Local Ministers Ask Return Of Holy Day

The Seminole County Ministerial Association has adopted a resolution urging the return of Sunday as a holy

A resolution, printed elsewhere in this issue in its entirety, said the association members were "deeply concerned about the practice of holding conventions, going on trips, boating, cleaning house, mowing lawns, washing the cars and other such things on Sunday.

Ministers said in the resolution that such things are not calculated to make desirable church-going communities. The resolution also called attention to the fact that supermarkets in nearby cities remain open on Sunday. Ministers opposed this, as they did other "non-essential" business on Sunday.

Seminole County is to be commended for several Sunday practices. Surrounding counties allow beer establishments to remain open on Sunday, Seminole does not. In many Florida communities, Sunday is "just another day" for business establishments. In Sanford, however, downtown stores close to observe the holy day.

In the resolution, ministers pointed out that many foreign countries held elections on Sunday. They pointed out that the "Continental Sunday" isn't something that is desired in Seminole County.


