# Argentina Joins The Anti-U.S. Bloc

On May Day of this year Cuban Dictator Fidel Castro called for the establishment of a bloc of Latin American nations that would "defend" themselves against "Yankee imperialism." Today just such a bloc appears to have been formed.

Cuban President Osvaldo Dorticos and Chilean President Salvador Allende were among the dignitaries present when Hector Campora was recently inaugurated as Argentina's new president. Both presidential guests were invited to sign the official inaugural document.

The gesture was particularly significant in view of the fact that another president, Juan Maria Bordaberry of neighboring Uruguay, was also present but was not invited to sign.

The signing by Dorticos and Allende of the Campora document may well have signaled the birth of a new alliance: Communist Cuba, Marxist Chile and Peronist Argentina.

At that moment Cuba and Argentina did not even have official diplomatic relations. This was quickly taken care of, however, once Campora became president: announcement was made of the reestablishment of the formal ties which had been broken between the two countries since the early sixties.

Upon resumption of relations Campora and Dorticos gave each other a warm Latin "abrazo." The presidential embrace was featured in front-page pictures in several Buenos Aires newspapers and mentioned on Havana

Dorticos and his group stayed at the Hotel Plaza in downtown Buenos Aires. Havana Radio reported that a crowd gathered and was addressed briefly by Dorticos.

Dorticos told the Argentine youths, "Comrades...I want to extend to you a revolutionary and fraternal salute of Cuban youth and a profound message of solidarity of the Cuban revolution for the Argentine people. I believe these words express precisely our sentiments. Long live the revolution! Long live the struggle against imperialism!"

Further symbolizing the new bonds between Cuba, Chile and Argentina, all three presidents

Chile and Peru. Castro himself had previously been a guest of Allende, and late in 1972 Allende visited Cuba. Peru and Cuba also frequently exchange official missions. For almost a decade Castro's regime had been

in virtual diplomatic limbo so far as the other Latin American countries were concerned. Only Mexico maintained relations with Cuba.

Now Peru, Chile and Argentina have relations with Cuba, as do the four former

British colonies, Jamaica, Guyana, Barbados and Trinidad-Tobago. Other countries may follow suit, including Venezuela, Ecuador and Panama.

The Cuba-Chile-Argentina bloc is clearly intended as a counterweight to the U.S. position in the hemisphere. It is, however, also aimed at Brazil, which has achieved power status in South America. Brazil's burgeoning military might is of concern to the Marxist regime of Chile and Peronist government of Argentina, and to the United States.





One is his new link to President Nixon as a personal consultant, ensconced in a small office in the Executive Office Building, where the President himself spends far more time than in his formal White House office. The judgment of governors questioned is that any close tie to the Nixon administration in this time of endlessly unfolding Watergate disclosures spells automatic trou-

To the extent, if any, that the President himself is hereafter shown to have had early knowledge of Watergate and to have taken part in the celebrated cover-up by White House officials, Connally's handicap is enlarged. All of the earlier Nixon utterances commenting favorably upon the forceful, attractive Texan are now seen as

crippling rather than helpful. The second damaging factor is that, as the Watergate affair widens, Connally's sharpened image as a wheelerdealer lawyer-businessman is felt by important, seasoned GOP governors to make him highly vulnerable to assault on this special score. Already hurtful columns have been written portraying him as using his status with the President for personal advantage.

The governors I talked to most often employed words like "harmful" to characterize this aspect of Connally's background. One western governor, at the mere mention of Connally's name, shook his head negatively before a question could be framed. An aide to an eastern governor finds Mr. Nixon's new reliance upon the Texan incredible against the Watergate backdrop.

As I reported many days ago, Connally did not expect his new adviser role to be public and formal, nor to have to sever his private legal and business associations. The evidence is convincing that the President, in his need to provide a "fresh front" for a tarnished administration. n effect threw Connally to the wolves to gain what he loped would be immediate advantage in the combat over Watergate. However, because everyone these days has been primed believe the worst about politicians, and political contributors, it should be pointed out that the conferring of

diplomatic plums in return for campaign donations was one of those practices which, like Topsy, just growed and was not necessarily the product of conscious evil. It was a self-feeding process: Because a stingy and moralistic Congress consistently refused to provide the funds necessary to run the nation's foreign embassies, particularly in the department of entertainment, only

rich men willing to dig into their own pockets could afford to be ambassadors. Or maybe it was the other way around: Because an ambassadorship was a convenient way to reward a political contributor, and since most contributors were perforce well-heeled, the Lemonade Lucies in Congress were able to score points with the public by refusing to vote enough funds to run an embassy in the manner in which the members of the international diplomatic set had accustomed themselves (even if it was only nibbling

Whichever way it happened, the result was the same. But if the fat cats no longer underwrite a significant part of the nation's diplomatic functioning, that means Congress will have to-and that brings us back where the whole thing started.





# Imported South African Wines Pass Writer's Taste Test

I have never before written a column on wines other than of those from the United States. Then, again, I had never been to a wine tasting of imports where I thought the wines were of so interesting a nature - plus holding a reasonable price line - that I cared to carry one in print.

The tasting was of South African wines newly introduced into the American market and was held for the benefit of wine writers. There were 10 table wines offered:

It is said that Napoleon Bonaparte preferred the wines of South Africa to his own country's French wines. Could be; after all, South Africa's wine production dates back to 1659 and during Napoleon's heydays, France's Chateau Mouton-Rothschild wasn't yet in existence and Romanee-Conti was practic-

Also, unlike European wines, in which there is a considerable variation in quality due mainly to climatic reasons, it is said by vintners that "every year is a vintage year" with South African wines because of the consistent and constant warmer Mediterranean-like weather in the Cape's grape growing

The five wines I tasted were all fleur du cap. This French spelling for "Flower of the Cape" is in big lettering on the bottle and would be like a brand name. On the neck band label is printed the name

The two whites I had were: Fleur du Cap Emerald Stein; a light, naturally sweet wine, and Fleur du Cap Riesling, a clear, almost colorless dry wine from Riesling grapes. (
