

Increased Defense Spending, Higher Taxes In Ford Budget

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford today proposed increased defense spending, higher Social Security taxes and cutbacks in some welfare programs in a fiscal 1977 budget that he said makes hard choices between what the nation wants to do and what it can afford to do. He also asked Congress to approve an additional \$10billion decrease in income taxes this year and a \$28-billion cut next year, indicating he might approve them even if

Congress fails to enact the rigid spending ceiling he has demanded previously. The Ford budget, for the fiscal year begining Oct. 1, 1976, calls for total expenditures of \$394.2 billion and revenues of \$351.3 billion, leaving a deficit of \$43 billion. the second highest since World War II. But Ford said a balanced budget should be possible by 1979.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Patricia Hearst allowed a prosecution psychiatrist she said drove her to hysteria to examine her a second time, only after he promised to abide by "very "ringent safeguards and guarantees," her attorney says. The attorney, Albert Johnson, said Tuesday night that

Miss Hearst's four-hour examination earlier in the day was preceded by promises from the government that Dr. Harry Kozol "would not act in an unprofessional fashion" toward the newspaper heiress.

Johnson said the examination was concluded "without incident," and added that a psychiatrist who has been treating Miss Hearst -- Dr. Elizabeth Richard -- was present throughout the interview.

While high by historical standards, that's the best record in three years. In 1974, consumer prices soared to a 28-year high increase of 12.2 per cent. They rose 8.8 per cent in 1973.

Italian Crisis Seems Ominous

When President Harry S Truman first started giving friendly Italian politicians some financial assistance in the 1940s to help the friends of the United States of America, our foreign policy making was clear-eyed.

The United States, Mr. Truman said, "must make full use of its political, economic and, if necessary military power to prevent a Communist

If voices were raised during the intervening three decades to protest the assistance, we failed to hear them. Not only the CIA, but also major American multi-national industries such as Exxon and highli donated to Italian politicians, presumably will full knowledge of the country's leaders. So, for that matter, did the Soviet Union to politicians friendly to its causes.

Now the CIA, as well as the private American firms, are in the sights of Washington reformers who could very well dry up American political assistance abroad. The uproar could not have come at a worse time. Premier Aldo Moro's shaky coalition government has collapsed, leaving Italy with a caretaker government for the 37th time since World War II. Even when Italy installs its 38th government, the outlook for stability is not good. Mr. Moro's party received only 35 percent of the vote during last June's elections. The Communist Party received 33 percent. Remaining parties are numerous and weak, leaving only the possibility of another fragile coalition government.

The political problems of Italy are of grave concern to the free Western world. Unfortunately, Italy is not the only concern. Roughly the same threat to stable government exists in nearby France, in Spain and in Portugal. In each country, as throughout all of Europe, Communists are making a determined drive for a new image of respectability and a larger share of coalition governments. Western European Communists even are putting distance between themselves and Moscow, preaching the virtues of "socialism with a human face" - a combination of Western democracy and Marxist economics.

If Communists are successful in gaining cabinet posts in Italy in the next government France, Spain, Portugal and others will face the same problem. As Secretary of State Henry Kissinger reminded our allies during his visit to Europe, the end result could be the disintegration of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

That, in turn would pose a crisis of the first magnitude for the United States, but many on Capitol Hill apparently cannot see this far. believing that Italian politics are solely Italy's business. All of the tools that Harry Truman found so essential to protect the interests of the U.S. are being systematically stripped from the Ford administration.

Our friends in Europe are confused and dismayed by the developments, questioning America's will to resist Communist probes at a time when we are asking them to fight Communists in their governments.

The solutions to our foreign policy problems will begin when Congress begins to see us as others

Return To Sender

The Postal Service is being a bit high-handed in declaring that it cannot grant refunds to mail-users if the postal rate increases put in effect recently are thrown out by a court. While postal officials say this would be a "sheer administrative impossibility," the difficulty of making mass refunds to the public has not kept the courts from ordering them in some cases brought against private companies on behalf of consumers in

An association of bulk mailers has proposed that money collected from the proceeds from third class mail under the new rates be set aside in a special account until the courts rule on the rate increase. That sounds like a good idea, a step which would help simplify the task of setting up some kind of system for equitable refunds if the higher rates are ruled invalid.
