## Fast track set for misdemeanor warrants

SANFORD — People with outstanding misdemeanor warrants will receive letters from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office this week, asking them to get their warrants off their backs, by taking advantage of fast-track Saturday.

The event will take place Saturday, Aug. 27, at the Seminole County Criminal Justice Center (the new courthouse), at 101 Bush Blvd., in Sanford. The hours will be 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The event will allow people with misdemeanor warrants to get processed quickly through booking, get a court date, and get on with their lives. Those with warrants can even arrange in advance to have a bail bonding agency have their bonds pre-posted to speed up the process even more, according to Steve Olson, Sheriff's Office spokesman.

This is a much speedier alternative to getting picked up for a warrant, spending hours in the jail, and trying to arrange to have bond posted, he explained.

The goal of fast-track Saturday is to have people processed, from beginning to end, in a maximum of three hours. Unanticipated issues, such as additional outstanding warrants could make the process last a little longer.

Another goal is to clear more than 2,800 outstanding warrants on the Seminole County Sheriff's Office books.

## New hires help city meet level of service

SANFORD — City commissioners approved 21 new positions to city staff at Monday night's meeting and came to a consensus to provide benefits to three contract employees who are grant-funded by the state.

The 21 positions were recommended at the commission's last meeting by interim City Manager Eugene Miller, but after questions were raised from commissioners, and due to the fact that one commissioner was not present, it was tabled.

Miller reiterated to the commission that these positions were needed and that all of the department heads were not happy with the short list.

"They want more," he said.

According to the department heads and Miller, the city needs these positions to provide the level of service the commissioners discussed providing during their special goals retreat a few months ago.

District 2 Commissioner Velma Williams voiced her concern at last week's work session that what used to be the community development department has three full-time,

SANFORD — A flurry of conflict over two pedestrian bridges in Lake Mary calmed down when the Board of County Commissioners approved plans preferred by the city's leaders Tuesday morning.

"We're extremely happy," said Lake Mary Mayor Thomas Greene after the 4 to 1 vote by the county commission. The city agreed to take over maintenance of the two bridges once they are constructed.

What the county approved was the first of

## Candidate tries to unite Seminole democrats

CASSELBERRY — Florida Sen. Rod Smith, one of the three democratic candidates for governor, spoke at the Democrats Unite meeting Thursday, Aug. 4 at the Casselberry Public Library to rally support for his nomination.

"He spoke very eloquently and we heard where he's coming from but we can't favor anyone until the primaries," said Ernesto Maldonado, president of Democratic Hispanic Caucus.

"We don't expect to win Seminole County," Smith told democrats. A member of the audience, however, asked Smith how he plans to try to win the county. He said elderly voters are the answer. He also said people respond to telling them what the

other side is doing wrong and how he is going to solve it.

To win the governor's seat Smith said he plans to do better in North Florida where he's done well as prosecutor. He also will focus on the I-4 corridor, Southeast Florida, and the Panhandle.

"We are going to slay these giants," Smith said at the end of his 40-minute talk. "But we need your money, heart and vote, in that order."

Democrats Unite member Silvia Abolofia was impressed by the candidate.

"He is not wishy-washy," Abolofia said. "He seems to have a direction. He came up through the ranks and wasn't born with a silver spoon in his mouth. After listening to him, I am leaning towards him. I think he's a fighter and I think he will fight for the office he's seeking."

Another high-ranking democrat, Karen Thurman, addressed the group and pushed the slogan that it is "time to turn it blue," referring to the media's use of red for republican states and

blue for democrats.

The state Democratic Party chairwoman also emphasized that the Latino vote is becoming more important and something that can't be ignored in Florida.


"We need to reach out to that part of the community and we have Spanish translations on our Web site for you to access to accomplish that," Thurman said.

Carol Cox, chair of the Democratic Executive Committee of Seminole County, agreed that the party should reach out to the number of Hispanics who are moving into Seminole County and who tend to vote democratic.

"We are trying to be active in the Hispanic community by conducting voter registrations in areas known to be Hispanic dominated," Maldonado said.

Thurman acknowledged that democrats in Seminole County were getting attention for themselves by engaging in charitable efforts, such

## Poster contest needs artists for holidays

**SANFORD** — If residents in Sanford's historic district wake to see someone standing on the sidewalk, staring at a house, and setting up an easel in front on the sidewalk, there is no need to be alarmed — Central Florida artists have been invited to compete in the Sanford Historic Trust's Tour of Homes Poster Contest.

