German Trade

It does not pay to deliberately antagonize a good customer. Germany is a true of national foreign policies as it is of private business enterprise.

There has been no better evidence of this since the world began than Germany under the rule of Adolf Hitler. Since the Nazi chieftain took over the reins of government in Germany and began his persecutions of the Jews, that country's exports have declined precipitately.

This is an almost "catastrophic decline," as John Elliott writing in the New York Herald Tribune calls it. Mr. Elliott goes on to say that Germany's total volume of exports has declined 1,672,000,000 marks (\$486,140,000) and the volume of imports in the same period—between 1932 and 1934—has sunk by almost 215,000,000 marks (\$52,675,000).

Germany's exports for the past year were less than half that maximum figure, totaling but 1,167,000,000 marks (\$319,210,000) while the volume of imports, which have been particularly stationary for the past three years, amounted to 1,142,000,000 marks (\$310,970,000).

While the foreign trade of other countries, notably the United States and Great Britain, has been recovering from the low level of the "great depression" in the "great depression," Germany's exports took another drop of 191,000,000 marks (\$51,725,000).
