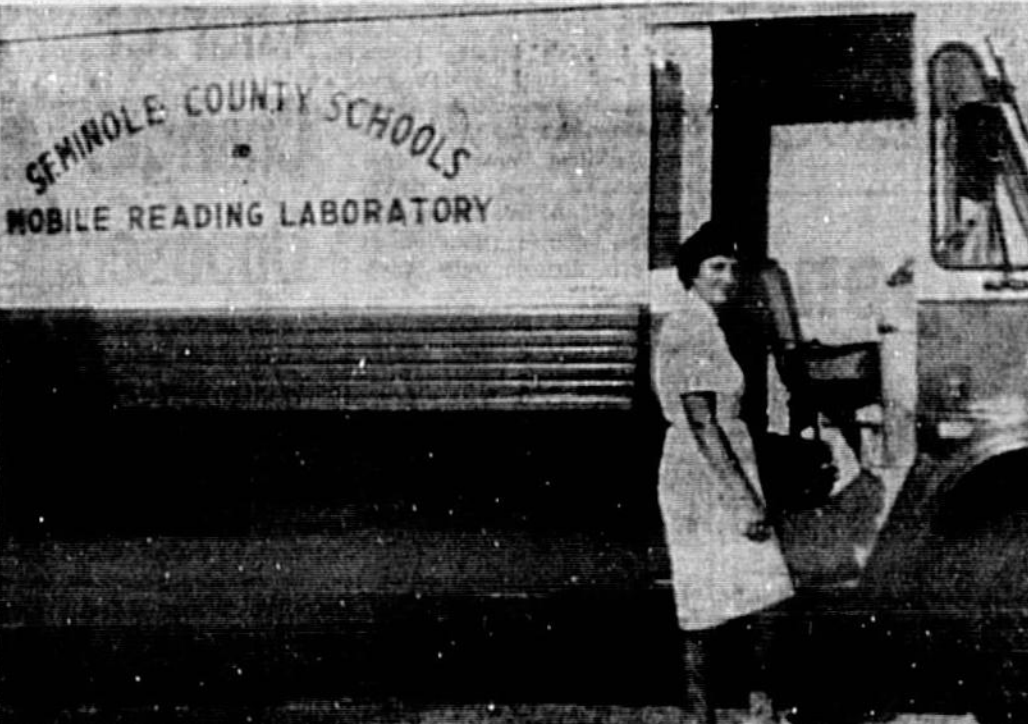

She is a graduate of Cooper Union Art School in N.Y., and has studied under Mr. Sayer of the Art Student League, at the Burk and Nura Studio, and at Sietson University under Hayward Veal, a noted English artist. She has had an impressive list of both one-man shows and honors. Mrs. Henderson, who is originally from Nashville, Tenn., studied at Watkins Art Institute, Peabody Demonstration School, the Harris School of Advertising Art in Nashville and at the New York School of Interior Design. 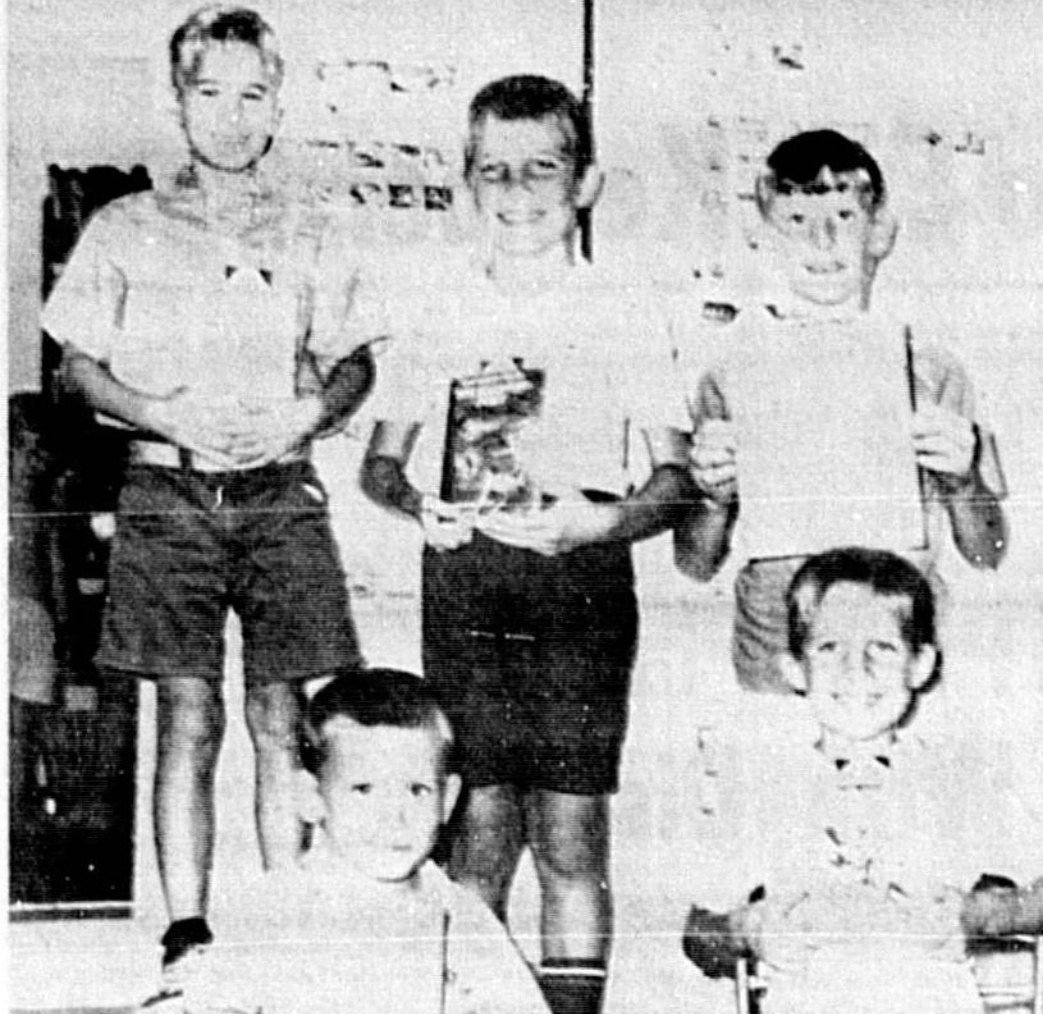

