



Carter Sides With Israel

## On Palestinian Question

By United Press International President Carter is taking sides with Israel in its disagreement with Egypt over a Palestinian state, saying he opposes the creation of a "radical" new nation in the heart

of the Middle East. Israeli Prime Minister Menahem Begin and Egyptian President Anwar Sadat reached an apparent impasse Wednesday in their public statements over the Palestinian issue, only

days after their historic summit in Ismailia. Begin, who won his parliament's overwhelming backing for his peace proposals, said there was "no chance" Israel would withdraw from the Gaza Strip and the West Bank of Jordan. Sadat urged Israel to "re-evaluate" its position if it wants peace.

## Mr. Bunker, The Salesman

Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker is on a nationwide tour arguing the case for the Panama Canal

Those who hear him should have a better understanding of why there is a reported shift in

public sentiment about the treaties. When terms of the treaties were announced last September, it was soon apparent that millions of Americans were not at all pleased with the prospect of ceding control of the canal to the Republic of Panama.

There are strong feelings about the claim of Panamanians that it should belong to them. But the debate isn't over , and Senate Majority Leader Robert Byrd last month said he detected "some shifting of opinion" toward support of ratification.

Mr Bunker says the administration hopes enough of the senators now uncommitted will come down in favor to give the treaties the necessary two-thirds vote for ratification.

If the tide is turning, some credit must go to Mr. Bunker himself-both for his role as chief negotiator of the treaties, which are eminently defensible in their terms, and for his dedication to the cause of explaining them to the American

Mr. Bunker has gone on the road at the age of 83, facing audiences that may be hostile, parrying difficult questions with calm assurance and the conviction of long experience in foreign relations. It is easy to see why a succession of presidents, Democrats and Republicans, from Harry Truman onward, have called on Mr. Bunker for diplomatic ssignments, and not the easy ones.

He has been our ambassador to Italy and India, a roubleshooting ambassador at large, a delegate to the United Nations and the Organization of American States

In 1967, he began six trying years as ambassador to South Vietnam, a post that could have broken a

And in 1973 he undertook the difficult final round negotiations for new treaties that would satisfy Latin American aspirators toward the Panama Canal and yet assure that U.S. commercial and security interests in that waterway were protected. Mr. Bunker is vigorous proof that birthdays can profitably be ignored in deciding when it's time to

His task of negotiating with Panama is over, but not one further task.

"There still needs to be a lot of discussion and education because the treaties generally are not widely understood," he says. "This is what we've been trying to do: covering the country, trying to explain what is involved and why we think it is mportant to our national interest."

The plan now, as was reported this week is for the treaties to go to the Senate floor for discussion and a ratification vote by February. Whichever way that vote goes, a debt of gratitude is owed to the indomitable Mr. Bunker.

But investigators said there were many similarities in the strangling of Mrs. Woodruff, 74, the widow of former University of Georgia football coach George C. Woodruff, and the other slavings.

four people in the store instead of 11," Mrs. Duncan said. "The employees were getting ready to go home. "The robber in the front of the store purchased a newspaper from 15-year-old Colleen Duncan. She began ringing up the sale on the cash register and when she looked up there was the gun," Mrs.

Duncan said. At the rear of the store, Robert Duncan, her husband, was filling a prescription. "He turned around and looked, and the other robber was pointing a gun at him," Mrs. Duncan said. The robber at the rear of the store ordered the 11 persons inside to the rear and demanded narcotics, Mrs. Duncan said. "After the last robbery (which also involved a man demanding narcotics) we decided we weren't going to keep it all in the same

"The robber wasn't very happy, he wasn't happy at all with what he was getting," Mrs. Duncan said. "He wasn't very nice and he kept getting very nervous.
"He looked worn," she said of the robber. "He had a face that looked like he had been around the world and back. "Most of the people in our store didn't know there was a man in the front of the store," she said. "Very few people saw him."
