# Sky High At SMH

Insurance premiums for professional insurance at Seminole Memorial Hospital have jumped from \$32 per bed to

some \$151 per bed according to hospital administrator Robert Besserer revealed the rate increase at a meeting of the Seminole Memorial Hospital board of trustees yesterday.

The hospital administrator told the assembly that this would mean the annual rate of insurance would jump from last year's total cost of some \$6,500 to almost \$22,750. In explaining the increase, Besserer told the SMH board that the hospital has paid \$64,000 for insurance in the past

and during the same period of time they have received \$69,369 dollars in claims. Putting it bluntly the hospital adninistrator stated, "They really don't want our business," at the next trustee meeting

Besserer told the board members that two of the hospital's 14-year-old elevators are causing trouble continuously and that a serviceman is required to work on them, sometimes three to four times per week. Besserer said that he had received a bid from the Mont-

gomery Elevator Company to revamp the two elevators for some \$35,000 using the same two cabs presently in operation. keep the affected rooms plastered. He said he had received a bid for some \$6,000 to completely repair the area and make
