

Algerian Quake To Feared 20,000

ALGIERS, Algeria (UPI) — Rescue teams searched Saturday for survivors in the earthquake-devastated city of Al-Anam where death toll was estimated at possibly more than 20,000.

"We are giving priority to removing the wounded," a government official said today. "The primary casualty toll might be reaching later in the day."

The Algerian Red Cross, appealing to the League of Red Cross Societies in Geneva, Switzerland, for international aid, said it estimated the number of deaths at "between 8,000 and 25,000."

The entire center of the city doesn't exist any more, said one survivor. French residents said about 100 miles southwest of Algiers, and several smaller towns and villages either wiped out or heavily damaged.

After shocks continued through the night, panic-stricken survivors. The radius of destruction was put at 6 to 9 miles around Al-Anam.

Judge Allows '60 Minutes' To Air Story On Suicide

NEW YORK (UPI) — A federal judge has ruled CBS-TV can go ahead with its plans to air a "60 Minutes" segment Sunday that deals with suicide, despite claims the program might induce distraught people into "committing the final act."

In Manhattan, District Judge Charles Stewart rejected a motion Friday for an injunction sought by a group called National Save-A-Life-League, which claimed the program would "be seen by countless distraught people who could be induced into committing the final act."

Maximum Gas Prices Listed

Florida motorists paid a fraction of a cent less per gallon for full service regular and unleaded gasoline in September than they did in August, the latest Automobile Association of America (AAA) Florida Fuel Gauge Report shows.

The latest study also shows motorists are able to save about 3 cents per gallon by using self-service pumps. Increasing retail competition with the increased availability of fuel has helped widen the difference in self-service and full-service rates.

The latest full-service price on regular is \$1.28, down six-tenths of a cent in a month. The average unleaded full-service price declined to \$1.27, down four-tenths of a cent per gallon.

Premium fuel averaged \$1.30, six-tenths of a cent per gallon, but part of this increase was attributed to more by some gasoline marketers of dropping leaded premium fuel and substituting a higher priced unleaded premium.

Gas Prices Show Slight Dip

The Department of Energy's Regional Office has issued an updated listing of estimated maximum retail prices for the Orlando area.

The DOE emphasized that this list is only intended as a guide to give consumers a better idea of approximate legal selling prices in their area. A station charging a higher price than the listed price in this guide is not necessarily in violation.

Variances in maximum legal selling prices at individual stations can and do exist. For example, higher maximum legal selling prices may be charged by dealers who purchase gasoline through jobbers rather than directly from terminals operated by the companies listed. Also, the longer the period of time since issuance of this list, the less it will reflect current prices actually being charged.

Motorists who believe they have been charged significantly more than the estimated area prices should contact the local DOE Office of Enforcement or DOE's toll free hotline. The hotline number is (800) 424-9246.

State Jobless Rate 6.9%

The unemployment rate for Florida increased appreciably during the third quarter of 1980, reaching 6.9 percent (not seasonally adjusted), according to Donald M. Cruise, regional commissioner for the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor, in Atlanta.

The comparable unemployment rate for the second quarter of this year was 5.6 percent. The 6.9 percent rate for third quarter 1980 represents the highest quarterly jobless rate since the third quarter of 1978. During the third quarter of 1979 the rate measured 6.4 percent of the civilian labor force (not seasonally adjusted).

Total employment dropped over the quarter as the recession continued to dampen economic activity in the State. The number of jobholders in Florida — 17 million — fell approximately 27,000 from the second quarter of this year.

