

Park starts renovations with ceremony this week

SANFORD - A park on the west side of Sanford is receiving \$125,000 in renovations. including a picnic shelter and expanded basketball courts with lighting.

Coastline Park, at 900 West 9th Street, will be presented with a ceremonial check for \$93,750 on Thursday in a groundbreaking ceremony, the city announced. Senator Buddy Dyer will present the check from the Florida Recreation Development assistance

program. The city will hind an additional \$31,250 to renovate the park, Howard Jeffries, a land-

scape architect for Sanford said. Construction on the park will begin in December, Jeffries said. The city expects the park's renovations to be complete by March, 1999.

"It will definitely enhance the park area," Jeffries said: "I'm anxious to get started. Since last year, we've been planning on doing these improvements. There will be places for families and kids. It will be really nice.

A second basketball court will be added to the park, and both courts will be lighted. There will be a large picnic shelter, restrooms, and play equipment for both young and older children, city officials



Boat explodes over lake; passengers leap overboard

SANFORD - A 35 year old woman is in stable condition at the Orlando Regional Medical Center after suffering serious burns Sunday when the boat she was operating in the Seminole Boat Ramp in Lake Monroe exploded. The woman and three passengers leaped overboard as the boat burst into flames.


Janice Waver of Winter Park suffered second degree burns over 25 percent of her body, on the legs, arms, hands, and lips, officials said. She is being treated Tuesday in the Burn Unit of the ORMC. Weaver was operating the boat near Lake Monroe Wayside Park.

The cause of the accident is under investigation. However, officials are investigating whether the 18-foot fiberglass boat was properly vented

We are still looking into the cause," Joy Hill, spokesperson for the Florida Game and Freshwater Fish Commission. said. 'It was an in-board engine boat. You are supposed to vent out the engine area before you start the boat. Fumes can gather in the engine area. It's possible that the boat wasn't vented properly."

The Florida Game and Freshwater Fish commission responded to a call about the boat explosion from the Seminole County Shertif's Office at 12:15 p.m. Sunday. Hill said two passengers in the boat were transported to ORMC.







Shrubs can be planted all year

throughout the year in Florida. In north and central Florida, It is best to plant during the fall and winter seasons. Planting during this period allows plants time to develop new roots and become established before they resume top growth in the spring.

The root ball: The procedures for planting containergrown and balled-in burlap plants are basically the same, but root balls in containers are more resistant to rough handling than those that have been balled-in-burlap. Use pruning shears or serrated knives to make slices 1 to 2 inches deep in 3 or 4 places from top to bottom around the root ball. With balled-in-burlap plants, remove the burlap by pushing the root ball back and forth. Natural burlap will decompose and can be left along the sides but the synthetic burlap will not decompose and

should be removed completely. The planting hole: Dig the planting hole 2 to 3 times the diameter of the root ball. The planting hole should never be dug any deeper than the height of the root ball. Disturbing the soil beneath the plant may cause it to settle too deeply in the soil. Gently place the plant straight into the hole, making

sure again that the top of the root ball is not deeper than the existing soil surface. In compacted or poorly drained soils, the top quarter to third of the root ball should be positioned slightly above the soil surface and soil mounded around it to provide an adequate volume of well-drained soil for good root development. After placing the root ball into the hole, backfill the bottom half of the space around the root ball with existing soil. Mixing amendments such as organic matter into the backfill soil provides little or no benefit to the plant. Tramp the soil to settle it around the root ball, but not so heavily as to compact the soil. Settle the soil by pushing a hose with running water in and out of the backfill soil all around the hole. Construct a 3-inch-high water ring around the edges of the root ball to hold irrigation

water, it should be removed by the end of the second growing season.

Shrube in beds: If no trees or mature shrubs are in the vicinity, prepare beds for planting groups of shrubs by spading or tilling the entire bed to a depth of 8 to 12 inches. If shrubs are already present, keep spading or tilling activities outside their drip lines. Around a tree, do not spade or till, simply dig a hole for each shrub. There are some benefits to amending the soil in the entire planting bed with peat, compost or other soil amendments. If soil amendments are used, mix 2 to 3 inches of organic matter into the top 6 to 12 inches of soil before planting. Then dig holes for each shrub and backfill with the amended bed soil.

