The entire top blew off the tank, one of seven 12-foot-tall storage vessels used by United Solvents of America, shortly after 9:30 a.m. Company officers say the rupture, apparently caused by a stuck pressure-relief valve, spilled none of the highly volatile solvent. While the company worked to pump the thinner from one tank to another, three city fire trucks and a rescue truck stood by in case of " a fire, while police blocked traffic along Airport from State Road 46 to a point south of the plant. # Bani-Sadr Withdraws

# **Prime Minister Nomination**

By United Press International Iran's President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr has with drawn his nomination for prime minister in a move that could further delay parliament's long awaited debate on the fate of the 52 American hostages. Tehran Radio, in a brief boradcast monitored Monday in Washington, said Bani-Sadr asked parliament to let the matter of his nomination "lie

Bani-Sadr had just nominated the national police. chief, Mustafa Mir-Salir, Saturday. A selection of the prime minister and his Cabinet would have cleared the way for the parliament to take up the question of the hostages, held for 269 days.

The radio broadcast gave no reasons behind Bani Sadr's move, but U.S. officials said it appeared to be motivated by warnings that Mir-Salir would not be approved by the clerical-controlled parliament.

## Shah Laid To Rest In Egypt

CAIRO, Egypt (UPI) - To the boom of a 21-gun salute, the deposed shah of Iran was laid to rest today in a perfumed chamber that once held the body of his father, who also died in exile.

Mohammed Reza Pahlavi, the son of an illiterate colonel who rose to become a self-proclaimed king of kings, began his final journey in a coffin, draped in the green, white and red Iranian Imperial flag. It was carried from the two-story Abdin presidential

palace by six sailors, who loaded the coffin on a gun Of the scores of international leaders who once paid homage to the shah, the only mourners to show up were a disgraced former U.S. president and another deposed monarch - Richard Nixon and Greece's former King

### Venezuela Irritates Israel

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Venezuela's decision t transfer its embassy from Jerusalem to Tel Aviv was made because of Arab oil blackmail, acting Israeli

Prime Minister Yigael Yadin charges. Yadin, who has been filling in for Prime Minister Menachem Begin who is recuperating from a mild heart attack, said Monday Venezuela's hand was forced by Arab oil pressure rather than the South American nation's opposition to Israel's desire to

strengthen its hold on the disputed city. ### Terrorists Die In Balloon

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) - A band of Palestinian guerrillas in a hot-air balloon tried to cross the ebanese border into Israel but apparently were killed when the balloon went down near the Lebanese town of Tibnin, an Israeli newspaper reported today.

An Israeli military spokesman had no comment on the front-page report in the newspaper Yedioth The newspaper said three or four guerrillas made the attempted crossing — the first known balloon attack — several days ago.

#### **British Experiment Stinks**

LONDON (UPI) - The British Post Office admits failure in its great experiment with a canine repellent spray to protect mailmen — the substance drave only

Dubbed "Operation Pongo," the experiment abandoned Monday was tried for a year. Some 500 postal workers were bitten by dogs despite using the repellent they sprayed on their trousers. In addition, there were eight reported attacks by cats and one by a squirrel.



### 4 Dangerous Inmates Escape Georgia Prison

REIDSVILLE, Ga. (UPI) - Four dangerous priseners, clad in homemade guard uniforms, sawed through three sets of bars on death row, scrambled down a fire escape, walked through a main building and strolled to freedom through the front door of the Georgia State Prison.

Monday. A guard briefly questioned one of the prisoners, but let him go when the costumed inmate said he was making a security check.

Authorities, informed of the breakout by a reporter, said the four convicted murderers were considered

dangerous and issued a nationwide alert. One of the fugitives, in a phone call from Florida said the four didn't want to "hurt anyone" and escaped because prison conditions were "inhuman."

