



SANFORD — The state of Florida Elections Commission will investigate allegations made against Bernard Mitchell by incumbent Commissioner Art Woodruff, who narrowly won the March 29 runoff race for District 1 by 69 votes.

Woodruff said he filed the complaints before the end of the election. The complaint docu-

Mitchell said there may have been oversights by his campaign, but he has nothing to hide. He has waived his right to remain silent about the case, he said, and as soon as he produces a response to the allegations, he will make that statement public

The complaints center on a campaign advertisement in The Sanford Herald and telemarketing calls made to voters on the weekend before the

The advertisement depicts Mitchell with clergy members who supported his campaign. Another photo shows former candidate Hank Dieckhaus with Mitchell. The words, "I'm backing Bernard," are attributed to Dieckhaus. The problem, Woodruff said, is with two other photos at the

bottom of the ad. One shows Mitchell presenting

awards to officers from the Sanford Police Department for community service. Included in that photo is Sanford Police Chief Brian Tooley.

The other has Sanford Commissioner Randy Jones presenting a proclamation from the city to the Martin Luther King Committee in 2003. Mitchell was chairman of that committee at the time.


Woodruff said in an interview that those two photos demonstrate endorsement by Tooley and Jones.

"It's an implied message of endorsement," Woodruff

In the complaint, he writes: "None of the persons in these two photos had prior knowledge or agreed to the use of their photo in a campaign."

# Wilson Elementary cheers favorite children's author

SANFORD — For a reading teacher, a visit from children's author and illustrator Ian Brett is better than winning the lottery.

Brett, who has illustrated 31 books including "The Mitten," "The Hat," and now "The Umbrella," picked Wilson Elementary teacher Martha Rydenbark's name out of more than 270,000 eligible entries.

"I've never won anything in my life," said Rydenbark, who now teaches first grade at Wilson. Each year, Brett visits one school for a daylong visit. The renowned children's illustrator runs the contest from her Web site at janbrett.com.

Brett spent the morning talking with the stu-

dents at Wilson, then she signed a book or two or three for each student at the school. Each highly legible autograph was accompanied by a symbol or animal from the book signed.

"She's been one of my favorite authors," Rydenbark said. "She has been speaking with each child and drawing them pictures."

Brett and her musical husband, Joe Hearne, traveled from their home on the Massachusetts' coast to spend Monday with students, teachers, and parents at Wilson.

Hedgie the Hedgehog made the trip as well. He is a key character in many of Brett's books, which are known for their lavish artwork and special borders that give readers a bit more.

# Thieves steal \$120,000 from Heathrow

HEATHROW Homeowners' Heathrow Master Association is offering a \$1,000 reward for information that leads to the capture of burglary suspects who broke into a number of homes the weekend of April 1 and stole close to \$120,000 in jewelry and other personal items.

The Master Association is assisting the Seminole County Sheriff's Office in the quest for information, after a half dozen homes were targeted in the gated community.

Sheriff's Office said the burglaries have occurred on three different occasions during the past few weeks. In two separate cases, electronic equipment and a vehicle were stolen.

In several of the burglaries the master bedroom window was smashed, in which Sheriff Spokesman Steve Olson said investigators believe it was broken with a rock they found near one of the smashed windows.

In one residence, an 18K white gold American Tank Cartier watch, with an estimated value of \$23,000 was stolen. A news release from the The watch was engraved, also.

Another resident Heathrow had 31 items stolen from the home, including a pair of 2-carat diamond earrings with a platinum setting worth \$12,000. Other items stolen from the residence included: a diamond pendant set in platinum with platinum chain that has four, half carat diamonds; a platinum bracelet with eight, 1/4 carat diamonds; diamond shaped pendant from Tiffany's; a Georgio Viscoti diamond ring; a heartshaped pendant with diamonds; a diamond encrusted Star of David set in white gold; an unknown quantity of U.S. savings bonds; a platinum



ects in which Grieshaber is currently involved.

Colbert recommended that the City Commission accept Grieshaber's resignation letter with the conditions. He told them that how the city manager leaves will reflect on the commission and will impact the quality of applicants the City Commission receives.

"Be kind to him as he leaves," Colbert advised.

District 3 Commissioner Randy Jones suggested to his fellow commissioners that it may behoove them to immediately have someone step in to take over the day-to-day operations of the city. He later retracted his statement after hearing Colbert's advice.