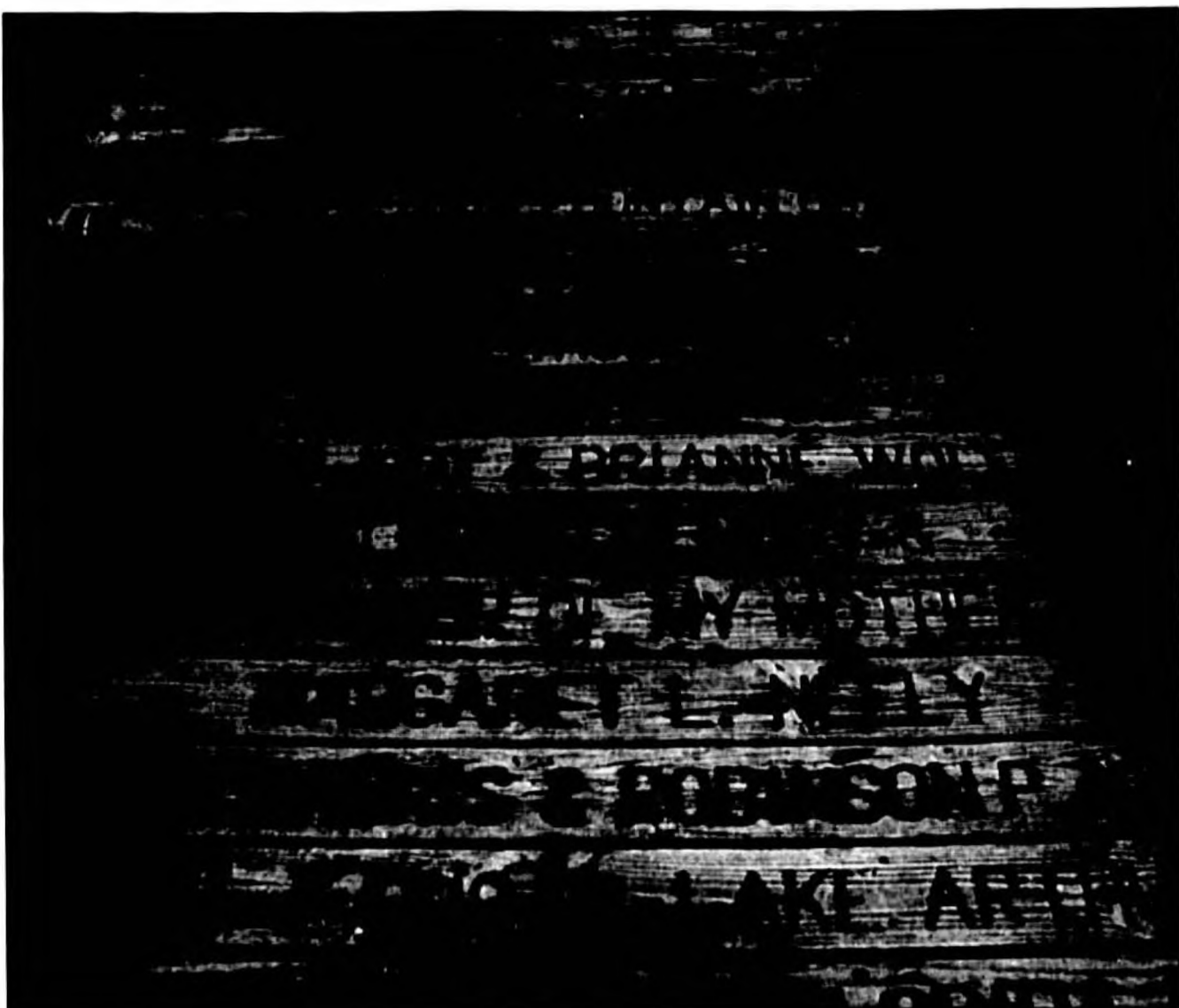

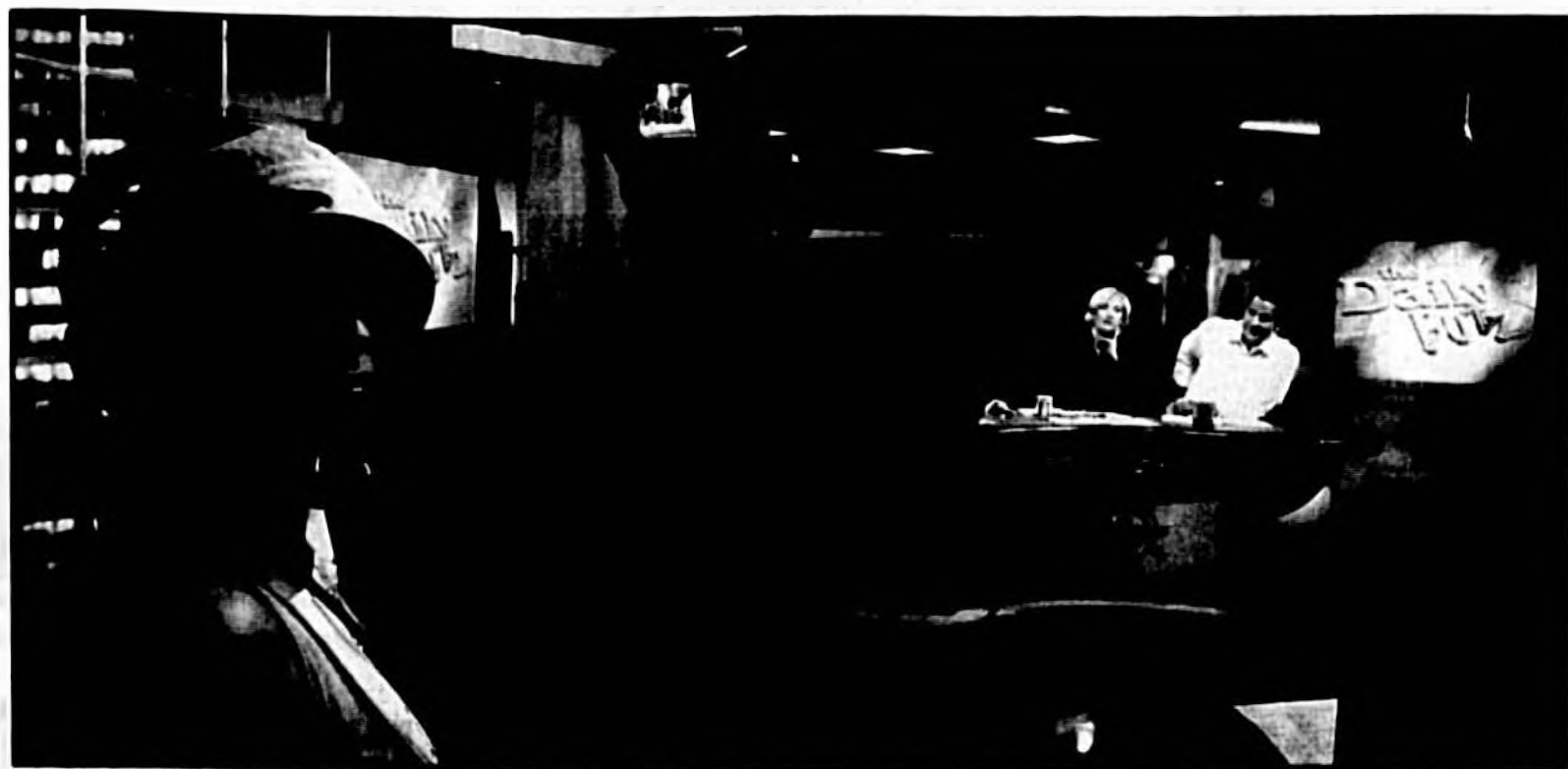

coup, and political email debates with viewers.

The trouble with the C-Note's performance? Weatherman Mitch English, who also does stand-up comedy and enjoys ad-libbing on the set, said that he likes the unknown.

"The spontaneity is the fun part of it," English said.

Anchors Andrea Jackson and John Brown reported on Robert Novak's blow up on CNN's Inside Politics last week where he cursed and then got up from the live set and walked out. Novak, was a commentator for

CNN, and better known recently for being involved in leaking the name of undercover CIA officer Valerie Plame.

Jackson said that if Novak was on the Daily Buzz set he would have been chased by the anchors and cameramen through the studio.

Jackson is the show's typical demographic, the anchors said after the show. Jackson, a sexy, funny, short-haired blonde, admits being in her thirties and single is mostly due to her 6 p.m. bedtime. Although, the larger the show grows, the more they're realizing that their viewers range in age from young viewers and single women in their thirties to 55-year-old fathers watching the news with their children.

