Europe's Weather

While Floridians and people in other sections of the country take stock of the harm done both to pocket-books and health by the unusual weather this winter, news is just beginning to trickle in from Europe indicating that compared to the ravages of the cold over there, our recent frigid spells have been as nothing.

The "coldest winter of a century" in Europe left in its path untold suffering, severe damage to crops, disruption of transportation, with its attendant scarcity of food and fuel supplies, and the probability of future devastation from floods in the Spring.

The cold, which gripped the entire continent of Europe from the Scandinavian countries to the Balkans, was attended by severe outbreaks of respiratory illnesses—colds, gripe, influenza, and pneumonia, ailments, which were aggravated by the scarcity of fuel, and in some instances food, caused by the fact that canal systems were frozen, harbors locked with ice, and railroad trains stalled by snow drifts.

War-time censorship has prevented filing of much news about the details of Europe's lullard, which, in normal times, would have been one of the big news stories of the year, but now the facts are being told, and we, who thought we suffered, are beginning to realize how lucky we are.

There is no question that the severity of the weather in Europe prevented any sizable military activity, if any had been planned, but it is now beginning to be realized that future effects may play a vital part in any contemplated prosecution of the war.

Of no little significance will be the effect on farm products, which already are reported to be facing adverse conditions. Floods in the Danubian basin would spell disaster to one of Germany's chief grain supplies.

With all the nations in Europe seriously concerned with protecting their food resources, the weather this winter appears scheduled to play an unusually important role in the destiny of nations.

Netherlands' And Rumania's Plight Creates Concern

Germany Seeks More Rumanian Supplies; Dutch Charged With Violating Neutrality

Germany seeks more Rumanian supplies, and the Netherlands created new concern in Europe today as talk of sending an expeditionary force to relieve the besieged Finns increased in Britain.

Germany accused the Netherlands of acting as a regular gateway for British aerial squadrons to reach the Reich and asserted that it was established definitely that British planes, which scouted Germany, were flown over the Netherlands.

Dutch anti-aircraft guns barked intermittently for five hours at unidentified foreign aircraft. Netherlands is on a direct air route between Britain and Germany. The conflict was believed to be being unshaken on the Karelian front, although a Finnish communiqué did not refer to that sector.

The Finns said that 521 Russian planes had been shot down, 1310 Soviet tanks captured or destroyed since the war began.

The Western front continued comparatively quiet, but Germany reported strong French infantry assaults had been repulsed in the Meuse sector near the Luxembourg frontier.

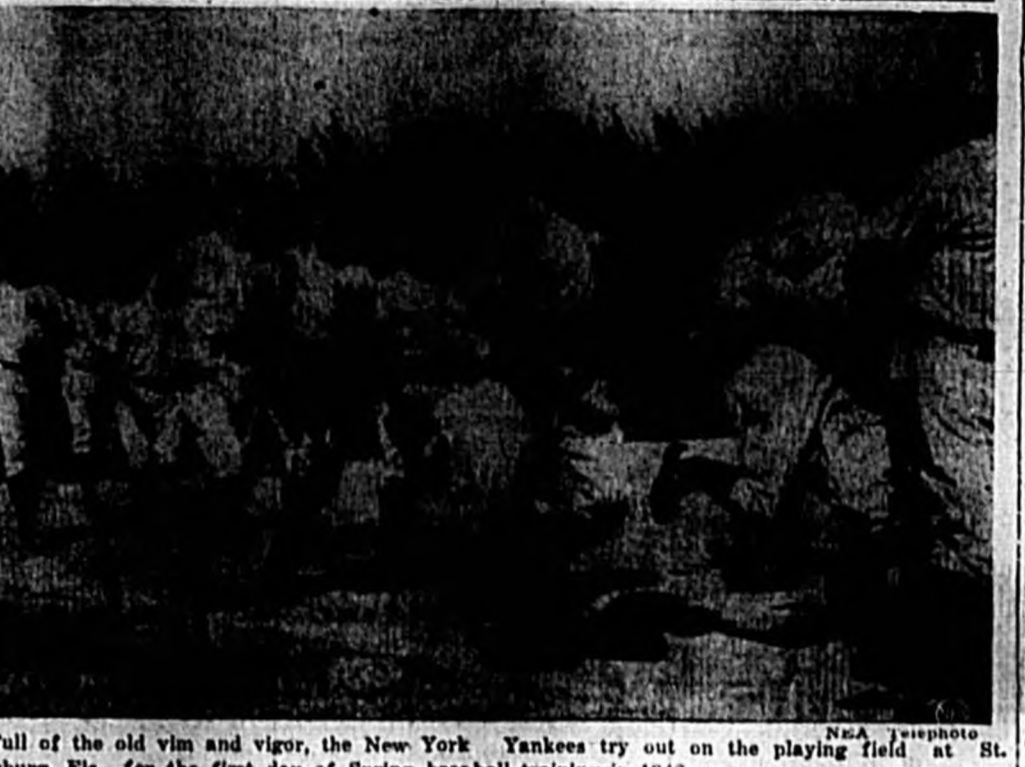

Storms Hit Varied Parts Of Country

Pacific Coast Struck As Rain And Snow Lash North Central Part Of America

Sub-zero weather felt in mid-west.

Two damaging storms today harried the nation, one striking the Pacific coastal states, the other hurling rain and snow across a wide spread area from the north central region to the Atlantic seaboard.

The mercury fell well below zero in Minnesota and North Dakota, and the upper section of New England.

Flood waters washed over a large portion of central and northern California as a rain storm of unusual intensity lashed northward into Oregon and Washington. Hundreds were homeless, rich farmlands were inundated, and landslides blocked rail and highway traffic.

In the town of Napa, 35 miles north of San Francisco, some 200 persons were rescued from flooded homes by boats. The Napa river had hurled its banks, flooding hundreds of acres, and the city was confronted with another danger—a high tide tonight.

At Winters, 15 miles southwest of Woodland, 500 persons in a federal migrant camp were isolated and marooned after two feet of water swept through their temporary shelters. In another migratory camp near Marysville, 400 persons were removed to higher ground.

Highways in the flood area were impassable in many instances because of water rising over the roadway, or because swollen dry creekbeds, suddenly swollen beyond limit of the banks, had slashed great gorges in the pavements, or carried away bridges and culverts.
