

Sour Cream Coffeecake **Delicious**

The batter calls for sour cream and it is layered with a sweet mixture of dried fruit, sugar and spices. In this new version, figs are chosen as the fruit and they add their own distinctive flavor. When we tried this coffeecake, we used the moist flattened figs that come in neat packages and are ready to eat out of hand. To prepare the figs all you have to do is to chop them with sharp knife or snip them into small pieces with a kitchen scissors.

Fool' Dish Popular

By ALY MAHMOUD Associated Press Writer CAIRO (AP) - Fool, the noun, means to English-speak ing people lack of prudence. In the Arab East it means a favorite dish, especially popular

Fool, known in the west a fool is a protein-rich, tasty dish. The dish tells a lot about cook countries. It also reflects politiand economic fortune and misfortune among the lower classes in Egypt.

A fool dish can be extremely chean, costing no more than two cents. And it can be relatively expensive if enriched with ground meat, eggs, tomatoes or the like. The very poor cherish it for breakfast, lunch and supper. The rich like it for break

Beirut and other Arab capitals specialize in fool, and fool alone. But it's done in Egypt one way and in Beirut another. Housewives in Upper Egypt cook it boiled in water and mixed with tentils. In Cairo, fool is a more sophisticated business.

Peddlers of fool roam streets and alleys hawking their wares. brass jars. A medium-size jar is surficient to feed a whole street The interesting, national dist generally is very simple to pre pare. A handful of horse beans -preferably skinned out-is mixed with two grams of lentils and subjected to a very gentle fire for no less than 12 hours to produce the dish in raw shape. Oil or grease is added, plus salt and pepper, and the dish is ready for the table. Sometimes Egyptians add a few drops of fresh lemon to sharpen the taste. That is the simple fool

Lebanese restaurants prepare the fool dish with art and style. They use nearly a dozen ingredients, including tomatoes, eggs and ground meat. But the dish in Beirut is a lot more expensive than in Cairo.

Ten centuries ago, when Egypt was under the yoke of tyrannical domination, the wheat ported to enrich the profiteering rulers. The poer classes had to ook for another kind of staple food. Fool for food was a heaven-sent commodity.