U.S. Alert For Russ Move On Berlin

WASHINGTON (AP) — Top U.S. officials say they lack any firm evidence that the Soviet Union intends to start trouble over Berlin, but they are on alert for such a move because of U.S. Russian tension.

Attention was focused on Berlin when President Johnson in a speech Tuesday warned the Soviet Union that "the use of force and the threat of force will be tolerated in areas... like Berlin."

The officials described Johnson's statement as a precautionary move. "There is no doubt that the Russians would like to put the squeeze on West Berlin," one official said.

Nixon, HHH Clash On Nuclear Ban

Nixon, the Republican candidate, endorsed the treaty in a statement Wednesday but said Senate ratification should be delayed until Soviet intentions in the multination treaty against spread of nuclear weapons.

1 carrot, diced
1/2 cup lemon juice
2 tablespoons flour
Cooked rice
Remove tubes from kidney and cut into 1/2 inch pieces. Add kidney, onion cubes, onion and seasonings. Cover tightly and cook slowly 1 1/2 hours. Add carrots and continue cooking until meat is tender. Add lemon juice, then thicken with flour mixed with water to form a smooth paste. Serve in a range of cooked rice. 8 to 10 servings.

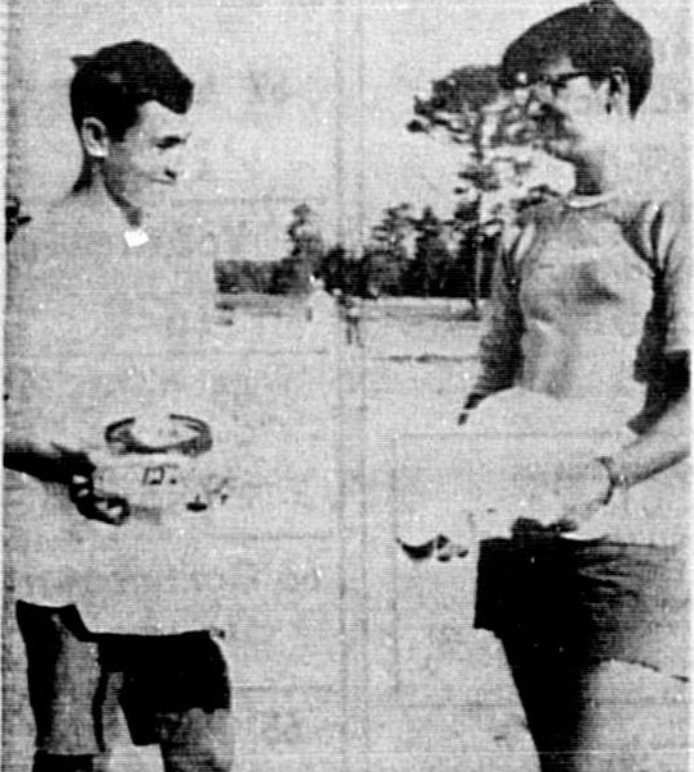