"I agree with that completely," Jones said.

Before the city accepted Grieshaber's resignation, District 1 Commissioner Art Woodruff requested a discussion on what to do in the of manager you want,"

interim.

Colbert advised the commission that it would need someone to step in. The city attorney also suggested V. Eugene Miller, a retired city manager with 41 years experience, as a possible interim city manager.

Colbert's law firm, Stenstrom, McIntosh, Colbert, Whigham, Reischmann and Partlow, P.A., has had experience with Miller in the past in the city of Oviedo and prior to that in Orange City.

Miller served in Orange City as interim city manager for almost two years, Colbert said, because the city had problems getting a new city manager on board.

"My feeling, and only my feeling, which is based on 35 years experience is to take a little time, catch your collective breath, talk with each other, set goals and objectives, and decide what kind Colbert told the commission.

Colbert said the search for a new city manager would take at least six months, and maybe even closer to nine months, and Miller would be a good person to assist them in the process of finding the right city manager.

The commission also decided, on the suggestion from District 2 Commissioner Velma Williams, that Lonnie Groot act as temporary city manager dealing in the dayto-day operations, until a decision was made on an interim city manager.

"It's something that other cities have done," Williams

Colbert agreed that Groot could do that, but for only a few weeks, and not to exceed 30 days

"If that's what the city wants," Colbert said.

Woodruff agreed that was a viable option but said: "I think it's unfortunate that we've come to this."

District 4 Commissioner Kevin Hipes told Grieshaber it had been a pleasure working with him. Hipes, along with Woodruff were the two votes against the motion to not renew Grieshaber's contract in January.

"There's been highs and lows," Hipes said. "I think even Al agrees this is the

right thing to do." The commission passed a

motion unanimously to use Groot, from the city attorney's office, as acting city manager, not to exceed 30 days. Next, they agreed to meet with Colbert's recommended interim city manager, Miller, next Wednesday.

Learned Mellonville Avenue spoke during the citizen participation portion of the commission meeting to express his appreciation for city manag-

Learned said Grieshaber has been in control of the day-to-day city affairs, and in the face of the construction projects, hurricanes and other city projects, he has put Sanford in a better situation than most other communities.

"It's unique," he said, "when a job has been done well, and yet he is dismissed."

Learned said he was disappointed with the commission for "killing the goose

who laid the golden egg." Had politics not played a part in this, he said, Sanford would still have Grieshaber's

"I feel very disappointed that we have gone in the direction we have," Learned

In a statement released to The Herald, Grieshaber wrote, "I have made no plans other than to help move the city of Sanford."

After the City Commission meeting was over, the meeting was continued instead of adjourned, on the counsel of Colbert. picture in a campaign ad for Bernard D. Mitchell Sr., that appeared in the Sanford Herald on March 27, 2005."

Tooley told The Herald Monday that he did sign the paper brought to him by Woodruff.

"I have not filed any kind of complaint against Mr. Mitchell," Tooley said. "I was asked if I authorized the photo in the ad. I said no, and that was the extent of my involvement."

Later Monday, Tooley said he had no problem with the photo in the ad and that Mitchell had run a good cam-

paign.
"I've stayed very neutral in the campaign, and that has been my policy," he said. Mitchell said the chief called him Monday to say he had no complaint about the picture.

Mitchell also said the other people in the two photos in question have not been contacted by Woodruff. The other people depicted in the two photos are two African-American police officers and two African-American members of the Martin Luther King Committee from 2003.

Mitchell said the complaints appear racially motivated at a time when the city should be coming together after the election.

The other complaints against Mitchell focus on phone calls made by the campaign to voters.

According to the complaint, the calls were made to District 1 voters on Sunday, March 27, two days before the runoff election. The caller identifies herself as Jodie's or Jolie's mother from down the street.

"No such person exists on each street called," Woodruff wrote in the complaint. "The caller stated that I (Art Woodruff) as commissioner had never once set foot in her neighborhood, and that I did not return her phone calls. This statement is false."

He added that the call was made to multiple neighborwork in as commissioner. The Elections

complaint also notes the Florida law stating that a candidate must file a written authorization for a person or organization to make telephone calls supporting the candidate prior to the time the

calls begin.

