

Gunmen Fire On Iran Site **Believed To Hold Captives**

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Gunmen fired on a site in the city of Mashad where some of the 53 American hostages reportedly are held, the official Pars news agency said today. There were no reports of casualties. Witnesses also reported hearing shooting Wednesday night at the U.S. Embassy, but a spokesman for the Islamic militants holding the hostages said it was "revolutionary firing" by guards inside the occupied

Last month, an embassy guard was killed during similar shooting inside the compound. The militants, however, charged the shooting Mashad, in northeastern Iran, was the work of "internal lackeys of America" seeking to prevent the hostages from being tried as spies.

China Urges Korea Pullout

TOKYO (UPI) - Chinese Premier Hua Guofeng called today for the withdrawal of American troops from South Korea to pave the way for a peacefu reunification of the Korean peninsula.

Earlier, Hua indirectly accused the Soviet Union of causing "war and tension" across Asia, but promised that China would not police the continent or become a superpower with its new-found nuclear capabilities. Speaking at the Japanese National Press Club, Hua, who also is Chinese Communist Party Chairman, said, "I have told my friends in the United States that America should withdraw from South Korea." There are 40,000 American troops now stationed in South Korea.

NATIONAL REPORT: An earthquake struck a few mile away from a yet-to-be-opened Diablo Canyon nuclear plant in San Luis Obispo, Calif., just hours after a \$100 million cuit was filed charging Pacific Gas & Electric Co. built the plant without making adequate quake studies. The quake measuring 4.6 on the Richter scale, centered just off the Pacific Coast about 25 miles from the nuclear plant, rocked California Wednesday night. There were no reports of injuries or damage at the plant, although there were reports of power outages and minor damage in the general area. Senate Passes Spendina Plan

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - The Senate will vote out the rest of a \$595 million supplemental budget today and a conference committee will be called in to reconcile the plan with the House's \$676 million proposal.

The Senate passed a \$408.3 million general spending plan (SB 1362) 38-1 Wednesday. Sen. Don Chamberlin, D-St. Petersburg, discented. The Senate takes up a \$187 million education construction bill (SB 1104) today. The House voted 107-6 for a supplemental general tax revenue appropriation (HB 1770) earlier Wednesday. That, together with a \$200 million schools construction bill (HB 1809)

voted out last week, gives it a total supplemental spending plan of \$676 million. A conference committee is expected to begin work this weekend reconciling the two plans, a task which must be completed quickly if the Legislature is to adjourn June 6 as

The big difference in the two proposals is that the House plan requires an \$87 million increase in property taxes for schools while the Senate plan does not.

The House dinned into the state's working capital reserve and for a \$2,000 a year pay raise for teachers, while senators decided to tap the fund instead for extra money to help south Florida school districts absorb the children of Cuban refugee



2nd Congressman Indicted In Abscam Investigation

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Rep. Raymond Lederer, D-Pa., the latest congressman indicted in the Abscam investigation, declared, "I want my integrity back," while campaigning this spring for renomination to a third term in the House.

Lederer, then implicated only by news leaks in the investigation, easily beat out six challengers and won the Democratic primary - but before the general election he likely will have to make good on his vow to regain his integrity.

A New York grand jury indicted the Philadelphia Democrat Wednesday on charges he took \$50,000 in bribes from FBI undercover agents on Sept. 11, 1979. while hidden cameras recorded the transaction in the bureau's Abscam investigation.

Lederer became the second congressmen to be criminally charged for allegedly accepting money from FBI agents posing as Arab sheiks, or their associates, willing to pay bribes for political favors.

Budget Heads Rap Carter

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Congressional budget leaders, who two months ago began their work in close alliance with the White House, have bitterly attacked President Carter for his opposition to the 1981 budget






