ST. LOUIS—Morton Cooper has a World Series date—correction, please, dates—with the New York Yankees. He calls them "dates of retirement."

Two triumphs, says Big Mort, no less.

No feudin' mountaineer ever shouldered a chip more truthfully, nor did anyone ever await the days of reckoning more confidently than the St. Louis Cardinals' leading pitcher.

Due? He's (breathes) For the huffing Cooper, and his battery mate, brother Walker, firmly believe Mort is due to humble the proud New York club this time just as they humbled Mort in the 1942 Series.

"I'm good enough to beat the Yankees," Cooper says grimly. "I can beat them any time. They hit the same way we do in the National League. They're no tougher than anyone else. No in my book, anyway."

"One thing you can tell them that—if those Yankees catch me when I feel good, they are going to have a battle. They won't knock me out of two games, again."

"I was picking hard down a two-month stretch last year, getting three days' rest and growing as fat as in the clutch. I got plenty of rest this season."

"That superstition stuff is all bunk. We liked that bunch last October. Only difference is, this time I'm going to have something to say about it. They don't scare me. Hell, if nothing else, the law of averages should be with me."

Under Pressure in '42

There is no doubt that the 6-foot, 1-inch moundman was terrific pressure in the World Series 1942 campaign. The Redbirds won the pennant the last day.

He recorded 10 shutouts. He was matched against the best hurlers of every opposing club. It was a strain. It was a credit to the big fellow's ability that he came through in championship style.

There was no tension in this campaign, and the 2-year, 20-game winner once lollied 11 days between jobs.

Walker Cooper, Cardinal captain who has played a lot of baseball himself this year and is strictly upper class in the league, backs his older brother to the bit pitch.

Yankees Entering World Series With Unusual Handicaps

NEW YORK—Somehow this year's World Series doesn't look like the other 13 in which the Yankees have participated. It will be the first time the Bronx Bombers have entered the fall classic without at least one outfielder hitting above .300.

That's one of the "figger fibberts" Charley Keller, a notoriously long-ball hitter, probably will have placed in the record books a good number of homers and runs batted in before he is finished, but King Kong has fallen short of the 300 circle four straight seasons after hitting .333 as a freshman in 1939.

Buffalo's Joe McCarthy has led the Yankees successfully through eight American League campaigns, but never without the aid of a .300-hitting outer gardener until this year.

During McCarthy's six previous Series he had one Joe DiMaggio, now in the Army. The West Coast Wizard never failed to hit below .300 in seven years DiMaggio's lifetime American League record is .329. DiMaggio started hitting in 1936 for McCarthy's second championship Yankee team.

In 1938, McCarthy's first pennant-winning campaign in the junior loop—he led the Cubs to the senior flag in 1939—the Yankees had Earl Combs go through the

season with a .321 mark. And during Miller Huggins' era there was Babe Ruth with Combs lending a helping hand.

Ruth hit .378 for the first Yankee winner in 1923 and was well above the charmed circle when the Yanks walked through the opposition the following year and again for the "three year stretch, 1928 through 1930."

Thus, Keller's home run capabilities notwithstanding, the present Yankee outfield is a far cry from the days of Ruth, Combs and DiMaggio. They're all nice fellows—Johnny Lindell, Roy Weatherly, Bud Athey and Tuck Statback—but being nice is not enough to win World Series games.

Lindell was converted from a pitcher. He was the rare last Spring while hitting above .300 but the American League pitchers finally caught up with him. Here's a chap who kept the Yanks in the running during the early stages of the campaign. Now he may not start.

Weatherly hit .325 in 36 games as a Cleveland freshman, but that was back in 1936 and he never came close to that mark again.

Metheny hit a neat .294 for Newark in '42 but the Bears aren't in the American League.

Statback, 21, was used sparingly by the Yanks this year, but he's a good veteran to have around.

Lawyer-Warrior Pens Moving Testimony Why He Gave Life

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 6, 1943. "My dearest parents," began the letter of Navy Lieut. (jg) Walter M. Bonaparte, young lawyer who had hoped never to have to write this, for over a long period, even after being sent overseas, I had been safe and secure, but lately I have been in some tight spots. I do not expect to die in this war—no one does—but I am playing on my luck more and more. Only in the event it does not hold out will you get this letter.

It would not be written now for I have no premonition of death very it not that I know full well

the place that I and my personal welfare play in your lives and your hearts. This cannot ease your grief, but it may serve to convey my frame of mind at the prospect of losing my life, and my frame of mind may be some importance to you.

