

# **Bureau Of Census Shows** Advances Of U. S. Incomes

NEW YORK CITY, Feb. 28-(Special)-Bureau of the Census figures on the general uptrend in incomes since prewar show far-reaching changes in the earnings of families and individuals prima of families and individuals prima ily dependent on wages and sal aries for their livelihood, the Institute of Life Insurance re-ported today. Highlights of this survey, the Institute said, are: Only 30 per cent of these house-holds now have incomes under

\$2,000 a year as against more than 75 per cent in 1939. Nearly half of these household.

are in the \$3,000 and over incom bracket now as against less th£ 10 per cent in 1939. About 43 million households

now have an income of \$5,000 a year or more mostly from wages and sataries as against only 600, 000 in 1939.

The Census figures were ob tained in a survey made in April last year and cover 1947 incomes of households whose earnings are essentially wages and salaries, some of which may be in kind a board and room. These household are distinct from those with only the self-employed, professional people on their own, etc. The latter group in 1947 contained more than 2 million additional families in the \$5,000 and over

income bracket. "In 1939 more than 10 million households or over 41 per cent of the total, had earnings of less than \$1,090 a year," the Institute said. "This number had been duced to 4 million in 1947, or only 1214 per cent. At the same time, the number of households with wage or salary incomes of \$1,000 to \$2,000 a year declined from 8.6 million in 1939, or 34 per cent of the total, to 5.6 million or

cent of the total, to 5.6 million or less than 18 per cent in 1947. "As to the middle income groups, the number carning be-tween \$2,000 and 3,000 a year practically doubled, rising from about 3% million in 1939 to near? ly 714 million in 1947 with them percentages of the total beauty percentages of the total house holds increasing from 15 per cent to 23 per cent, respectively, And in 1947 over 10 million householdor 32 per cent of the total, had earnings of \$3,000 to \$5,000 a year as compared with less than 2

million or 7 per cent in 1947. "Major factors responsible for these hig changes in carning were the great rise in wage a salary rates, much steadier employment and the increase in the number of family members work ing. For example, about 37 per ent of nonfarm households had more than one wage or salary earner in 1947 as compared with 28 per cent in 1939. The median