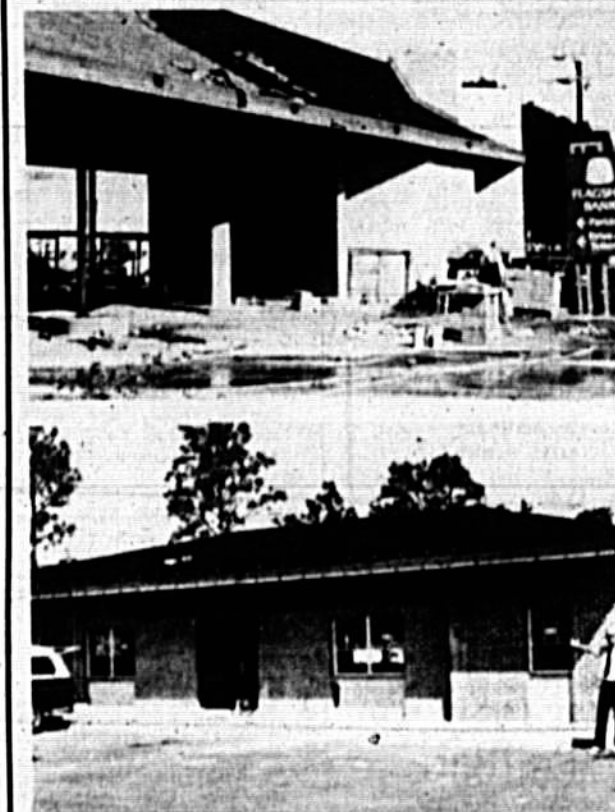

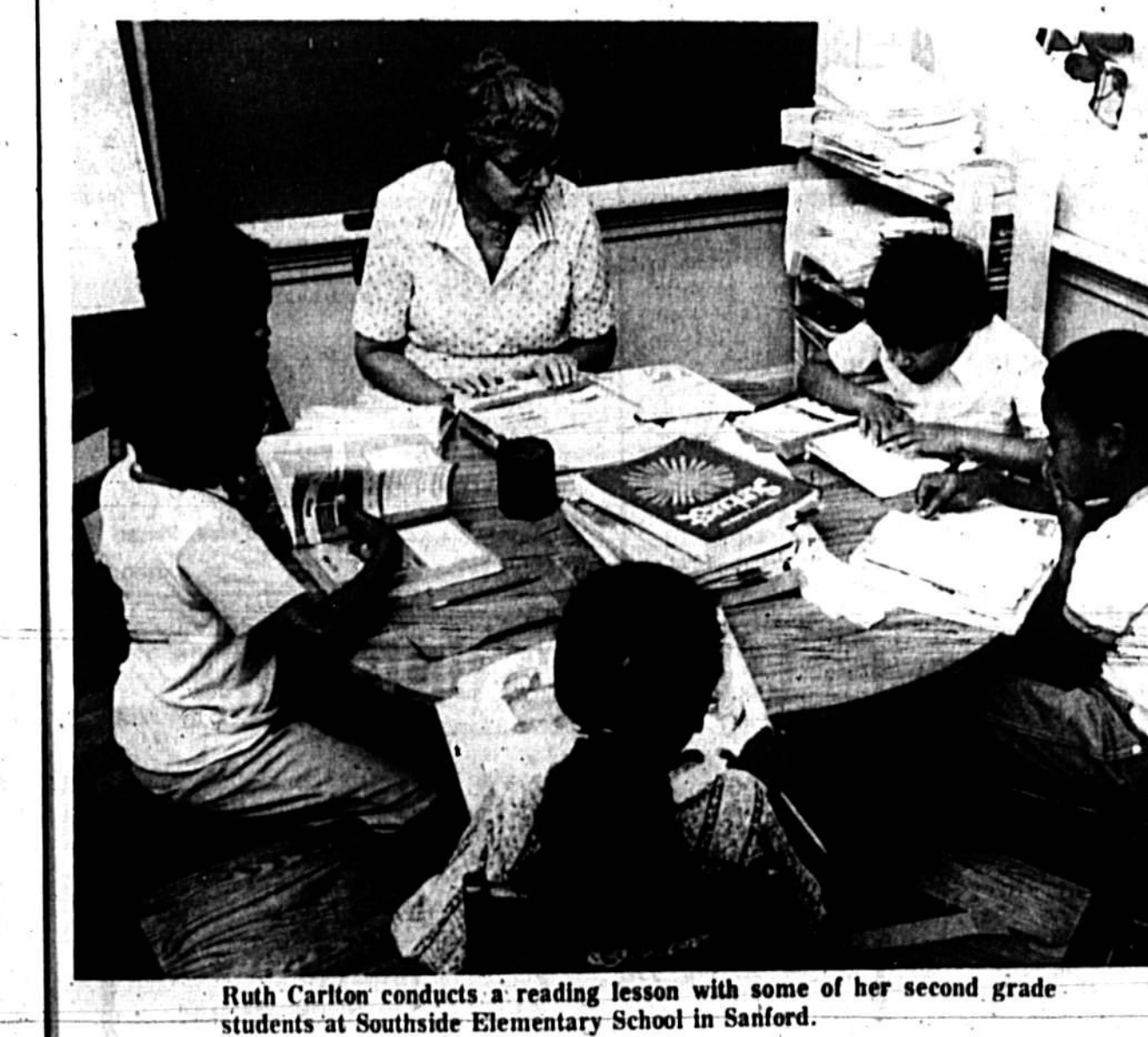
The stuffed rabbit Mrs. Brooks holds is nearly as tall as she is, she says always working on something to wear, a craft or even a crossword puzzle.

