'Forest' Homè Owners Gain Low Water Rate

Herald Staff Writer The Lake Mary City Council has bowed to the wishes of residents of The Forest Mobile home community to create a new category of sewer rates for their clubhouse. But the agreement is contingent upon The Forest nomeowners association, which owns the clubhouse, separating the community's lawn sprinkler system and pool from the regular system serving the clubhouse. A contingent of Forest residents submitted a petitio containing 217 signatures asking the city for special con-

sideration for their clubhouse facility. A spokesman for the group said if the clubhouse were included in the commercial rate category, it's sewer rate would be based on 95 percent of consumption of water. Pointing out that in a recent month the clubhouse was billed 74,000 gallons of water, the spokesman estimated the nonthly bill for water and sewer service could total \$1,000. He added the water used for sprinkling and for the pool does not go through the sewer system.

The spokesman said the clubhouse is not a commercial facility. "It's an extension of our living rooms," he said, adding the meeting place is not rented out to private organizations. The Lake Mary Chamber of Commerce and Lake Mary Women's Club use the facility without charge,

According to the ordinance adopted passed on first reading by the city council this past week the sewer rate to private residences is 90 percent of water bill. The rate to commercial users is 100 percent of the water bills. By separating the water system, City Manager Phil Kulbes said, the water used for lawn sprinkling and for the pools will be billed with no sewer charge. The water used in the clubhouse will be billed with a 90 percent charge for sewer under a separate category. The city expects to take over operation of The Forest sewer system in late November, Kulbes said. The ordinance setting sewer rates and regulations is

scheduled to be adopted on final reading Oct. 23. In other business, the council: - passed on first reading a new energy code ordinance, recommended by the state. Kulbes said the city had little choice about adopting the ordinance and that it is mandated





20-Day Arab War May Enter

Deadly Bombardment Phase BAGHDAD, Iraq (UPI) — Iranian civilian targets faced a threatened Iraqi missile and air bom-bardment Saturday and Tehran warned it would exact

retribution from Iraqi cities if Baghdad made good on

its threats, raising prospects the 20-day war was entering a deadly new phase. Iraq claimed its tanks had crossed the Karun River that divides the port city of Khurramshahr. The river had hampered Iraq's advance to the refinery town of Abadan some 14 miles away. Both sides reported heavy fighting in the area Friday. The political fallout from the war spread as Iraq announced Friday it was breaking diplomatic relations with Syria, Libya and North Korea because they were

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) - Iran charged in the U.N. General Assembly the United States is using Iraq as the new American "policeman" in the Persian Gulf to take the place of the fallen shah. In a tough speech Friday, Iranian special envoy Ali Shams Ardakani said the upheavals in Iran lost the United States "a loyal gendarme in the area." "From the outset the United States has tried to sabotage this revolution. Now it has opted for the emergence of another policeman in the region to replace the shah," he said.





In Manhattan, District Judge Charles Stewart

rejected a motion Friday for an injunction sought by a group called National Save-A-Life League, which claimed the program would "be seen by countless distraught people who could be induced into committing the final act."

(UPI) - "I love you," said President Carter to the hospitalized newspaper reporter whose investigation of a Georgia State Senate race 18 years ago reversed the outcome and won Carter his first elective office. "Thank you, Mr. President," said St. Petersburg Times reporter John Pennington at the end of Carter's unscheduled visit to his hospital room in the cancer unit of Bayfront Medical

Carter; campaigning in St. Petersburg; learned on his arrival that Pennington was sick and told a Secret Service aide he was going to visit the reporter. St. Petersburg Times Editor Eugene Patterson, who accompanied Carter, reported on the meeting. "If it hadn't been for John's journalistic courage and effec-

tiveness, I might have gotten out of politics 18 years ago," the Pennington, an investigative reporter for the Atlanta Journal when Carter ran for the Georgia State Senate, believed the election had been rigged against Carter.



Elderly Man Freed On Bond Couldn't Find Court Chair.

NAPLES, Fla. (UPI) - The judge had to raise his voice so 78-year-old Richard Slatzer could hear that he is charged with running over four little girls playing marbles in the street, killing three, and driving away. Then the elderly defendant had trouble finding his chair in the courtroom.

Ohio Politician Urges Tests

COLUMBUS, Ohio (UPI) - Ohio should consider requiring periodic eye examinations for all drivers, Rep. Arthur R. Bowers, the chairman of the Ohio House Highway Safety Committee, said Friday. Florida State Police said the driver, Rolland E. Slatzer, who wears thick glasses, had failed an eye test for a Florida driver license when he moved to that state from Columbus 13 years ago. Slatzer continued to drive by retaining his Ohio license, renewing it every four years and never being asked to take another vision

In 1977 two bills were introduced in the Legislature calling for mandatory, periodic vision tests for motorists, but heither was approved.

