



Fifth Army Is Continuing Its Drive In Italy

Americans Are Within 83 Miles Of Rome As British Seize Petaccio

The American Fifth Army forced the Germans into a violent, scorched earth retreat today to a line stretched from the mountain fastness of Venafro, 83 miles southwest of Rome, to the Mediterranean village of Mondragone, 90 miles below the Italian capital.

The British Eighth Army pushed the right anchor of the Allied line five miles forward to seize Petaccio on Adriatic, nine miles above Teramo.

A wide operational breakthrough on the southern Russian front placed the Red Army 20 miles west of the Dnieper River, within 200 miles of Rumania, 400 miles of the Black Sea, and 195 miles of Olinda.

Forgotten Fuel

Once having unhitched the horses on his own 200-acre plot, Mr. Martin wasted no time, but began at once to cut down trees for the log cabin which he hopes to have built before winter really closes in.

F.D.A. Auctions 10,578 Cases Of Eggs In Capital

Purchased For Government Use And Then Not Needed

NEW YORK CITY, Oct. 20. (AP) The New York Office of the Food Distribution Administration announced recently that 10,578 cases of eggs, once bought for government use and later declared to be not needed, were sold at auction yesterday by the F.D.A. in Washington. Bids will be taken soon on 5,021 unsold cases, the F.D.A. said.

All sales were for the rolling prices for the various grades, ranging from 13 cents a dozen for No. 1 standards to 31 cents

a dozen for No. 2 extras. Of the 8,921 unsold cases, about 1,000 are in the New York-New Jersey area, the F.D.A. said.

An estimated cut in per capita civilian butter consumption from the pre-war level of sixteen pounds to between ten and eleven pounds in the next year, was predicted yesterday by Dr. Tom G. Stitts, chief of the Dairy and Poultry Branch of the F.D.A., who earlier in the week had presented a "butter program" to Midwest creamery interests.

The latest F.D.A. report on government butter holdings showed the total supply throughout the country on Oct. 1 to be 232,436,000 pounds, compared with 123,599,000 a year ago and an average of 163,988,000 for the five-year period, 1938 to 1942 inclusive.

Dr. Stitts estimated that in the twelve months beginning Oct. 1 the armed forces would require about 300,000,000 pounds of butter; the Veterans Administration and other war services, an additional 2,000,000 pounds, and the

Chicago Opens First Subway After 30 Years

Road Has 10-Ct. Fare And Varied Colors To Identify Stations

CHICAGO, Oct. 20. (AP) Chicago after 30 years of work now has in actual operation its long-awaited and much discussed subway.

Tape-breaking ceremonies were held last Saturday, but Chicago citizens, who for years had been patiently packed into streetcars and buses, or hustled onto clattering elevated cars, couldn't buy rides on the swift underground system until the witching hour Sunday morning.

Subway Commissioner Philip Harrington handed Mayor Edward J. Kelly a motorman's control lever, which the Mayor turned over to Bernard J. Fallon, trustee of the Chicago Rapid Transit Company, which has been excavated from the

pany in exchange for sections. Then he cut a ribbon across the tracks under State and Madison Streets.

The public rode down to inspect the subway platforms on the most modern accident-proof escalators, breathed the air-conditioning air, blinked at the fluorescent "daylight" illumination, and pronounced the whole works good.

Known as "Route No. 1," the 4.9 miles of completed track have cost \$24,000,000. Fifty additional miles of tubes are planned when construction and labor difficulties are eased. Fares will be 10 cents.

There are innovations in the subway commanding the highest respect of engineers. It's the first subway in the world to use fluorescent lighting, giving uniform intensity of illumination and reducing shadows and glare.

Each of the 16 stations has its own identifying color scheme, with rotation of primary colors—blue, red, green and brown. A passenger who doesn't know how to read station signs ought to be able to get off at the right color. Side walls of the stations are finished in gray structure glass, a non-scratchable material that will prevent any one who likes to write in public places from drawing pictures or scrawling "Johnny loves Mary" in the subway.

Accident-proof reversible escalators connect the mezzanine stations with train platforms. The latest in automatic train control will stop a train if the operator runs past a red signal and will keep a train within its proper maximum speed. Operating noises are reduced on resilient pad inserts in the tie-plates.