At first when I knew I was in danger I thought a lot about it. I worried continually, frantically, at the thought of all the happiness I would miss in my married life that started out so wonderfully, and of how you, who have built your lives around my health and happiness and success, would feel.

"After a while I ceased to think of dying. Now I never do—except in moments like this, when I do so for a definite purpose. I am usually and normally prepared. My primary thoughts out here are of life, of winning the war and returning some day to you and to my dear wife.

Florida Farm Leaders Want Labor Imported

TALLAHASSEE, Oct. 6. (FNS)—Governor Holland advised C. Du Bois, chief of the State Department's Caribbean division, this week that Florida farm leaders want Jamaican laborers again this winter.

The Governor stated that he understood at least 4,500 Jamaicans will be available for work in Florida, and that the United States Sugar Corporation at Clewiston can use 3,500 of them.

He said definite plans should be made for placing the additional 1000 before any movement of the workers into Florida.

Present indications point to a shortage of agricultural labor in citrus and trucking areas while packinghouses, canning plants, crate and box manufacturers, feed processors, and can manufacturers operating in this area are all facing an acute labor problem.

Florida's coming crops must be saved and while the importation of workers will help it only a little, the packing houses and themselves are going to have to help by working full or part time in canning plants, packing houses and allied industries when the season gets underway if we hope to deliver to the armed services at home and abroad the vast quantities of canned and processed fruit and vegetables they require.

Francis P. Whitehair Promoted in Navy

DELAND, Oct. 6. (FNS)—Francis P. Whitehair, runner up in the last gubernatorial campaign, received a promotion from the Navy Department to the rank of lieutenant-commander.

Following his graduation from the School of Military Government at Columbia University last June, Whitehair served as an instructor on the subject of Naval law. He then served on active sea duty in the Atlantic.

Whitehair left last week for an assignment in the Pacific area. He desires to protect those individuals whom he holds dearest. He doesn't claim that this is the reason for any other man's participation in the war. It is my duty.

"So the fact that I am dying while I am protecting you does not appeal to me in the least. If I do I shall be happy to have done what I have to preserve your lives and way of life and all of the sacrifices and effort on your part to rear me as a good citizen, educated and successful, are not so although you will grieve, not please do not, be bitter. Know that I am smiling here as I write at sea—that I am content that you did a good job of rearing me to do what I must do for the fullest, without loneliness or pain. Wherever I am, I will be at peace, and if there is a heaven I have a clear conscience and clean soul. And know, also that I love you above all and that to me you are the greatest, dearest people in the world."

Here Are 8 Ways To Lessen Fire Hazards in Home

During the first six months of 1943 fires in the United States caused property losses exceeding \$190,000,000, according to the statistics of fire protection authorities. Fire fatalities, they predict, will exceed 10,000 before the end of the year, with the majority of the victims women and children.

Six out of every ten of these fires occur in homes. Because most, if not all, home fires are preventable, home owners are being urged to take extra precautions against fire for the duration. Civilian defense authorities have classified carelessness and negligence about fire with sabotage by enemy agents.

Years of study have shown these are the principal causes of home fires: faulty wiring, defective chimneys, combustible roofs, defective heating apparatus, matches and careless smoking, gas leaks and kerosene, and electrical defects.

How to Prevent Fires
To protect their property and families, householders should remove all fire hazards and exercise extreme care at all times. Here are some suggestions:

Check for Defects
Make a careful examination of the heating system. Check for chimney cracks, sooty or clogged chimneys or flues, stores, or pipes near exposed woodwork of other burnable material.

Check for Defects
Check all electric wiring for worn insulation; check the fuses and see that proper fuses are installed; make certain that lamp shades are a safe distance from the lamp.

Use Fireproof Materials
Use fireproof materials, such as asbestos shingles, or an approved fire resistant material, in replacing chimney caps.

Clear Out Rubbish
Clear out all rubbish from basement and attic. Use covered metal cans for ashes and rubbish. Burn all rags after use or keep them in a covered metal receptacle.

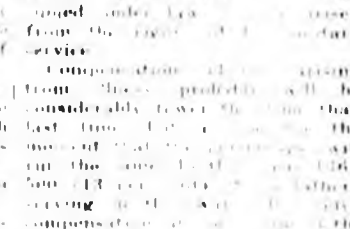
