a shaky economy. This is down, said Clayton, by the plight of Turkey and Greece.

In testimony before the House Ways and Means Committee, Clayton said the more this country can do to bring about healthy economic conditions, the fewer political problems the United States will have.

Clayton said, the United States system cannot succeed all the way while widespread poverty exists. On the contrary, he added, it is the continuation of poverty and need that gives rise to what he described as "the serious political problems in many parts of the world."

The committee which heard Clayton recently voted an inquiry into the 18-nation conference on trade and employment opening April 10 at Geneva, Switzerland. The nations invited to Geneva, said Clayton, will draft a charter for a world trade organization and work for the elimination of trade restrictions.

The Undersecretary of State remarked that this country came out of the war as Mr. Big in the world economy sphere, and what this country does or does not do will determine the course of events throughout the world.

Meanwhile, a Senate committee received assurances from Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz that a complete, up-to-date plan of defense for the United States is all prepared and ready for immediate action. Nimitz made the disclosure before the Senate Armed Forces Committee which is holding hearings on the proposed Army-Navy merger.

Special Cache Used On Air Mail Flight

Several hundred flight covers with small map of Florida and Sanford were sent out on the first air mail flight north and the first flight south from Sanford at the Municipal Airport yesterday, according to Postmaster Joe S. Field.

The third and fourth flights yesterday, however, had more mail than the first two flights, and the later flights were composed entirely of regular mail without the cache, he revealed.

Those who are not familiar with the deadline for depositing air mail in time, are advised by Postmaster Field to secure a schedule from the local agency of the Florida Airways and deposit mail at the Post Office not less than one hour before flight time.

Winter Weather Continues To Grip Much Of Country

CHICAGO, Mar. 26—Much of the nation today is held in the grip of winter weather, snow falls in many of the middle and lower sections of the country, and below freezing temperatures are chilling much of the area from the eastern Rockies to the Atlantic Seaboard and south into the Gulf States and Tennessee.

The post winter storm has caused at least 14 deaths, cut off all forms of transportation, stopped communications and closed many schools and factories in several midwest and eastern states.

The damaging wind and snow storms, which struck the lower Great Lakes Region Tuesday, spread over the eastern states and today are continuing toward the New England states. Heavy federal forecasts in Chicago predict a slow warming up in the Midwest starting tomorrow.

Snow flurries have fallen as far south as Nashville, Tenn., and Asheville, N. C. At Alpena, Mich., the snow measures 10 inches and at Saginaw, Mich., it is 12 inches deep and Cleveland, Ohio, 10 inches.

Five deaths, attributed to the storm, have occurred in Michigan, one of the moderate states that saw the hardest hit.

In New Haven, Conn., the Weather Bureau said winds reached a velocity of 40 miles an hour during the night. Northwest storm warnings will remain posted until tomorrow.

Meanwhile, snow is the main cause of squalls and flurries predicted for Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Court Rejects Plea Of Condemned Jew

LONDON, Mar. 26—Britain's highest tribunal today dismissed a plea on behalf of Dav' Boris Gruner, a Jew condemned to die for anti-British violence in Palestine. The judicial committee of the Privy Council dismissed a petition asking that appeal from the death sentence imposed on Gruner. The action presumably means that Gruner will be executed.

The sentence passed on him by the British military court in Palestine, touched of a wave of widespread anti-British violence by the Jewish underground, Gruner is a Hungarian Jew and a member of the Jewish underground organization known as Irgun Zvai Leumi.

Budget Slashed For Experiment Stations

TALLAHASSEE—State Experiment Stations will have to operate on \$40,000 less than the \$104,000 they had asked for, it was revealed today.

The board of control request for release of the experiment station funds has been trimmed sharply by the cabinet. This was done after Governor Caldwell voiced a suspicion that department heads were trying to spend all their appropriations before they expired next June 30.

Records To Be Kept By Highway Patrol

TALLAHASSEE, Mar. 26—The Florida Highway Patrol will keep a permanent record in the future of all traffic warnings given motorists by patrolmen, according to a resolution adopted yesterday by the State Department of Public Safety as a step toward reducing the state's traffic accident toll.

A monthly report of warnings and the names of patrolmen issuing them will be submitted to the cabinet safety department.

Reds Refuse China Part In Peace Parley

Russia Opposes In- vitation But Agrees To Exchange Writ- ten Information

MOSCOW, Mar. 26—Russia today officially disclosed its formal opposition to having China at the proposed German peace conference. Britain, the United States and France had proposed that China be one of the invited powers to the parley.