Mulching: Mulch newly planted shrubs with a 2 to 3 inch layer of organic or inorganic material. Mulches reduce soil temperature fluctuations. prevent packing and crusting. conserve moisture, help control weeds and add to the beauty of the landscape by providing a cover of uniform color and interesting texture to the surface. When mulching individual shrubs in lawns, cover an area at least two

times larger than the planting hole. Mulching in this manner will establish a shrub quickly by eliminating competition from turfgrass. Pull mulch 2 to 3 inches away from the stems of shrubs. The high moisture environment created by mulch placed against the stem increases the chances of development of diseases like stem rot which can kill the plant.

Watering: Shrubs require months to develop roots into surrounding soil. They should be watered as frequently as when they were in containers. Strive to maintain constant moisture in the root ball, but avoid keeping it saturated. The first weeks after planting, water the root ball every day. Gradually decrease the frequency of irrigation to every other day and then to every third day.

Fertilizing: Shrubs will benefit from a small amount of slow-release fertilizer applied to the top of the root ball 4 to 6 weeks after planting.

Is Lake Brantley fast enough to win a state title?

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS _ Undefeated and unappreciated.

That's the story of the Lake Brantley Patriots' football team as it gets ready for its shot at the state playoffs.

The Patriots ran the table this season (unlike most Seminole County schools, Lake Brantley plays only nine regular season games instead of 10), but critics all over Central Florida are already saying the Patriots are doomed once they get out of the cozy confines of Central Florida.

The reason? Well, the most often heard answer is the lack of a decent schedule, but the real bottom line is a lack of team speed.

True, Lake Brantley has done what it has had to do all year. The Patriots can only beat the teams on their schedule.

But that doesn't seem to be enough for the doubters who only say that Seminole County has been down all year and the Patriots just managed to beat a bunch of bad football teams.

That may be true. Seminole County was awful this season. Only Seminole, besides Lake Brantley, came out of the season with a winning record, and Seminole choked at the wrong time.

Lake Brantley beat Seminole, eased through the rest of the schedule except for a nearshocking loss at Lake Howell in which the Patriots needed a score with 21 seconds remaining, and withstood a so-so out of conference ledger.

So how good are the Patriots and how long will that zero stay in the loss column?

Good question. There's little doubt that Lake Brantley can put points on the board with anyone. The tripleoption is as strong as ever and, as long as quarterback Regan Russell and running back Arnold Celeste can recover from some nagging injuries. Lake Brantley has its offense intact. But can the triple-option compete when it

comes time to meet the big boys? One thing that prevents Seminole County football teams from advancing in the state playoffs is a lack of speed. Runs that go for 50 yards in conference games are stuffed when it comes time to play post-season.

Sure, Oviedo shocked everyone last year when the Lions beat Dr. Phillips in overtime to advance in the state playoffs as Seminole County's only representative, but they were soundly thrashed a week later.

Now the Patriots have to face an equally fast Dr. Phillips team that is only playing on the road because it lost to Evans, a burgeoning state

Lake Brantley should certainly show up on Nov. 20 when it hosts the Panthers. The game isn't out of reach, and the Patriots' defense has been spectacular all season. If the defense can keep the score close, anyone who watches Lake Brantley knows Russell, Celeste or Lanter Bush will break a long run at sometime or another.

The problem is, can they do it enough. Teams from all over the state have been putting up huge numbers on Seminole County teams this season. Fifty and 40-point beatings haven't been uncommon and the reason is team speed

Does Lake Brantley have enough? Well, the Patriots have beaten Deland (in the rain), a truly awful Apopka team, and so-so West

This is not to disparage the Patriots. They have proven themselves to be the best team in the county, but they still suffer from the same slow-man's disease that has plagues county teams for years.

Lake Brantley has an off-week now to prepare for Dr. Phillips. But unless the Patriots can find some studs who can run a 4.3 40, Seminole County looks to take another blow when it comes time to meeting the rest of the state.


after their seasons. Vach said the playoffs were a good experience for her kids.