Mitchell said he did not realize at the time his campaign was required to file paperwork prior to making calls. He acknowledges that the paperwork should have been filed. However, the person in the call exists. The mother does exist, and Mitchell said he can get affidavits to prove it. The person on the phone was not the mother, he explained, but was an actor portraying the real person.

Mitchell said Woodruff called him irate about the telemarketing. Woodruff said he may have called Mitchell twice, and one of them was a courtesy to tell him he would file a complaint.

"The complaints were mailed before the election was over," Woodruff said. A tape of the telemarketing call was to the Elections Commission, he added.

When asked whether the complaints looked like he was afraid he would lose the election, he replied: "I knew it would have no bearing on the actual election. It was a matter of, I think, the election laws should be followed and enforced."

Commission,"

There was no intent to defraud.

Woodruff said.

He said he knew the complaints would not be decided before the election.

"I would not imagine it could be used to change the outcome of the election," Woodruff said. He added that he saw some questionable activities and brought them to the state's attention.

Mitchell is weighing his options. He has 20 days to respond to the Elections Commission about the allega-

"There was no intent to defraud," Mitchell said Monday. He may ask for a vote recount. He has 30 days from the March 29 election to make that request. If it turns out he did nothing wrong, he may ask for Woodruff's resignation.

Mitchell even hinted at filing a harassment charge against Woodruff for the late night trate telephone calls.

According to a letter to Mitchell from Barbara M. Linthicum, executive director of the Florida Elections Commission, the case has been handed over to investigator Margie Wade.

Wade said she could not discuss any aspect of the case. She did say that the charges

are civil and could result in a \$1,000 fine for each count. She will investigate the matter, but has no timeline.

Brett considers herself an illustrator, a career choice she made as a child. She acknowledges that writing can be difficult for her. She comes from a family of teachers, she said, but she doesn't consider herself one.

Instead she describes herself as a communicator with children.

"There is an unspoken message in every family," she said. "In our house the message was to always be thoughtful with children."

Her father always thought of children as the future. As adults we loose the wonder and discovery of childhood, but in her books, Brett said she tries to

recapture that lost energy. "Children think about the world in fresh ways," Brett said.

The way she connects with children, she said, is through the detailed artwork with the stories. If children cannot read yet, or they have challenges such as dyslexia, they can still see story in the illustrations.

"I feel like I have a special place in the world," Brett said. "Children can look at the illustrations and have a sense of story. Children are really amazing in that they understand nuance, irony and even black humor."

They may not have the skills to express these, she added, but they are very smart and under-

stand them on their level. Much of her storytelling stems from the travels of Brett and Hearne. A trip to Costa Rica served as research for her latest book, "The Umbrella." Two teachers suggested an Hispanic theme to one of her most

famous books, "The Mitten." In "The Umbrella," a boy searches for animals in the misty rainforest. He drops his umbrella at the base of tree he desire to give hints and predic-

climbs to get a better view. Animals such as a quetzal, a tapir, and even a jaguar end up taking a short trip down a river

in the upturned umbrella. The trips add realism to her stories, Brett said. For her first book, "St. Patrick's Day in the Morning," she went to Ireland with her then 8-year-old daughter. Everything she had read about Ireland turned out to be true, but the trip lent authentici-

ty to her story, she said. St. Patrick's Day in Ireland, for example, is much more religious and less of the party as has evolved in the United

Knowing her profession at such a young age has helped, but also hurt. For a time, Brett said she figured she didn't need to study. She would simply illustrate.

Still she developed her style at a young age, and her renowned borders included in many of her books began with a

tions about the upcoming pages of the story.

Her first publisher didn't favor the borders, she said. With her second work, "Fritz and the Beautiful Horses," she insisted on them.

praised Wilson Brett Elementary, especially the computer lab in the Media Center where she signed books, and the adjacent television production room. She said she loves meeting the children.

She admired artwork on the wall, noticing details students added to their drawings of tou-

"I want them to be creative," she said of the students. "That is a tool they will use for their whole life." Creativity will help them in problems solving and job decisions later in life.

She also hopes children watch less television. Some great programming exists, but children spend so many hours in front of televisions.

"TV can be a time killer," said.

Brett, who does not own a set. "Spend time to think and talk, not just watching someone else's thoughts all the time. Creativity is part of our humanity."