However, Molotov agreed to the United States proposal for a written exchange of information on China. Molotov added, however, that his government still believes informal Big Three discussions offer a better means of dealing with the Chinese problem.

The Russian diplomat told Secretary of State George Marshall that he has no objection to offer to Marshall's suggestion. But Molotov added that such a way of communicating information did not seem to him to be entirely satisfactory.

Molotov made known his views in a letter to Marshall. The Soviet minister also presumably disclosed his views.

Seminole County Deadline Is Apr. 1 For Paying Taxes

Seminole County's taxpayers have but one week in which to escape payment of interest on their 1946 real, personal and intangible tax assessments. County Tax Collector John L. Galloway learned today.

April 1 is pointed out, will be the last day on which taxes may be paid before a minimum interest of 3 percent is levied against real property taxes and 1 percent against personal and intangible property taxes. In addition to this penalty levy, Mr. Galloway stated the tax laws require the additional charge of a fee for adjusting delinquent property. This fee is 30 cents per line for real property and 15 cents per line for personal and intangible property.

Attention was also called to the fact that the interest charged against delinquent intangible taxes and any other collection costs become liens against any real property owned by the delinquent taxpayer. Such a lien must be satisfied before the real property may be sold or transferred.

The tax laws require that after April 1, when all unpaid 1946 taxes become delinquent, all delinquencies must be advertised and tax certificates on real property sold at auction.

It also was pointed out that the longer the delay in paying taxes after April 1, the higher the penalty costs become. The interest on real estate taxes begins at one and one-half percent per month with a minimum charge of three percent due immediately after April 1. Continued failure to pay the tax bill can result in a maximum interest charge of 18 percent in one year, it was said. On personal and intangible taxes which become delinquent, the interest rate is 1 per cent per month.

Attempts Made To Save Buried Miners

CENTRALIA, Ill., Mar. 26—Rescue crews were burrowing deeper into ground today at Centralia, but with little hope of finding any of 107 buried miners alive. If the miners have died in the pit, following yesterday's blast, the total killed will be 122 and that would make it the nation's worst mine disaster in 19 years.

Officials directing operations at the pit said it will take hours to reach the area in which the men are trapped. So far, there have been no signs to indicate that any of the buried miners are alive.

All miners were in the pit when the explosion occurred. Only 8 emerged alive yesterday and 18 are known definitely to be dead. Illinois Governor Dwight Green planned to survey the scene of the disaster today.

First Air Show In Orlando To Be Held At Airport Apr. 29-30

ORLANDO, Mar. 26.—(Special)—The first annual Orlando Air Show featuring smoke aerobatics, stunt and comedy flying, delayed parachute jumps, jet-propelled perpendicular take-offs, and-rocket and precision flying teams, etc., will be held at the Municipal Airport here Saturday and Sunday.

Stadium Acker, nationally known aviation director, who is directing the event, said the performance would rival any air show ever held in the United States from the standpoint of the quality of performers and the magnitude of aerial display.

The best civilian professional pilots in the nation have accepted invitations to appear in the two-day Orlando performance, and will be highlighted by Jess Baring, who will demonstrate a jet-propelled take-off. A jet-propelled plane will be held at the rate of two miles a minute. He will ascend straight up for more than a mile in 28 seconds.

The performance will begin each day at 2:00 P. M. and will last for three hours. All planes to be used in the show will be on display at the Airport at 12:00 Noon, each day, and the Eagle Prop Twisters' Organization will present a model plane demonstration from 1 P. M. to 3 P. M.

