German Trade

It does not pay to deliberately antagonize a good customer. It is a true of national foreign policies as it is of private business enterprise. The merchant who insults his customers is likely to find his sales falling off, and the government which pursues a nationalistic policy which arouses the ire of large groups of peoples throughout the world is apt to find its foreign trade suffering as a consequence.

There has been no better evidence of this since the world began than Germany since the rule of Adolf Hitler. Since the Nazi chieftain took over the reins of government in Germany and began his persecutions of the Jews, that country's exports have declined precipitately turning a favorable trade balance of \$163,415,000 in 1933 into an unfavorable balance of \$297,250,000 in 1934. This is an almost "catastrophic decline," as John Elliott writing in the New York Herald Tribune calls it. Mr. Elliott goes on to say that Germany's total volume of exports has declined 1,672,000,000 marks (\$285,140,000), and the volume of imports in the same period—between 1932 and 1934—has sunk by almost 215,000,000 marks (\$362,675,000). In 1934, when the Reich's foreign trade was flourishing, the volume of exports totaled 9,599,000,000 marks (\$2,351,755,000) with a resulting favorable trade balance amounting to 2,822,000,000 marks (\$703,640,000).

Germany's exports for the past year were less than half that maximum figure, totaling but 4,167,000,000 marks (\$1,020,510,000), while the volume of imports, which have been principally stationary for the past three years, amounted to 4,147,000,000 marks (\$1,019,740,000). While the foreign trade of other countries, notably the United States and Great Britain, has been recovering from the low level of the trade depression in the "past" year, Germany's exports took another drop of 191,000,000 marks (\$47,250,000). These figures prove clearly the existence of political factors reflecting a "bitter" resentment felt abroad at the persecution of the Jews in the Third Reich. Mr. Elliott declares Germany's foreign trade figures for the month of December, showing a passive surplus of 45,000,000 marks (\$11,025,000), the second largest of the year, indicate that Reichsbank President Hjalmar Schacht is not so sanguine about the "new plan" for balancing Germany's trade accounts. The monthly trade balance, in the case of 1934, is extremely limited supply of goods as well as the money for other nations which the German government is avariciously hoarding. That alibi, says the defense, is that the accused killer was in a Bronx bakery "tipping coffee, chatting with his wife," at the very hour of the crime.

what late yesterday when the baby's mother, Mrs. Anne Lindbergh, testified that Hauptmann's two trips to the stands, were not such much to bolster it.

Christian Fredericksen, the baby's father, couldn't "swear" that Hauptmann was there.
