Sanford's future lies in the willingness of the public and the business and professional men to work in harmony towards establishing a civic pride which will not permit large-scale purchasing in neighboring towns by Sanford residents.

Soak The Innocent

In spite of the volumes of publicity written about the anti-lynching bill which has kept the Sensite from performing any useful service ever since it reconvened, there are still many people who have only the vaguest idea of the actual contents of the measure, and who, we feel sure, would oppose it if they knew what it contained.

The law is not merely one to penalize the persons comprising a mob which is guilty of lynching, or to make it a federal offense to participate in a lynching. It goes much further than that and penalizes the sheriff of the county in which a lynching occurs, and all the taxpayers

county in which a lynching occurs, and all the taxpayers of that county as well.

A copy of the Bill in our office reveals a provision under Section 3 to the effect that whenever a lynching shall occur in a certain county it shall be up to the sheriff, and other officers of the State "possessing the authority to protect such persons from lynching," to show that they were not negligent in their duty in not preventing the lynching. Failing to produce such evidence, they shall be subject to a fine up to \$5,000 or five years in prison or