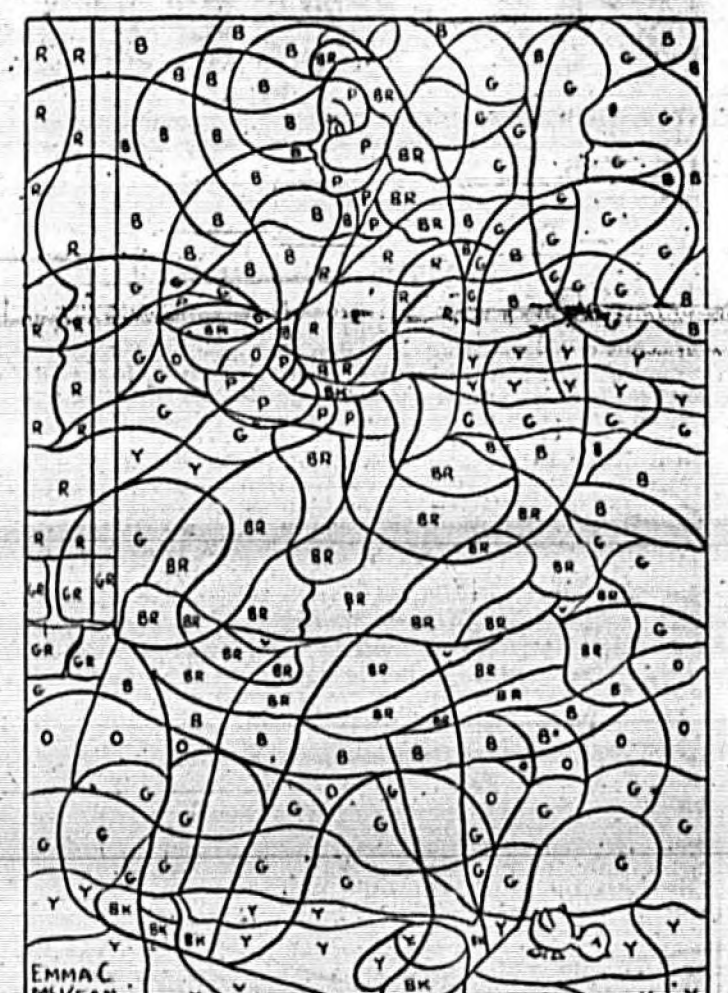

LONDON, Mar. 26.—The British navy and the RAF plan to blow up the island fortress of Heligoland formerly used by the German navy. The April 18, 1947, tons of high explosives will be detonated to destroy gun emplacements, fuel tanks and munitions stores.

Bicycle Lost Twice In 3 Months By Youth

Things Got Hot--So He Started Shooting

DETROIT—Harry Reeves, the National all-around pistol and revolver champion, became the king because it was hot aboard the USS Lexington one day in 1936.

Patrolman Reeves of the Detroit police has held the title as undisputed king of small-arms competition since 1941.

The champ declares his accomplishments boil down to the ability to keep calm.

"It's not so much proficiency in shooting that counts," he says. "It's like golf—you have to be able to keep control of yourself when the pressure is on."

Displaying the steel-cold nerves which make him the terror of pistol ranges wherever he appears, Reeves showed complete superiority over the biggest and best field of rivals in the 40-year history of the National Rifle Association pistol and revolver matches at Camp Perry, O., last September, and in the National all-around championships at Tampa, Fla., this March.

Reeves also set a new world record at the eastern regional championships in Quantico, Va., last July when he hit the targets for 2,646 points out of a possible 2,700 in the all-around event.

Reeves returned to his police duties a year ago after three years

with the Marines. He was on special duty in China most of the time, and hadn't shot a pistol in competition since he joined the Corps in 1942.

"I joined the police force in 1937 after I finished my first hitch—six years in the Marines," he says, "and pounded a beat until 1941 when I was made firearms instructor."

Married and the father of two small children, Reeves is 36. He has a hair-trigger smile and crisp, brown hair. Shorter than average, he possesses a chunky, vigorous frame.

Born and raised near Vincennes, Ind., he attended the University of Detroit for two years before enlisting in the Corps in 1931.

"It's kind of funny, the way I got into pistol competition," he says. "I was on duty aboard the old USS Lexington in the summer of 1936. She was anchored in Quantanamo Bay on the coast of Cuba, and it was hotter than all the hobs. The steel plates were roasting and there wasn't a cold drink aboard."

Reeves was out for a pistol team to compete in the all-Navy games which were held ashore.

"I knew there was a cold drink stand at the landing, and I needed something with ice in it so bad that I volunteered."

GULFSTREAM JOCKEYS
The Gulfstream jockeys are a veritable melting pot of nationalities, a hodgepodge of tongues and dialects. The youngsters who don't brighten up and fare forth each afternoon to boot the babies home, hail from many lands and many climes, while jockey room custodian William Hudson looks after them like a mother hen quarantining her brood of chicks.

Hudson comes naturally by a liking for boys, for he has two of his own, Al and Bill. Al, incidentally, won a few headlines on his own account in the Orange Bowl football classic New Year's Day, 1946, when he scooted 90 yards or so on the last play of the game to lead the University of Miami to victory over Holy Cross.

The elder Hudson is able to qualify as a United Nations delegate after serving a spell in Gulfstream Park's riding room. From Cuba come Abelardo DeLara, Mario Quintero, Enrique Gonzales and M. N. Gonzales; the latter two not related. Ruperto Domingo is Chilean-born and Henri Mora adds a "good neighbor" flavor by coming from Panama. The warm blood of Italy flows through the veins of Joe Liccausi, Al Scotti and Joe Suller; Nick Dennis is Greek; the Bashsh twins, Clifton and Linwood, are probably the only riders on the American turf of Turkish parentage, and there are other representatives from a dozen or more nations.

