



Female Episcopal Priests

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - The Episcopal Church now has its first women priests, an office they gained in an open revolt against age-old ecclesiastical barriers. They face threatened disciplinary restraints on their new ministry. But the 11 women ordained here Monday, with four bishops conferring on them the order of priesthood, indicated a confidence about their future that resembled the exuberance of the occasion. "I've been ministering to oppressed people, and I'll continue to do that-as a priest," said the Rev. Katrina Swanson, of Leawood, Kan., one of the newly ordained women. About 1,500 persons viewed the ceremony.

Vesco's Guns, Girls

WASHINGTON (AP) - Guns and call girls have been smuggled out of the country to fugitive financier Robert L. Vesco and his associates in Costa Rica, according to information obtained by government investigators. Sources said the weapons and prostitutes were flown to Costa Rica on a private Lear jet owned by Vesco associate Thomas P. Richardson, the head of a Los Angeles brokerage firm and a self-described close personal friend of

The weapons, described as "enough guns for a small army," reportedly were used to arm Vesco's bodyguards, According to the sources, President Nixon's nephew, Donald F. Nixon Jr., an employe of Vesco since 19/1, also

is believed to be in Costa Rica with Vesco.

Smith Ends Campaign

SALISBURY, Rhodesia (AP) - Prime Minister Ian Smith wound up his campaign for today's national election with a promise to protect the interests of the white minority as he has since he declared independence from Britain in 1965. Smith's Rhodesian Front was considered sure to win most of the 50 seats in parliament reserved for whites although a new and more liberal white faction, the Rhodesia Party, put 38 candidates in the field. Eight other seats are elected by black and Asian voters, while the tribal electoral council picks eight others. Rhodesia has a population of 5 million blacks and fewer than 250,000 whites; of these, 79,846 whites, 6,938 blacks, 1,516 mulattos and 1,352 Asians were qualified to vote.





The Hungry At Mercy Of Weather

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - The world's weather map this early summer, looks fair which is to say foul. The monsoons are late on the Asian subcontinent, usual rain is not falling in northern Mexico and the skies over Texas are clear as a mirror. Some climatologists are forecasting drought, disaster and global

As if the planet did not have enough woes, something is apparently amiss in the heavens. A think-group including weathermen and political scientists meeting in Europe in May said people can no longer take a benevolent climate for granted; their conclusion was the climate is

Another: food wars between the "haves" and

The predictions may come as a surprise to Americans concerned not with the availability of food but only its cost. True, there has been some news about starvation in Africa's sub-Sahara, and occasionally a reference to the fact that half the world is already undernourished. But real worry? The U.S. government will have none of it; on the contrary, Agriculture Secretary Earl Butz encourages citizens to gorge themselves on beef so growers will prosper.

And as for the climate change that might set off the distant catastrophes, the government seems equally disinterested. A spokesman for the National Weather Service admits it has not rained in much of the Texas wheat plains since the spring of 1973, and that the weather has been "mucked up a bit" all over the planet lately, but can make no further comment on anything but tomorrow's routine forecast.

We are left, therefore, with only the warnings of those generally regarded as doomsayers - The Herald Reid Byrson of the University of Wisconsin, for one. He is the chairman of that institution's Dear Sir: environmental studies, and is blunt as a cannon ball: "The weather is changing significantly. It predict. I hope I'm wrong but I believe it may lead to mass starvation. We'll still be able to eat here in America, I suppose, but I don't believe

Byrson is not talking about tomorrow. He's pessimistic about now. "The question is, how will the world eat next year?" If something isn't done, he suggests that United Nations estimates of 400 million people facing starvation may develop into something more horrible than figures: "Millions are going to die."

Hopefully, mercifully, the doomspeak is excessive. But right now it seems to be the only talk heard concerning weather change and its con-

The U.S. bureacracy in charge of such, the Administration, spends \$421 million a year but talks very little, at least of pessimism. "Yes," says an official, "there does seem to be an overall trend toward cooler global temperature, but you can't say, willy-nilly, this means disaster. Anybody can shout that the weather is changing but the fact is it takes thousands and thousands years to determine whether this is so." Clearly, the world does not have thousands and ousands of years it can spare. By this time next year, there will be 75 million more mouths to feed, thus if climatic-famine calcuity is to

Business Ducking Inflation

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - Businessmen are paying premiums as nigh as 20 to 30 per cen over posted prices to assure delivery of supplies they need to fulfill contracts over the next 15 to 20

More and more suppliers are demanding that buyers sign contracts with open-ended pricing which means the buyer pledges to pay whatever the price may be in the future, depending on the producer's rising costs. These escalator clauses force the buyer to demand similar promises from his own customers.

The current super-high interest rates are being factored into more and more contracts, both short and long-term ones.

But businessmen's woes do not stop here Shortages of both skilled men (spot welders, anodizers, engineers) and materials (special alloys, railway cars, steel casing) are spreading

What are the results of all these problems? One of the most significant is the impact on high

These are the companies whose products are necessary for developing new energy sources and energy-saving devices, for automating operations in which skilled men are scarce, for producing techniques and equipment to attack pollution, for speeding transportation and for increasing output per man hour in order to hold down costs. These firms are being driven to the wall by the high cost of money, their inability to secure funds at almost any cost and by the growing unprofitability of high-risk ventures.

Worst of all, the businessmen this reporter talks to have become afraid of what the government will do next. And they mean both Congress

What all this means to you and me is guaranteed, continuing inflation for a long time to come. It means prices that are not going to come down in the forseeable future - prices, in fact, that will go up at a rate businessmen themselves cannot predict. The future has become so filled with uncertainties, in fact, that industry is digging in for safety in ways which will slow the day of recovery.

An inventor friend, president of a highlysuccessful firm, is putting his new ideas in a card file - not bothering to patent or not seeking development as he would have a few years back. Office for two weeks, one on sick leave the other because costs are so great and Congressional on vacation. Because of this I worked two jobs all pressure against profits so staunch that he can't afford to take chances. Most new concepts needed to bring this country out of inflation are high risk. Some succeed and some fail. To attract needed capital there must be sufficient profit on the successes to make up for losses or the failures. This is not the situation today

Lake Mary Recall Fails; Norden Quits

LAKE MARY — Despite charges of vote fraud this city's charter will probably withstand the test of Tuesday's election to recall the city charter, speculated George Hess, leader of the anti-incorporation drive.

A record 74 per cent voter turnout in this city of 834 registered voters narrowly turned back the charter recall.

Two-thirds of the 601 total votes cast (401 votes) were needed to abolish the city. There (Related story page 2A)

Of the 47 absentee ballots cast, 11 were disqualified for various reasons. Of those counted in the final tally 11 were for charter surrender and 25 were against.

"If 61 per cent of the people voted to turn in the charter that tells me there is something wrong with the way this city is run," Mayor Margie Hess said.

Her husband, George, was to meet with his supporters in the charter recall drive and their attorney, Bill Hutchison of Sanford, to discuss the possibility of challenging the election as well as prosecuting possible violations.

"Challenging the election is a moot point," Mrs. Hess said today.


