Florida Survives 'Gasless Sunday'

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

The state appeared to survive its first "gasless Sunday" with few ill effects as motorists took

precautions to avoid being stranded without fuel. Florida Highway Patrol officials along the 265mile Florida Turnpike reported Sunday that traffic was near normal Sunday.

They said they had few calls from stranded motorists although all stations along the route were closed.

"Apparently the people got the word and made

preparations," said one trooper.

The American Automobile Association said they received only seven out-of-gas calls in Dade and Broward counties, fewer than normal for a

"We've been no busier than usual," said one AAA officiai. "It's been surprisingly slow, as a matter of fact."

An estimated 90 per cent of the state's 13,000 service stations honored President Nixon's request to close between 9 p.m. Saturday and

Monday morning.

Only one station of the 30 checked in Fort Walton Beach was open for gasoline sales.

And less than a dozen of the Miami-area's 1,300 were open. Most of them reported a brisk business.

Sophia Slack, who has had her Miami station open seven days a week for 27 years, said she's not about to comply with the President's request.

"These people have to go to work," she said, motioning at a line of waiting cars. But she was limiting sales to \$2 worth of gas for each car. Open stations in Florida's other major

metropolitan areas were also reported hard to find, but busy.

Tourism officials, meanwhile, expressed concern about closed stations along routes that vacationers normally drive.

"Closing gas stations on the turnpike is kicking South Florida in the pants," said Burton Clark, vice president of the Seaguarium in Miami.

Two 90 ton cranes are being used to lift the tanks into Lake Monroe where a tugboat will tow each empty tank to the port. The 21/2 mile trip is expected to take two hours per tank. At the Port the tanks will be put on new foundations to create a fuel storage depot that will be capable, along with 10 smaller tanks, of storing a year's supply of fuel for county government agencies and schools. Public Confidence Plummets

WASHINGTON (AP) - A Harris poll commissioned by the Senate says integrity in government has to be restored and secrecy abandoned before Americans once more have confidence in their institutions. The poll was a sampling from 1,596 persons from Sept. 13 to 22. It found that public confidence in American institutions had plummeted. The rating of the executive branch of government nosedived from 41 to 19 per cent.

Terrorists Even Threatening Peron

Kidnapings and murders of U.S. and other foreign businessmen in Argentina are more than just an attempt to scare foreigners and their money out of that South American country.

The ambush-killing of the manager of a Ford Motor Co. subsidiary in the industrial city of Cordoba appears to be part of a fight to the death going on within President Juan Peron's own political movement.

Orthodox Peronists and the leftists who have jumped on the Peron bandwagon are locked in a struggle that not only threatens the political, social and economic existence of the Argentine nation but which actually poses a threat to the life of President Peron himself.

Little know, outside of Latin America, is the fact that Peron and his wife, Isabel, who is vice in the country, have been the target of

Jose Lopez Rega, Peron's private secretary and minister of social welfare, made the

We, I refer to Mrs. Peron, to Gen. Peron and to my humble person, have received almost daily threats of death. And today it was said that if we came to this function an attempt would be made against us," Lopez Rega said in a speech to metal workers in Buenos Aires.

Although Mrs. Peron, Lopez Rega and Labor Minister Ricardo Otero attended the event, there was no incident. Peron, 78 now and with a heart condition that frequently compels him to cancel public appearances, had had to stay home. Later that evening, Mrs. Peron was

prevailed upon not to attend a mass meeting with some 20,000 members of the "moderate wing" of the Peronist Youth, held in one of Buenos Aires' stadiums. Police were unable to guarantee her security. The youth movement is sharply divided

Approximately 100 employes at Cobia Boat Co. were to be laid off today because dealers fear the energy crisis may curtail new boat pur-chases, company officials announced today. Cobia has about 300 employes working in its Sanford plant, with an annual payroll of ap-proximately \$1.5 million.

Cobia executive vice president and general manager Edward N. Atchley said they are cutting back 50 per cent from a production standpoint, and this will affect the 100 employes. He said the duration of the cutback would be 45 to 90 days, adding he hopes to be back in full

production by mid-January or February Atchley said Cobia dealers currently have

well-stocked inventories of new boats and have delayed placing orders to meet the traditional Spring rush until they see what effect the energy

Cobia is helping find temporary jobs for its people during the short-term layoff said Atchley. He said despite the cut-back 1974 sales are expected to equal those of 1973, which was a