#### **Insurance Plans Protected**

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Labor Department officials say insurance policies for hundreds of thousands of federal employees will be protected despite its action in terminating government contracts with the Prudential Insurance Co. of America. The firm's government premiums exceed \$180

million annually. Department officials, beset by inquiries from anxious policyholders in the government, said no Prudential policies would be suspended or cancelled until those employees are covered by a new insurance

The department announced Monday it was terminating government contracts with Prudential because the insurance firm refused to turn over its employment records to the government. The department wanted the records to make sure the company does not discriminate in its hiring and promotion

# Aides Say Carter In Fighting Mood

**Graham To Oppose Moves** 

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) — Negative fallout from Billy Carter's involvement with Libya is no reason for Democratic convention delegates to turn their backs on his brother, the president, according to Gov. Bob Graham.

Any move by the 75 Florida Carter delegates to switch their allegiance will run smack into strong opposition from him, Graham told reporters Monday.

He said Carter delegates are morally and legall committed to vote for the president on the first two ballots at the convention in New York, which begins Aug. 11. Graham is a Carter delegate and chairman of Florida's 100-member delegation. He talked to reporters about a move among some Democrats to dump Carter because of Billy Carter's involvement with the government of Libya and a congressional inquiry into whether President Carter acted improperly.

# **Democrats Anger President**

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Carter is in a fighting mood and believes the people who want to deny him renomination are trying to exploit the controversy over his brother Billy's Libyan ties, a White House aide

Despite Carter's feelings, more and more Democrats in Congress are talking about opening up the Democratic National Convention in New York next month to allow the delegates to nominate anyone they want for president. And there is growing speculation the convention might seek an alternative to both Carter and Sen. Edward Kennedy of Massachusetts.

The alternatives frequently mentioned include Vice President Walter Mondale, Secretary of State Edmund Muskie, Sen. Henry Jackson of Washington and Rep. Morris Udall of Arizona.

Mondale issued a statement Monday assuring a fellow Minnesotan, Rep. James Oberstar, he has no intention of becoming a candidate for the presidential nomination. The White House later told reporters Mondale's disavowal of candidacy was not solicited by the president.

White House sources said Muskie planned to make a similar statement, but an official close to Muskie said the secretary has not ruled out accepting the nomination, if "He is not the type to rule anything out," the Muskie

At the White House, a top presidential aide said President Carter is fighting mad about the controversy and the talk about opening the convention. "There's no doubt that there are efforts being made -

and efforts that already have been made - to exploit this thing," the aide said. "We're going to do the best we can not to let them get away with it."

Meanwhile, several House liberals announced formation of a \$200,000, two-week campaign to "open" the "An awful lot of people are still in the closet," said Rep.

BARTOW, Fla. (UPI) - Jeffrey Streeter won't forget July

County Judge Edward Threadgill found Streeter guilty and sent him to jail. Dawson protested, explaining the ruse, but Threadgill, aying the evidence showed the man at the defense table was

Inderson, didn't change his mind until the next morning after Streeter had spent a night in jail. "That was the worst night of my life," Streeter said. "I he o sleep on the floor." In court Monday, Threadgill admonished Dawson for being misguided" and "inappropriate" but took no action against

him - even though prosecutors asked for a contempt citation

# Inmate Jumps To Death At Orange County Jail

ORLANDO, Fla. (UPI) - An Orange County jail inmate plunged to his death Monday after squeezing through a seventh-floor jailhouse window and falling to a first floor roof

of the Municipal Justice Building.

Shortly before he died a police psychologist had inmate, Curtis Prichard, 19, was not suicidal. Prichard, who had a bus ticket from Sacramento, Calif., in his pocket, was arrested by police Sunday for sleeping in an unoccupied building and resisting arrest without violence.

Police said Prichard squeezed through the window when corrections officer Wilbur Carter took him out of a maximum-security cell and went to get another inmate who like Prichard

Prichard, who stood just 5-feet 6-inches tall and weighed just 110 pounds, apparently went around a corner and squeezed through a six-inch gap in the hinged windows which are kept open because the jail is not air conditioned.

open because the jail is not air conditioned.

Maj. John Sheultz said there was no way of telling whether Prichard jumped or was attempting to escape from the jail and fell. Four years ago an inmate escaped briefly from the fourth floor after easing out a similar window and making his way along a window ledge and down a drain pips.

