





Kidnap Hearing Scheduled

It was the first time his face was allowed to be photographed since he was brought from Winter Park. Fla. to face charges in the Sept. 23 kidnaping of Allison Mechem, 4-year-old daughter of broadcasting executive Charles S. Mechem.

Kroger was scheduled for a preliminary hearing today in Hamilton County Municipal Court to determine if there is enough evidence to bind him over to the grand jury. Police said that making sure they had credible evidence was the reason no photographs of Kroger's face were

permitted until Friday. The first suspect in the case, Frank Wiechman, arrested only hours after the young girl was found alive and crying in a motel room the day after she was taken, was identified by four persons.

South Boston schools ahead of schedule Friday, for fear of confrontation with the antibusing marchers. About 500 chanting demonstrators went to the home of U.S. District Court Judge W. Arthur Garrity Jr. on Friday night. The group paraded peacefully outside his Wellesley

Earlier, autos circled the block near the judge's home, honking horns and flashing lights.

Henry Kissinger No Longer 'Super K'

When he was confirmed as secretary of state by the Senate a year ago Henry Kissinger was without a doubt the most acclaimed statesman of the world.

Some were comparing him to Gen. George C. Marshall, Dean Acheson or John Foster Dulles. Columnists were extravagant in their praise of the "most important No. 2 man in history." Wherever he went, it seemed, people expected miracles.

Today the bloom is off the rose — a year at the

helm of foreign policy has put Mr. Kissinger in better perspective. In reality, signs of some decline in his popularity were visible abroad a year ago. At home the nation was distracted by Watergate and pleased to accept the secretary of state as our singular national achievement.

Europe first became disenchanted with his proclamation of a "year of Europe" without previous consultation among allies, as well as with his unexpected call for revision of the Atlantic Charter. Led by French Foreign Minister Michel Jobert, old world diplomats contended that Mr. Kissinger was mesmerized by concepts of power politics, obsessed by secrecy and given to day-toimprovisations rather than to long-term

The people of the United States of America for the most part did net agree - themselves impressed by the Nobel Peach Prize received by the secretary of state in December, 1973. This attitude was fortified by the secretary's spectacularly successful shuttle diplomacy that separated combatants in the Middle East, and even by his

But even these factors were not enough to cause the intensity of the foreign criticism to subside. Indeed, the attitude of our friends caused many Americans to ponder whether the secretary of state did indeed misdirect U.S. policy in the troduction of efficient unit trains. Cyprus crisis or whether he acted correctly in the ICC attitudes have discouraged the wider Pakistan civil war. 

Bell Sues Eagles

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The Philadelphia Bell of the World Football League has filed a federal anti-trust suit against the Philadelphia Eagles of the National Football League over use of the city's Veterans Stadium. In a four-count complaint filed Friday, the Bell charged

that Eagles' owner Leonard H. Tose conspired with Mayor Frank L. Rizzo and other city officials to give the Eagles a monopoly in Philadelphia. The Bell, which is playing its first season at aging John

F. Kennedy Stadium, states in the complaint that it "must have access to a stadium... which is suitable for playing major league professional football games."

The Eagles currently use Veterans Stadium under a 1971 lease that expires in 1981 and carries an option to renew for two 10-year periods. The lease provides that no other professional football team may use the stadium.







The best "tall tale" of the week came from one of the regulars who make the Sports Shop headquarters when not fishing, hunting, or sometimes even working. My folks are considering the purchase of some land. The seller and the real estate broker are asking for a \$4,000 earnest money deposit. The contract will call for closing within 120 days. The real estate broker says the earnest money deposit check should be made payable to him. What's to keep the real estate broker handling this transaction from using Dad's check for other purposes during the 120 days?-FFJ

The Florida Real Real Estate Code says the \$4,000 earnest money deposit must be placed in the licensed real estate broker's trust escrow account—an account each and every licensed broker must maintain. At closing the broker will write a trust escrow account check made payable to the closing agent who will handle the receipt and disbursement of funds. From time to time investigators of the Florida Real Estate Commission may check a broker's trust escrow account. If any of the earnest money deposit funds which are supposed to be in that account are not in that account the broker is in deep trouble. Earnest money deposits must not to be co-mingled with any of a broker's other

Bedroom County?

Several times since we have been residing in Seminole County we have read in the newspapers about this being known as a bedroom county. What do they really mean by referring to Seminole as a bedroom county?-MRS. HGJ

It wasn't too many years ago that two-thirds of the population of Seminole County resided inside the city limits of Sanford. At that time Sanford was a thriving railroad center and an agriculture community. The remaining one-third of the expulation was well scattered throughout the rest of the countries.

In recent years, however, when people began pouring into central Florida, Orlando's population spilled into Winter Park and Maitland and then began pouring into south Seminole. A large majority of the wage earners who reside in south Seminole today hold jobs in Orlando and Orange county-many of them working in Orlando and Orange County industries. The firms and factories they work for pay taxes in Orlando and Orange County, However, since they live in south Seminole and other parts of this county Seminole became known as a bedroom county. Seminole has to provide the schools, for example, and other governmental ser-

The situation is easing somewhat since the tremendous commercial developments have come to pass on SR 436 and other areas in both north and south Seminole Residential taxes cannot carry the entire load of the cost of government. It takes commercial and industrial taxation to help.