The anchors said they try to give viewers the news so they don't know they're getting the news. The group claims to mesh well on and off the set, even with differing opinions. That may also be part of their success, because although they deliver journalistic news stories, they are not afraid to discuss their own opinions about events unfolding.

Morris said that in the morning the whole staff runs stories by each other acting as their own filter.

"If we're fired up about a story, we know our viewers will feel the same," Morris said.

Kia Malone, a newbie to the Daily Buzz who makes seven-months pregnant beautiful, is expecting her second child. She said she loves her job but is

exhausted by the end of the week. She wakes up early in the morning and is at the set by 3:30 a.m. for the show's first staff meeting. Then she spends the rest of the time writing news stories and checking the AP wire and Web sites for stories before getting in hair and make-up.

"My husband has to play Mr. Mom," she said. "But, it's worth it."

The group strives on delivering the news with no factual errors, they said. But, sometimes if a topic comes up that they are not familiar with they'll ask questions. Shortly after, their viewers will pour in through e-mail to fill in their busy anchors.

"You wake up with a group of friends," Co-host Jackson said. "We have bad days and good days and we'll talk about them on air. People feel like they're a part of something."

What did the anchors say played into the most successful part of the show? Each other. Even when they are disagreeing on a topic, the group said, "it never turns mean."

"We're like a dinner party in the morning," Brown said.

contractual employees who do not have benefits.

Williams was advised that there were 52 positions city-wide that were contractual positions that did not provide benefits. She had said at the meeting she was not talking about those positions, and she continued her point at Monday's meeting.

"I support, one-hundred percent, the 52 positions," she said.

But, she continued, most of those other positions are in the recreation department and are part time positions during the summer. The three positions she was speaking of are grant-funded and that grant provides money for benefits.

"It's like comparing apples and oranges," Williams said.

Williams told the commissioners she has been somewhat reserved with her comments, but now she is suspicious.

"How long do we have to wait?" she said speaking for the three full time contract individuals.

"It's the right thing to do. If I don't speak up, then who will? I make no apologies for that," Williams said. "The grants and funds are there."

She also said that considering the loss of the community development director, it looked as though the commission had no value of those three employees when the director was never replaced.

"That says a lot to these employees," she said.

According to Williams, employees could start to wonder when they will dismantle their positions completely. She said that they could not speak for themselves.

"I am not angry. I just tend to be animated when I talk out of concern. I'm profoundly disappointed. But, maybe this is good," she said.

District 1 Commissioner Art Woodruff spoke up first after Williams finished her point.

"I'm not sure I fully understood what you were talking about before," he said. "But, I do now."

Woodruff asked Miller if the state grant allowed the city to pay benefits. Miller said that they were able to pay benefits

for these positions.

"Then, why aren't we?" Mayor Linda Kuhn asked.

This predates Miller and Mayor Kuhn and Miller said that an absence of a human resources director until recently, could be to blame.

"Commissioner Williams is absolutely correct, as she always is as far as I know," Miller said.

Miller said that the city could deal with these positions on an individual basis before dealing with all 52 contractual employees. The commission made a consensus to pay benefits to those three employees, and city staff will come back at the next commission meeting with a resolution.

As for the 21 new positions, commissioners had Miller and city staff answer questions about a few of the positions, before making their final decision.

"I just don't like the idea of vacant positions that have always been vacant positions floating around," Woodruff said.

Woodruff's main concern with the additional positions was that they were not just filling gaps in some areas and adding new positions in others.

"Do we feel that these positions will take care of the essential needs to get the job done or are there still departments to look at?" Woodruff asked.

District 3 Commissioner Randy Jones commented that when the city cut its workforce two years ago Position A took over Position B's responsibilities, for example. Now, both A and B's responsibilities have grown and there is still only one person doing those jobs.

Miller said that if there are positions needed for performance after this, the new city manager will make adjustments as soon as possible.

"This is getting us a little closer to reality?" Woodruff asked.

Miller answered yes, and Commissioner Jones moved to approve the addition of the 21 positions.

District 4 Commissioner Kevin Hipes seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously.

# St. Johns River district moves forward with watering rules

PALATKA — The St. Johns River Water Management District's Governing Board voted Tuesday to move forward in its effort to amend district rules on lawn and landscape irrigation.

The current districtwide rule prohibits irrigation of lawns and landscapes between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., with a few exceptions. The proposed rule amendment would add a new districtwide requirement limiting lawn and landscape irrigation to no more than two days per week. There are some exceptions.

