SPEEDING ON BEACH IS FATAL

AUSES THE DEATH OF CHARLES STEWART AND OTHERS FATALLY INJURED

Daytona, Sept. 1-Another fatal ac cident occurred on Daytona Beach Sunday afternoon, the tragedy resulting from the ditching of a large automobile which turned turtle after one of the front wheels came off while the car was moving at fast speed Charles A. Stewart, of Arlington, N. J., a wealthy winter resident of Daytonia who was driving his big touring car, was instantly killed when the machine turned turtle. With the victim of the accident were Mrs. Stewart who received a pelvic fracture, cuts or the head and internal injuries; Alfred B. Fuller, who sustained a fracture at the base of the skull, and Mrs. Fuller who had two ribs broken and was in lured internally. The injured were rushed to a hospital for emergency treatment and it was stated this morning that possibly all three would re-



AMERICAN RED CROSS TO GIVE RURAL HELP

Program for Public Health and Community Welfare Is Now Well Under Way.

Rural communities and towns of less than 8,000 population benefit in a very large part by the public health and community welfare work of the American Red Cross. Almost all of the 8,000 Red Cross chapters have some rural sections in their territory. Therefore the Red Cross Rural Bervice.

Briefly, the purpose of Rural Service is to assist people to get out of life more health, wealth and happiness. In this purpose public health instruction and general educational progress of both children and adults play a big

Recreation is found to be one of the biggest needs in rural life. There is lack of sufficient play-life for the children and social life for the adults. Picnics, pageants, debuting clubs, basehall leagues, community singing and other social events which bring the people of surrounding communities together have been organized and carried on under the guldance of Red Cross rural workers to great advantage. In many instances solving recreational problems and getting people together proves to be the awakening of the community to other conditions which may be improved by united

As a result of community organiza tion, townships in which there had been neither plans nor interest in community progress have been organised to work together with the unified purpose of bringing their community up to the most enlightened standards. Lecture and musical entertainment courses have been started as a result of community meetings, as well as circulating libraries, Red Cross schools of instruction in Home Nursing, Cure of the Sick and First Aid. Washington, Sept. 1 .- Combines federal and state expenditures for road building may reach a total o. 250,000,000 during the current fisca year, according to Thomas H. Acc bonald, chief o fthe bureau of publi toads, department of agriculture,

The last installment of federal air funds totalling \$100,600,000 became available last July 1. Three quarter: of this appointment was derived fron the 1919 appropraition, while \$25,000 000 was provided from the origina appropriation in 1916.

DADE COUNTY, FLA., LEADS ALL OTHER COUNTIES IN U. S.

Washington, Aug. 25 .- Dade Couny, Fla., containing the city of Miami, leads all countles of the United States in which the population figures have been announced, in its growth in the past 10 years. It has now more than 3 1-2 times the population it had in 1910, its percentage of increase having been 258.1. With almost half of upwards of 3,000 counties in the United States announced, five counties have more than tripled their 1910 population and four have more than doubled the number of their inhabitants.
