





Presidential policy as it applies to local school vising local compliance plans, primary weight should be given to the considered judgment of local school boards - provided they act in good faith and within

This policy certainly seems to make it easy for school boards as ours in Seminole County to move ahead and to do so with a maximum of freedom Yet how this guideline can be followed by local

school boards and how much weight the administration will put on those federal officials who may not agree with the presidential dictum is one of the loopholes in this important statement.

We agree that emphasis on the schools as institutions of learning rather than tools to use in enforcing desegregations has merit. Yet it must also be borne in mind that the Nixon administration's slow-Upgrading of the improvement of education for all minority group children to the status of top

priority is a proposal that no right-thinking person would or could oppose in good conscience. We support that but with a provision that this does not imply that a slackening of the federal en-

forcemeent effort to improve the civil rights of minority groups is the price to be exacted!

#### Quick Results?

Just twenty years ago "environment" was little more than a word in the dictionary, except to a few scientists and others in specialized fields. However, as population growth and environmental contamination have reached critical levels, concern for the environment is sudspecialists. It is literally a life and death matter for each one of us that demands clear-head-

One of the first facts to face squarely is that sheer numbers of people are the greatest problem. We should also recognize that if a company or industry had stepped too far ahead of its time in installing antipollution devices, even if they had been available, it would have priced itself out of the market. It should also be realized that as people become conscious of the need to improve the environment, industry will be one jump ahead of them.

As one company comments, "If we do no heed the public demands for environmental conservation, a hostile business environment could have a drastic effect on our market position." . This company has become a leader in environmental improvements both for economic and

" It has been estimated, for example, that a changeover to lead-free gasothe would force the petroleum industry to make a capital investment of \$4 billion in new refinery equipment. Consumer prices would rise

about two cents per gallon as a result.

This is the price of environmental improvement in one area - gasoline. Today, the public is willing to pay that price, and it can rest assured that technology in our free, competitive system will bring the quickest possible results.



# Navy A Reply


JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP)-The Navy Wednesday responded to charges that its jet aircraft were buzzing highway patrol spotter planes by saying such incidents are usually "low-level navigation flights."

Last week a Navy Corsair jet homber sliced through a Highway Patrol spotter plane. The pilot of the light aircraft, Trooper John Hagerty, was killed. Patrol officials said that Hagerty was flying at a low altitude when the collision occurred. A report unveiled Tuesday by Ralph Davis, the Director of

Safety and Motor Vehicles, stated that Hagerty, along with four other trooper - pilots, had complained of numerous incitients in which military aircraft had "buzzed" their little planes

A Navy spokesman said Wednesday the service is "intensely interested" in reports of such incidents.

The spokesman said, however that after investigation most of the incidents are discovered to flights being flown strictly in accordance with procedures approved by the Federal Aviation