Imprisoned Prof Fights For Secret Ballot

In this case, Dinnan refused and was cited for contempt and subsequently imprisoned. Dinnan, 50, a member of the university faculty for the past 13 years, was recently released from a federal prison at Eglin Air Force Base in Florida. Supporters contend he is a martyr for academic freedom and Dinnan says he is ready to go back to prison if he loses his appeal.

"It was worth it," Dinnan, an adult education instructor, said of his stint in prison. "The principle remains the same and if I had to, I'd do it over again." Dinnan appealed his imprisonment to the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals and his attorneys asked for a stay of sentence until the appeal could be heard. But Judge Owens refused. It

the professor loses his appeal, he could face another 18-month term. Oral arguments on the appeal will be heard in Atlanta "I'm optimistic, hoping the appeals court will vindicate my position," Dinnan said after his return to campus last Monday to a hero's welcome. "If they in fact uphold this inquisition, I

will pay my debt, whatever, that may be." Since his imprisonment, Dinnan has received an estimated 1,000 letters, some containing donations to defray mounting legal fees. His desk is littered with correspondence from 'people I don't even know." Some donations were for hundreds of dollars but he said he was "most touched by a \$2 check from

some guy who was unemployed." Judge Owens, known for ironfisted rule of his courtroom, sent a letter to Georgia newspaper editors explaining his ruling, apparently in response to letters and editorials criticizing his decision.

Owens called some editorials "damn lies" and "deliberate misrepresentations of the facts" and said he wrote the letters to let people know the truth." In one letter, Owens said journalists "have led ... readers to believe this court is sending a college professor to jail for fe'ling to disclose how he voted in an election when the truth is the professor was a member of a faculty committee required

to evaluate other faculty members being considered for Owens said Dinnan had to prove the "Constitution or laws of the United States give the right not to testify" and "Dr. Dinnan

Owens said Georgia college professors are "neither promot ed nor given tenure as a result of votes cast by their fellow faculty members. Based upon the recommendations of the president of each college, the Board of Regents, a state constitutionally created body of citizens who are reponsible for operation of Georgia's university system, determines whether or not to promote or give tenure. "The faculty members only expressed their opinion to the university president who expressed his to the regents," Owens wrote. "Dr. Dinnan and the other faculty members thus did not

vote in an election." Although Owens noted in his letter that an "election is a contest for office determined by votes cast by the electorate,' Dinnan said in presidential elections, voters select the electoral college which in turn elects the president. Premium fuel averaged \$1, 308, six-tenths of a cent

The unemployment rate for Florida increased ap preciably during the third quarter of 1980, reaching 6.9 percent (not seasonally adjusted); according to Donald M. Cruse, regional commissioner for the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor, in Atlanta. The comparable unemployment rate for the second quarter of this year was 5.6 percent. The 6.9 percent rate for third quarter 1980 represents the highest quarterly jobless rate since the third quarter of 1978. During the third quarter of 1979 the rate measured 6.4 percent of the civilian labor force (not seasonally

Total employment dropped over the quarter as the ecession continued to dampen economic activity in the State. The number of jobholders in Florida - 3.7 million - fell approximately 37,000 from the second quarter of this year.





She would cut celery during the day and then sew people's clothes until 11 at night, she said." Now her children are grown and they have their own hildren, and even some of them have have children making Mrs. Brooks a great grandmother. She no longer has to sew for other people but she injoys sawing for her family and self. "I like to sew what I like to sew," she said, "not what someboday else wants." One of the things she liked to sew was a skirt made from men's ties. She picked up a dozen or so ties from Goodwill and sewed them together side by side and finished them off as a woman's skirt.

Dolls are another interest and some have won blue ribbons at art shows. A dancing doll and a rabbit stuffed with cotton are almost as tall as she is. On the walls, sharing space with dozens of photos of her family, hang several smiling clowns dressed in bright Mrs. Brooks brought out a couple of ladies' hats that


year-old tax report recently found in Spain suggests the sunken Columbus' first expedition to the New World in 1492. The ship, resting in 30 feet of water, was discovered in 1977 by Frick and Gasque while searching off the Caicos Bank for

In documenting the wreck, Frick and Gasque have relied on two experts, Mendel Peterson, former director of underwater archeology for the Smithsonian Institute, and Dr. Eugene Lyon, a Florida historian who specializes in research at Spain's Archives of the Indies in Seville.

Peterson said he has "found nothing which would contradict" the treasure hunters' theory that the sunken ship is the Pinta. He said a heavy iron cannon, a lighter swivel gun and a single lead cannon ball removed from the wreck are consistent with the period. "Nothing is precisely datable, but nothing I saw could no