One aspect frustrates Brett about the school visits and her annual 23-city tour to promote new material — there isn't enough time with the young people.

She doesn't get much personnel time with her readers, just a few seconds to say hello and sign a book.

She and Hearne have made a choice to connect through the Internet. Hearne produces all the material for the Web site. He adds new items at least every two weeks, he said.

Brett's next book will publish in the fall. The title is "Honey, Honey Bear," and it contains borders, Brett said. A bus tour will follow taking the couple Massachusetts to Los Angeles. Pensacola is the closest the tour will come to Central Florida, Hearne said.

The new book will reflect the couple's three visits to Africa. The Web site contains a special video of the Brett in Botswana. Hearne gets excited about the video and tells some children nearby to watch what an elephant does to Brett's safari hat. You'll have to check out the Web site to find out.

Brett releases one book per year. She will return to Central Florida on a private trip to the Kennedy Space Center in a couple of weeks. She will research for a book about Hedgie's visit to outer space.

That book will not include borders, she said. Maybe her readers will forgive her that one time, and 30 million Web site visitors can always explore something new with Brett.





# Lyman Invite a useful tool for upcoming district track meets

LONGWOOD - With the Seminole Athletic Conference and district meets looming over the next 10 days, most of the Seminole County high school track and field teams used last Friday's Lyman Invitational to see who is ready to compete and in what event.

Oviedo High School's Jennifer Barringer, for example, is still making the transition from running in the cross country world championships to competing in high school track meets.

"This is only her third track meet since getting back from the world championships," said Oviedo coach Jay Getty. "We've been trying to do something different in every meet. Tonight was a free speed workout against good competition."

That meant that instead of running her traditional double of the 1,600 and 3,200meter runs (the metric mile and two mile), Barringer ran in the 800 and 1,600. While the event line-up was slightly different, the results weren't as Barringer swept the events, winning in 2:15.71 and 4:56.54, respectively.

Barringer also ran a leg on Oviedo's 4 x 400 relay that finished fifth (4:21.9).

"She's being running long cross country workouts to get ready for the 6-kilometer distance that they run at the world championships while everyone else has been doing repeat work to prepare for the shorter distances that they run in the track season," explained Getty. "It's a big change."

While there was some trial-and-error experimenting and training going on, the competition for the team titles was as keen as it will be when the schools get into the championship season.

The Seminole boys, who scored only three points in the field events, scored 37 points in the 100, 200, and 400 dashes and won both relay events on the way to forging a tie with Pine Ridge for the team championship (each with 61 points). Trailing by 10 team points heading into

the final event \_ the 4 x 400 relay \_ the Tribe had to win the event and hope that Pine Ridge finished out of the scoring to create the tie. That's exactly what happened as Seminole cranked out a winning time of 3:26.47 (more than four seconds faster than second-place Jones) while Pine Ridge's time was 11th fastest.

The Lyman boys tied for third with New Smyrna Beach at 61 points. Lake Brantley finished in a tie with Leesburg for 10th (33 points) while Winter Springs came in 13th (21) and Oviedo placed 17th (2).

There wasn't as much drama in the girls, competition as the host Lyman Lady Greyhounds came out on top (71.5 points) ahead of Leesburg and Pine Ridge (tied for second at 62). Oviedo was fifth (44.5), Seminole tied Jones for seventh (41), Winter Springs came in 12th (26), Lake Brantley finished 13th (20) and Lake Mary was 20th (5.5).

Along with the first-place relays, scoring points for the Seminole boys were Robert Peterson (first in the 100 dash, 11:05, and second in the 200 dash, 22.94), ), Travis Knight (second, 100 dash, 11.15), Eric Johnson (third, 200 dash, 23.23), Irvin Collier (fourth, 400 dash, 50.79), Kevin Harris (sixth, shot put, 44-5), Demetrius Sessions (fourth, 300 intermediate hurdles, 42.15, and eighth, 110 high hurdles, 16.61).

Leading the Lyman Greyhounds were Von Dixon (first, long jump, 22-4s, and third, 110 high hurdles, 15.02), Dan Hamilton (first, pole vault, 12-0), Shaun Roberts (first ,400 dash, 49.96), Chris Bridgeman (second, pole vault, 12-0), Antoine Hall (fourth, triple jump, 41-4), Jordan Eiserman (fourth, 3200 run, 10:10:32), C.J. 