Although we're not in a position to build right now, my husband and I have been given an opportunity to purchase several acres in a nice country section of the county owned by an elderly gen-tlemen. He wants \$3,000 down but we only have \$1,000. He has agreed to sell us the land if we'll pay \$1,000 and make monthly payments. But he will not give us a deed until we have paid him a total of \$3,000 on the principal. Do you think this is a proper way to purchase property? — MRS. VHS

Dear Mrs. VHS:

The elderly gent is proposing that your purchase the property under what is known as a contract for deed. In other parts of the country it's known as a land contract. In other words, he simply wants you to have at least \$3,000 invested in the property before he conveys the property to you by a warranty deed. There's not a thing in the world wrong with such a transaction. Just be sure you

Deed Stops Dream House

Sometime ago we purchased a couple of acres in a suburban subdivision with the intention of building. We recently went to our architect for the purpose of having him prepare plans for the house we wish to construct on the property. Several days later he advised that the particular style of home we want to build is not permitted in that subdivision because of a deed restriction. Can this type of restriction be enforced?-MRS. EMB Dear Mrs. EMB:

I'm sorry, but that type of restricting can be enforced. Apparently your deed to the property, given you when you purchased it, provides for a certain type of construction to blend with other construction in the area. You must abide by it. By the way, deed restrictions can cover a multitude of items, even including the minimum cost of a home. However, costs are usually not included because, as we have seen recently, \$60,000 homes built five years ago now could be valued at \$90,000 and a \$60,000 home in a particular section today may not blend into a subdivision with \$90,000 homes. Consequently, deed restrictions usually deal with square footage minimums rather than dollars.

Questions That Consumers Ask By JULIAN STENSTROM

I purchased my present home several years ago with a GI loan. Due to a change of employment I'd like to move and be much closer to my present job. We have a buyer who wishes to purchase my present home by paying cash down to and assuming my original mortgage. My question is: Must I obtain a release from the Veterans Administration before negotiating for the house I'd like to buy?

Veterans are always cautioned to obtain a "release from liability" from the Veterans Administration if the purchaser of the veteran's home is going to assume the loan or mortgage. Otherwise, the veteran selling his home can be held financially responsible should the purchaser default on the mortgage payments. Contact your local Veterans office to either obtain the necessary forms or find out where to write for them. But, let me warn you that the "release from liability" procedure is not exactly automatic. Your buyers must be able to qualify just as you did when you obtained your mortgage loan. We can only advise you to play it safe.

Do you agree that each of the muncipalities in Seminole County should have a land use plan and that the county itself should have one also for the unincorporated areas?



I have been told that you could give me some advice as to how one would go about doing this. I am writing to you because Here's the Answer | Lower Mortgages your answer might lead me and some others to do the same thing. Dear Mrs. MRD:

First, I suggest you contact your pastor and find out what agency of your denomination is legally established to handle the management of endowment, trust or memorial funds. For example, the Florida Baptist Foundation is such an agency for Southern Baptist Convention churches in this state. Secondly, I would contact a representative of such a denominational agency and have him explain to you how you can legally leave your home to the agency. After your death title to your home would pass to this agency which in turn would probably sell the property for the purpose of converting it into cash which would be invested. The ncome from such an investment each year would be paid to your church or to some other religious cause supported by your denomination such as a college, children's home, missionary endeavor, etc. The gift to that cause would be made each year in your name as a memorial to you and your husband. One word of caution, however, it is not advisable to leave the principal nor the derived income directly to the church itself. This happened in Chicago some years ago when a church was left some \$3 million. The church no longer exists because the people, with all that money, ceased to support the church with their regular gifts. May we also suggest you seek the advice of your attorney. Don't go to him, however, for advice as to what you should do. Go to him to see that what you desire to do is done legally and properly.

U.S., Soviets Talk Ban On Underground Tests

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger said today that negotiations are starting up in Moscow to try to broaden an underground weapons test agreement to include peaceful nuclear tests.

The talks grow out of former President Richard M. Nixon's summit meeting last summer with Soviet leader Leonid I. Brezhnev and involve a "goodfaith effort to develop criteria" for banning weapons tests above 150 kilotons, Kissinger told a news conference.

Kissinger's remarks came one day after Brezhnev declared during a speech further ahead" in disarmament talks. On another issue, he said the Soviets

have never assured him that 60,000 Jews would be allowed to emigrate annually as part of a compromise to gain congressional approval of trade and credit benefits. However, he said he shares the "same

goal" of senators leading the drive to ease Soviet restraints on emigration. Turning to the Ford administration's decision to hold up a \$500 million shipment of corn and wheat to the Soviet

Union, the secretary said "a strong

possibility exists we may have misled" the Soviets on how quickly shipments would be processed.

Kissinger said fulfillment of the Soviet order now would have a "disproportionate impact" on the American economy, the fight against inflation and U.S. ability to meet other world commitments. He added that Treasury Secretary William E. Simon would discuss the subject in Moscow later this

Ford May Ask For Altamonte Flood Insurance Set More Income Tax

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford is reported ready to recommend an income tax surcharge on corporations and upper income individuals as part of his antiinflation program.

The President spent much of Sunday working on the package of proposals he will outline to Congress and the nation in a nationally televised and broadcast address from Capitol Hill at 4 p.m. EDT Tuesday.

White House spokesmen said Ford has settled on more than a dozen specific proposals, centering on problems with food and energy prices, the depressed ousing industry and record high interest rates.