Two hours before the incident police psychologist John Chonady said Prichard was rutional and coherent in an interview ad gave no indication that he wanted to harm himself.

# Tip O'Neill For President?

Former President Gerald Ford is predicting the independent presidential candidacy of John Anderson most likely will deny an electoralcollege majority to either Ronald Reagan or Jimmy Carter and thus force the election into the House of Representatives.

By describing such a constitutional crisis, Ford appears to be warning his countrymen that protest votes cast for Cong. Anderson, who is given no chance of being anything but a spoiler, are not without considerable risk for the nation.

Anderson says such talk is counseling "strategy of fear." But twice before, in 1804 and 1824, the House decided who would be president. Moreover, we've had some fairly close calls i recent elections: in 1960, for example, a shift of fewer than 9,000 votes in Illinois and Missouri would have denied victory to either John Kennedy or Richard Nixon. And, as recently as 1968, George Wallace won 46 electoral votes. Indeed, if Anderson should carry a single state in a close election, there could be an electoral deadlock.

The peculiarities of our electoral process could produce an even worse scenario: the United States could be without a president to swear in on

This worrisome potential for trouble was one of he critical compromises between small and large states hammered out at the Constitutional Convention in 1787. The founding fathers decided the number of presidential electors chosen from each state equals its representation in the House and Senate, and the candidate with a one-vote margin akes all the electoral votes. The electoral college has survived more than 100 attempts in Congress to abolish it through a constitutional amendment because it still bridges the conflicts of powerful

Let's assume the worst case this year: In the Nov. 4 election neither President Carter nor Gov. Reagan wins the required 270 of the 538 faceless electors. Then, the electors meet in their states on the first Monday after the second Wednesday of December - Dec. 15 - and formally certify this fact. Inasmuch as it will be the new Congress, not the old one, that will be called on to break the deadlock, nothing happens until Jan. 6 when the House and Senate meet in joint session to receive the electoral votes, contained in two inlaid wooden boxes. The outgoing vice president, Walter Mondale, declares no winner. Whereupon members of the Senate depart to choose a vice president from the two top contestants and the House convenes to choose a president from among the top three finishers. In the House, each state votes as a unit and has one vote. It takes 26 votes


No one knows how many congressmen, if any, would vote their party allegiance or be bound by the electoral majority in their states. And no one knows whether the Democrats will continue to control both houses in the next Congress.

The House has until Jan. 20 - Inauguration Day - to reach a decision. If it is unable to name a Europe. president by then, the vice president chosen by the Senate, assuming this has been done, will become acting president. If both House and Senate are unable to decide, the Speaker of the House, Tip O'Neill would become acting president, possibly serving out a full four-year term. Remote as this possibility is, it should nevertheless cool the most ardent Anderson

Fortunately, history is reassuring. No third party candidate has ever played kingmaker in the electoral college or forced the election in the House. Theodore Roosevelt's Bull Moose campaign in 1912 — the most formidable third-party bid ever — won more than 27 percent of the votes and 88 electors but produced no electoral





MOSCOW (UPI) - Thirtyseven American sports fans Western newsmen, billing the jog as a protest Tuesday staged a "fun jog" on the fringe of the Moscow President Carter's Olympic boycott. Olympics that got out of hand when the Soviet authorities tried

to turn it into an antiboycott propaganda event. The original idea was the brainchild of David Himmelberger, 1978 U.S. race walking champion, who had planned on having a quiet early-morning run with fellow Americans across the gently sloping Lenin Hills overlooking the Moskva

"It's all gotten out of hand," Himmelberger, 34, said when a bevy of about 30 Soviet and Western reporters turned up with TV cameras and tape recorders to cover the event.



The indictment charges Veverka with conspiring to violate McDuffie's civil rights, conspiring with other police officers to falsify police reports, being an acressory after the fact to the beating and filing false criminal charges against McDuffie. If convicted on all ounts, Geverka faces 26 years in prison and \$21,500 in
