

In treating snake bite, the bitten area should be immobolized and the patient kept quiet. not allowed to walk or run, or to swallow alcoholic stimulants as this accelerates circulation and tends to distribute the poison more quickly through the body. A physician should be called at once or the patient transported to the physicians office or hospital. An adequate dose of anti-venom should be injected as soon as possible to neutralize the snake venom.
