

The current courthouse building is considered to be bursting at the seams, housing many county offices as well as the courtrooms. The county has come under pressure from courtroom personnel to make a final decision on the matter.

The county plans to spend be-tween \$40-50 million on the ex-pansion of the existing courthouse to accommodate their needs but Seminole County Commissioner Daryl McLain had promised to add a



Proposed referendum will place two chiefs under city manager

SANFORD — This Sept. 3, during the Republican primary election, citisens of Sanford, regardless of party affiliation, will also be voting on two items. One would have the police chief and fire chief reporting to the city manager rather than city commission, and the other would move the city election from December to Many

The two chiefs would not actually be mentioned in the proposed referendum. Rather, it would call for a yea or no vote, that the city manager shall "direct and supervise the administration of all departments, offices

nd agencies of the city."
The city manager already has control over all but the


City Clerk Jan Dougherty brought the election matter up during the city commission work session Monday afternoon. "What I need is effective dates for these two items," she said.

Sauerkraut juice causes pollution

NEW ORLEANS — The salty juice left over from making sauerkraut is sometimes bottled as a healthy drink, and has also been used to clean out oil wells and produce cattle feed.

Still, producers spend a fortune making the leftover brine fit for the sewers.

Cornell Professor Yong D. Hang now thinks he may have found a better way to deal with it. Sauerkraut brine, it seems, can feed yeast that produce an enzyme that can be used to extract flavors from fruit.

"If there was a use for sauerkraut tuice, I think

flavors from fruit.

"If there was a use for sauerkraut juice, I think it would be a wonderful boon to our industry," said Sheidon Goldstein, owner of Res-D-Pack Fueds Inc. in North Norwich, N.Y.

Sauerkraut brine must be processed before it gets into the water supply because it is too chock-full of organic matter. If it goes directly into severs, rivers and lakes, bacteria flourish in it, growing in such numbers that they use up all cayen in the water and sufficate the fish.

Goldstein, whose fresh sauerkraut is packaged with very little brine, sells most of his excess to canners. He has a small plant, putting out maybe 8,000 tone of kreut a year.

8.000 tone of kraut a year.

The Bush Brothers & Co. sauerkraut plant in Shioton, Wis., cans four to five times that much, and probably spends about \$250,000 a year to treat the leftover brine, plant manager King Pharrasid.

Hang said his research turned up a yeast that just loves sauerkraut juice and produces an ensyme called beta-glucosidase, which can be used to extract flavors from fruit.