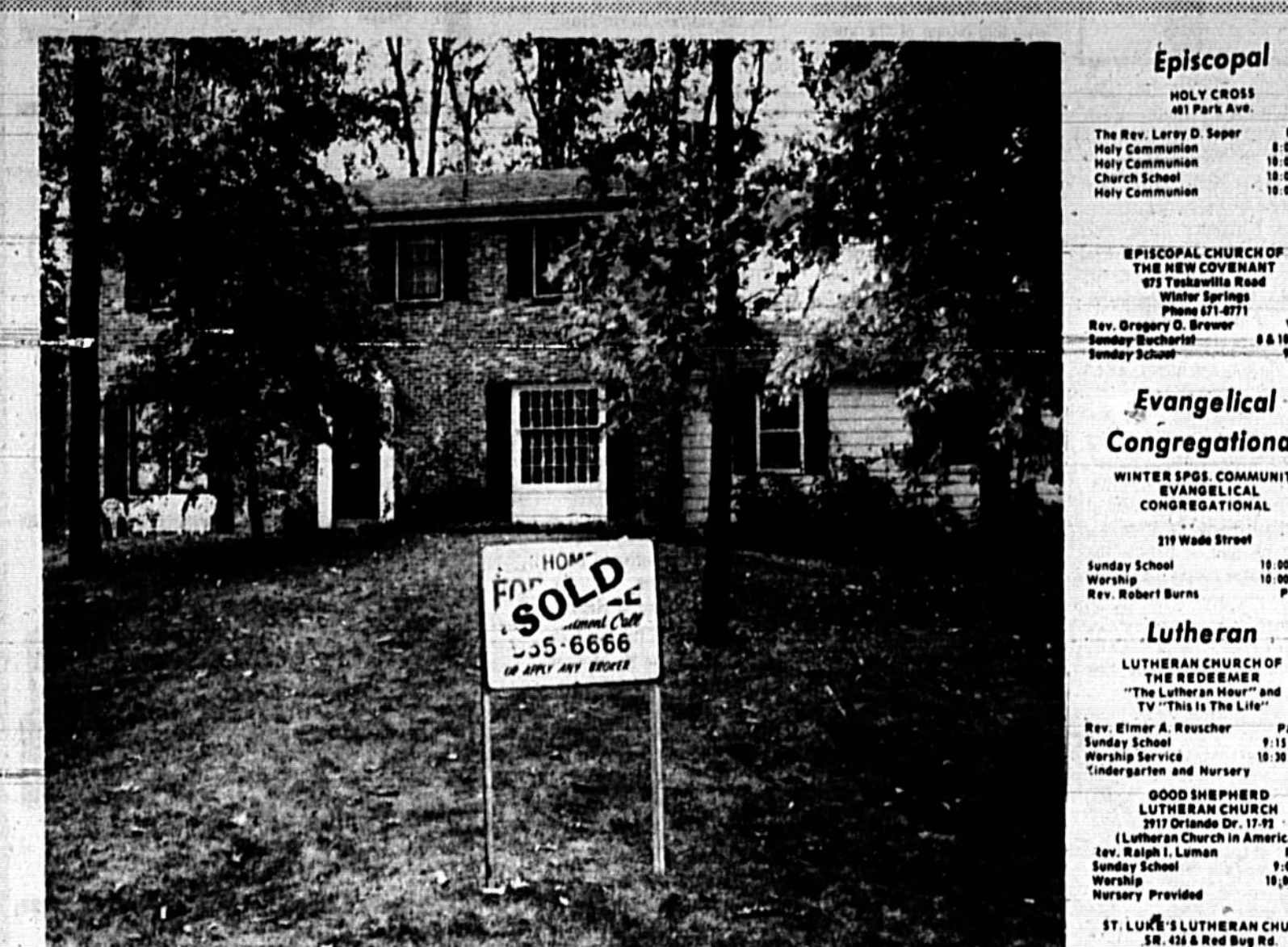