Hudson accumulates a few grey hairs annually trying to understand some of the Cuban and South America invaders. It is up to him to bear with them, keep tempers at an even keel and be a father confessor after each race as riders pour out their tale of woe as to just how and why they failed to win.

"These Cuban riders tell their story mainly with their hands," said Hudson, "and after years of

dealing with them a flick of the wrist is as expressive as a word. They blow up on the slightest provocation like a steam boiler when they begin to splutter and spout it would take a better linguist than me to find out what's cooking."

There is one thing which makes all riders akin, however—the magic alchemy of the winner's circle. Horses may be prodded and urged home in a hundred different tongues, but it's a universal smile that broadens upon a rider's face in the Gulfstream Park winner's circle, to applaud that is the same in any land.

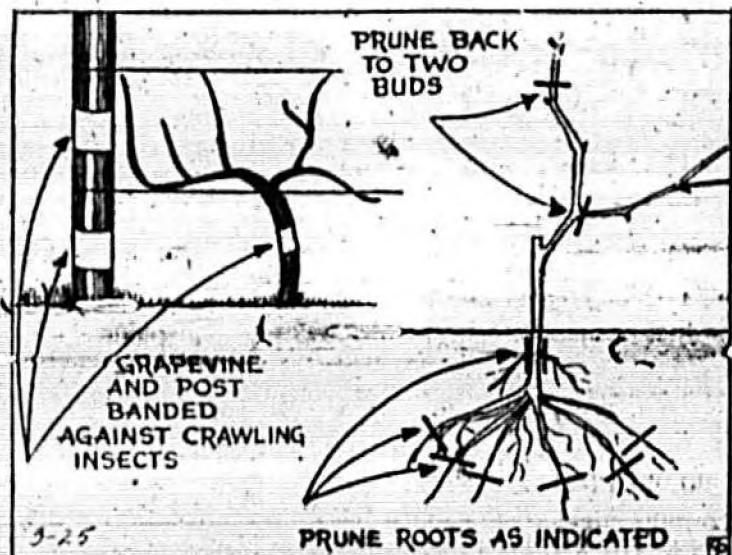

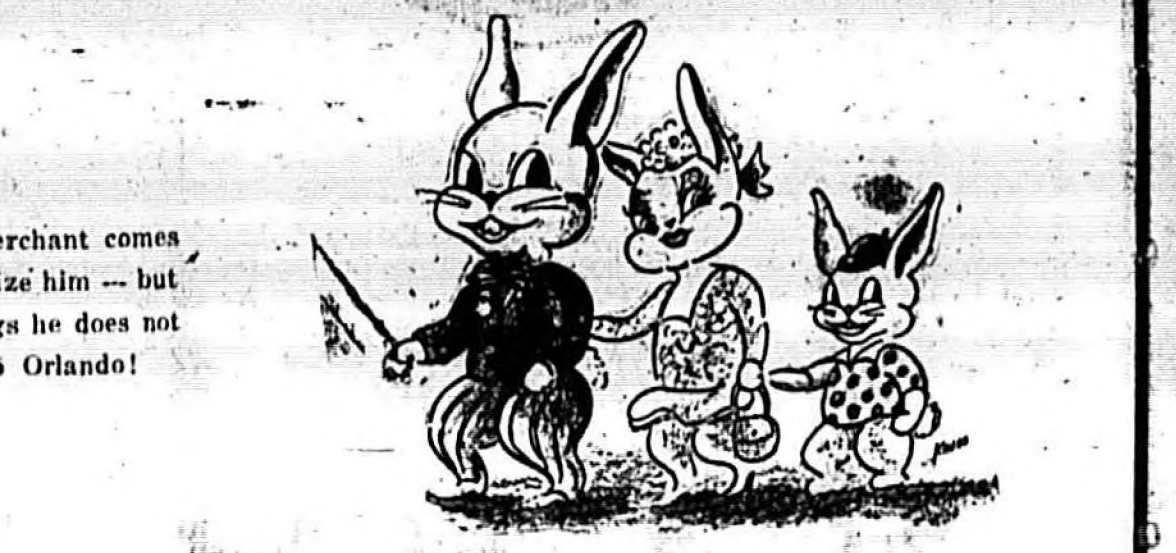