A districtwide water shortage warning has been in effect since 2000, which includes voluntary limitations on landscape irrigation to no more than two days a

week. Also, six counties in the east-Central Florida area have been under a water shortage order since 2001, requiring limitations on landscape irrigations to no more than two days a week.

Following the Board's approval today of a "notice of proposed rule," the district will publish the proposed rule and will schedule a final rule adoption hearing, likely in October or November. The rule amendment is proposed to become effective in December.

The proposed two-day-a-week rule amendment will apply regardless if the water comes from a private well, a private or public utility, or a surface water body.

"Meeting our long-term water supply needs will

require a combination of developing costly alternative water supplies and implementing additional water conservation measures," says Board Chairman Ometrias D. Long. "The public will be more willing to accept the financial burden of developing alternative water supplies after it has been demonstrated that all possible water conservation measures have been implemented."

Also included in the rule amendment is a provision for enforcement of irrigation requirements by local governments through the adoption of local ordinances. If a local government adopts such an ordinance, specific days may be established for watering. If a local government chooses not to adopt an

ordinance, the user can choose which two days of the week to water.

The district is a regulatory agency of the state responsible for protecting wetlands, waterways and drinking water supplies in all or part of Seminole, Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Brevard, Clay, Duval, Flagler, Indian River, Lake, Marion, Nassau, Okeechobee, Orange, Osceola, Putnam, St. Johns, and Volusia counties.

Governing Board members serve without pay and set the district's policies and priorities.