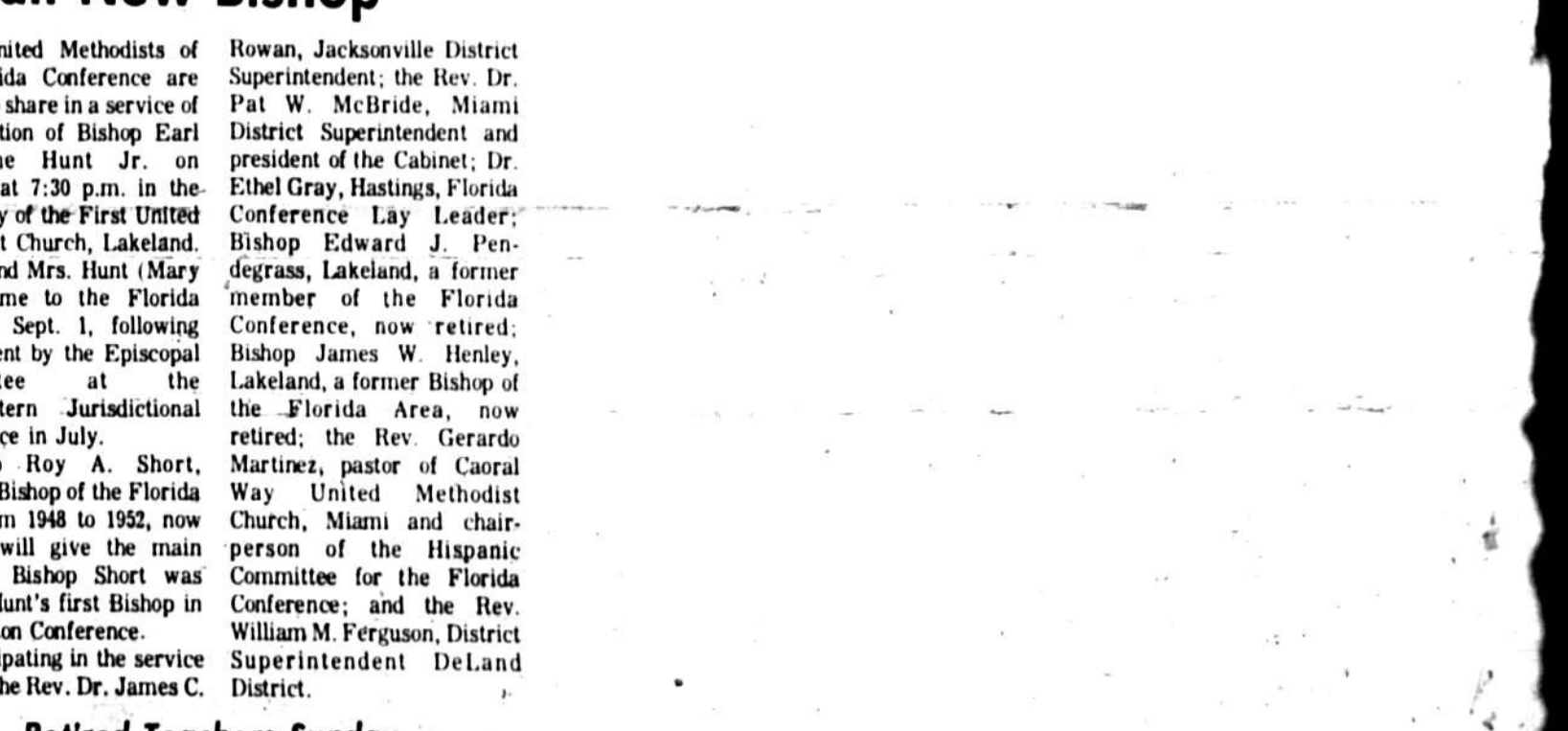
