Szymakowski turned in a field goal kicking performance against Rutgers the other day that would qualify him for the Giants. This youngster with the tongue-twister name footed three field goals, two in the second quarter. Unless my memory is bad you'll have to go back many a year to recall a college player kicking three goals in a single contest. The last comparable feat I remember was the Army-Navy game of 1924 when the cadet center, Ed Garloch, banged four between the uprights to beat the sailors 1-0.

Professional mentors get the most out of an accurate placement of drop kicker but few college coaches stress the foot in football or take full advantage of the kickers they have. It's all a matter of instruction and practice. Everyone on the Giants' squad, for example, tries kicking the ball dozen better booter drill an hour or so a day and practice a half-hour before a game. Many a college game could be won in the closing minutes with a field goal while the trailing team frantically trying for a touchdown and six points.

On the same Saturday Szymakowski had his field goal day against Rutgers, two major college games were decided by the method. Minnesota beat Michigan and Manhattan upset Du-

quesne. This is proof that the field goal can win games and isn't to be sneered at.

In addition to his nine points by field goals Stan also scored one touchdown and kicked an extra point. 

WASHINGTON

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4 (AP)— The House of Representatives today passed a bill to extend the United States' participation in the Lend-Lease program to include the production and distribution of foodstuffs.

The measure, known as the "Food Control Act," was passed by a vote of 433 to 13.

The bill would give the War Relocation Authority the power to regulate the production and distribution of foodstuffs in the United States, and to require the production of foodstuffs to be used for the relief of the people of the United States.

MADISON, Wis., Nov. 4. — Seeing him about the campus, you would take Elroy Hirsch for a library employee or a professor's assistant—but don't let appearances fool you.

That mild-mannered young lad is Wisconsin's new sophomore halfback sensation and on the football field any resemblance between him and the retiring type of male is purely coincidental.

This nervous-footed newcomer, who insists upon wearing a certain tan sweater the night before each home game, is the climactic find of Coach Harry Stuldreher, who has been looking for at left half since he came to Wisconsin six years ago. Stuldreher wouldn't swap him for any other left half he ever has coached.

In ordinary years, mid-seasons about Badger football are liberally sprinkled with regrets, but this year is different. With four wins and a tie in non-conference competition, Wisconsin fans are enjoying a successful Big Ten campaign—with Hirsch in a super-hero role.

Shouldered with most of the scoring chores when fullback Pat Harder, leading scorer and ground gainer in the Big Ten last year, was slowed down by a leg injury, Hirsch filled the gap with honors to spare, running for five touchdowns, and passing for another.

He got two against Missouri.

Juke Joint Brawl Brought Before City Court Judge

Jealousy, a juke joint brawl, and two revolvers found on the floor of the juke joint in Goldsboro after the brawl led to the arrest and arraignment before Judge F. L. Miller in City Court Monday evening of Moses Singletary, jealous negro husband and J. B. Marshall, dapper and well-dressed negro, whose alleged attentions to Singletary's wife were the stated cause of the quarrel.

On the evening of the brawl, J. B. Marshall was, he said, seated in the "caboose" or booth of the juke joint, listening to a "piccolo solo." Suddenly Singletary entered, revolver in hand. Scared witless, Marshall found he had gotten out quickly. It was brought out that Marshall quickly knocked the gun out of Singletary's hand. Singletary insisted that the other revolver, later found on the floor, belonged to Marshall, but no proof of this was found.

The case ended when Judge Miller adjudged Singletary guilty on two counts \$50 and costs of 90 days for carrying a concealed weapon, and \$15 and costs of 45 days for assault and threats. Marshall, prior to being dismissed, was lectured by Judge Miller, and told to avoid all appearance of paying attention to another man's wife.

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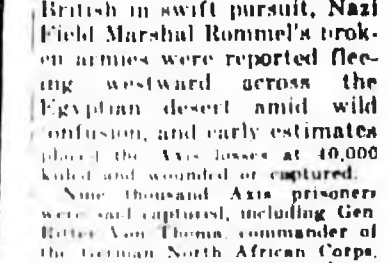