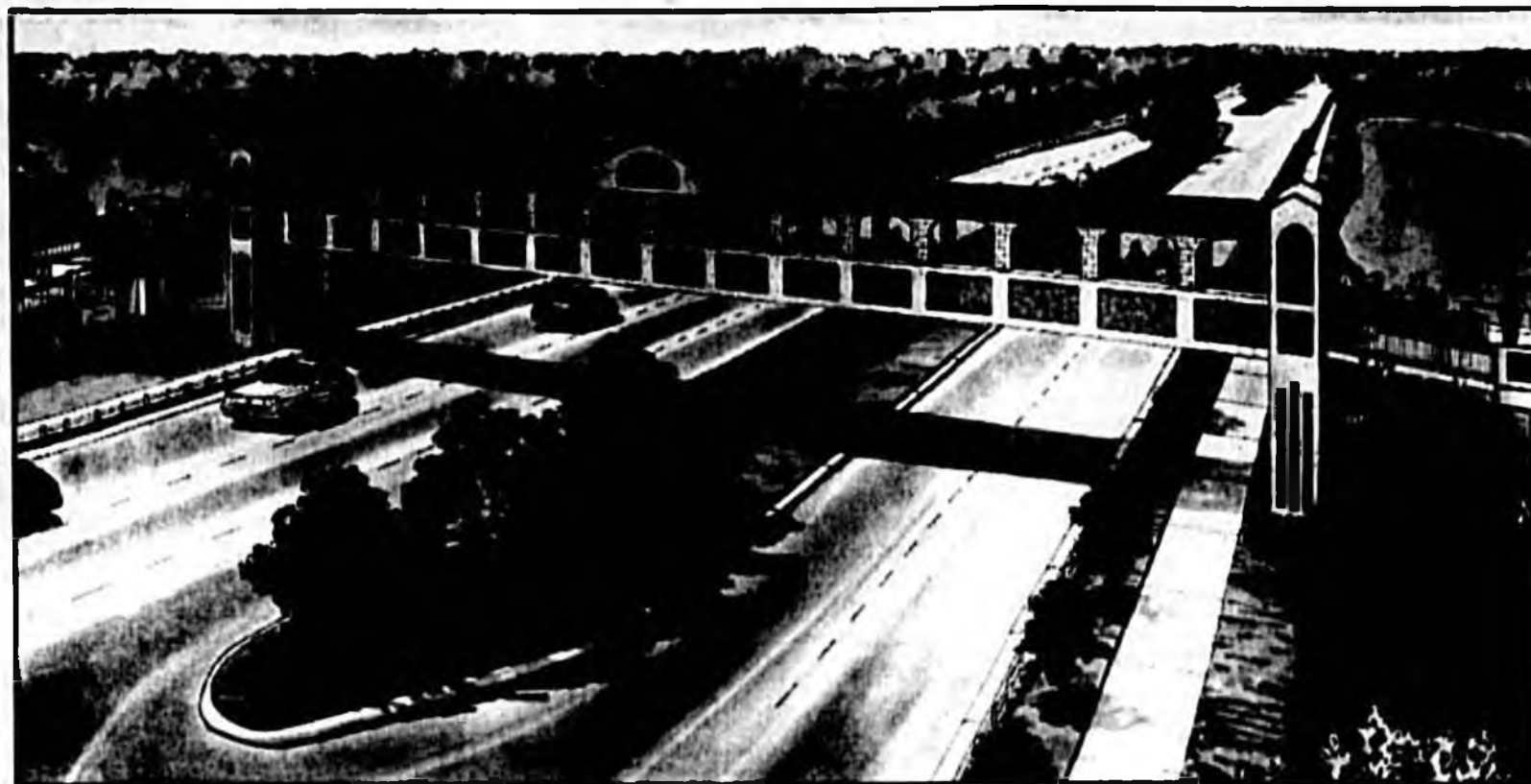

two alternatives. Two pedestrian bridges will be constructed using one-cent sales tax. They will cost \$7.32 million or about \$3.66 million each. That is under the \$4 million each that the budget allowed. Building the two bridges concurrently will save about \$415,000 on the project.

The second alternative would have been to reduce the size of the bridges' roofs to just the peak in the center. The county estimated that would save \$1.08 million.

City officials balked at the extra cost savings because without the roof, the bridge would have mainly chain link-type fencing. The locations of the bridges are across Lake Mary Boulevard at the west side of Country Club Road intersection and at the east side of the Rinehart Road intersection.

Several county commissioners felt they were given an ultimatum by the city of Lake Mary following a letter from Lake Mary City Manager John Litton and newspaper reports. The city preferred higher priced bridges with aesthetic qualities, but ones that still met safety concerns and came under budget.

"I want it made plain that I don't take well to ultimatums," said county Chairman Carlton Henley. "You almost forced me to vote against

what you wanted here." Greene, Litton and Lake Mary Commissioner Michael McLean all attended the Tuesday morning meeting.

Commissioner Brenda Carey voted against the measure because of the bridge's higher cost and the tone of Litton's letter.

She said the letter made it sound as if the county didn't choose the higher priced bridge, then it shouldn't do anything. To do nothing would not be responsible, Carey said, especially since the Country Club Road location will allow Lake Mary Elementary School children to cross busy Lake Mary Boulevard.

She said she was simply looking at being fiscally responsible. Carey said the \$4 million budgeted for the bridges was just an estimate and didn't mean that they had to spend as much of that as possible.

If this becomes the standard for other planned overpasses, the county will be over budget if rights of way have to be paid for, she said. She also made the point that the more the county saves, the more it can do with the trail system.

Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide said the controversy caused him heartburn and was not necessary. He objected to Lake Mary's description

of the lower priced overpass as a "chicken coup."

He had not supported the higher priced plans, but changed his mind Tuesday. He and Carey had wanted the city of Lake Mary to contribute the difference between the costs of the bridges.

On a previous project, the city of Winter Springs had contributed to an overpass that ran about \$800,000 over budget. Winter Springs paid a third of that along with the Florida Department of Transportation and the county.

Greene said the comparison between Winter Springs and Lake Mary was apples and oranges.

Lake Mary chose a plan that was under budget, he said. In Winter Springs, changes requested by that city helped cause the cost overrun. The Winter Springs overpass was also built with federal grants supplemented by trail funds. The Lake Mary bridges will be built using the one-cent sales tax that Lake Mary citizens pay into.

Since the Lake Mary project involved sales tax money and was still under budget, Van Der Weide decided to support the higher priced option.

Commissioner Randy Morris, who represents the Lake Mary area of the county, said these projects don't have to be micromanaged.

"We have consistently tried to build quality," Morris said. He had no problem with the aesthetic quality of the bridges because the highest standards and safety were also being met.

Chairman Henley, however, said he felt like Lake Mary had shifted its position by putting aesthetics ahead of safety. He said a \$3 million bridge should never be described as a "chicken coup", and he vowed to never put aesthetics ahead of safety.

Mayor Greene said city leaders were simply surprised by changes in the county's position. County staff appeared before the Lake Mary Commission two times to ask commissioners' preferences. Both times the commission supported the bridges with a full roof.

"We were surprised by the process," Greene said after the vote on Tuesday. "Sometimes you respond to a surprise with more vigor than you might normally use."

He pointed out that in addition to taking over the maintenance of the overpasses, the city donated land for the project at the Rinehart Road location.

The city's made it known which bridge plan it prefers and it was below budget.

"We were surprised that there was even a problem," Greene said.
