WASHINGTON (AP) - President Nixon, responding to mounting calls for his resignation, vows he has "no intention whatever of walking away from the job I was

Nixon voiced his determination to hold onto his office in 'a personal note" at the end of a television-radio address to the nation Wednesday night on energy problems. Speaking without notes, he said:

"I have no intention whatever of walking away from the job I was elected to do. As long as I am physically able, I am going to continue to work 16 to 18 hours a day for the cause of a real peace abroad, and for the cause of prosperity without inflation and war at home."

The administration announced Wednesday that it was waiving immigration regulations to permit the entry of the group of 25,000 Cubans, most of whom are living in Secretary of State Henry Kissinger and acting Atty.

Gen. Robert Bork approved the waiver. Officials said application of normal procedures would have required the Cubans to delay their immigration since the 20,000 annual quota limitation for residents of



It's third down and six on the Packers 43 yard line and the Dolphins are ahead late in the game, 3-0, coming from a ho-hum 49 yard field goal in the first quarter. Both teams have yet to penetrate the other's 40 yard line. What's the call? Of course, run a wide sweep for as many yards as possible (since the new rules say the ball must go back to the exact center of the field) and then kick another field goal. You guessed it. This is a "make believe" situation that's becoming more real every day if the present rules continue to develop the kind of game I've been bored to sleep with on so many Sunday and Mondays so far this season. The kicking

#### The Kicking Game

You've heard Howard and Dandy talking away on Monday Night Football about two major changes being talked about around the country that haven't as yet evoked much comment out of the NFL owners, but I expect it to become a major issue soon enough. The abolition of the zone defense and returning an attempted field goal to the line of scrimmage are currently the hottest items in pro gridiron gab sessions today, and for good reason.

Many fans are getting more and more fed up with all these three-point scores. They want to see touchdowns and with all the stories about the zone defense, they've begun to believe the zone, like in basketball, should be illegal. That's wrong. However, on this point-the field goal should be returned to the line of scrimmage on falle attemp a-I'm in hearty concurrence.

#### Keep The Zone

First of all, the comparison of zone defenses in basketball and football, while similar in severa respects, is a poor way to start an argument. It's not that the zone defense smothers pro offense, it's just that pro offensive tactics are too conservative. It fails to innovate. For instance, how long did it take the 'I' formation to work its way into pro ball? And even if Dallas used an I set-up in the first few years of its existence, did they ever run the offense the way it was designed at first? No.

Now, I'm not advocating the use of the Wishbone as the new pro salvation in the face of the sinister zone. But, take the 'Veer T' or any of several other option type offenses that puts pressure at several points (including the quarterback roll-out option) that forces the zone to move up and help out the linebackers and defensive ends. Then, throw the bomb. Of course, it won't always defeat the zone. Nothing ever will. Not since the NFL began using top prospects for defensive teams instead of less-talented as in years past.

#### Defense Is Major

If the other team can't score, half of the game's won. That's why the major influence in pro ball has been on defense. You've got to have the guns to stop all the offensive talent. But saying the zone is the cause is like trying to cut off an arm to heal a finger. It's the wrong kind of medicine. The zone does get beat, but by stealth and daring, not the usual second-and-short, third-and-long type of predictability that prevails in NFL today.

Pro ball should get off its duff. It's not long sport, but entertainment and is produced and directed closely to provide the same. But, in the rush towards the Monday Night Gold, will we be subject to Tuesday Night and Wednesday Night. Great Pumpkin spare us. Just think how many field goals can be kicked if football were every night of the week. Just think how many divorces would result.

#### Penalize The Kicker

The common approach to this situation (the five field goal, 15-6 game) is "something should be done." The field goal specialist doesn't think so. His situation is getting better all the time. And probably, the coaches and the owners don't think so. People pay to see a winning team, so if the zone defense cuts off the bomb and the stagnating offensive attacks of so many teams are inept inside the 20 yard lines (if they ever get there in the first place on other than fumbles. interceptions, kick returns or penalties), the only way they could score would be the field goal.

But just to make it a gamble, put the ball back where it was kicked if it misses the mark. That wouldn't necessarily stop the field goal, but it might make the coaches and the other tacticians of pro football realize they've become too complacent about how they put points on the board and force them into considering new offensive styles.

When Knute Rockney started running downfield for Gus Dorias' passes for Notre Dame (35-13 Irish win) football changed eventually to stop the pass. When all the option offenses were causing defensive coaches bumper crops of ulcers, football eventually found a way to balance defense with its more publicized brother, offense.

With the zone, defense has stolen the initiative from offense and it's about time someone found a way to bring about a balanced situation again.



All of John Pinney's opponents have been carefully screened. Who have they fought? How hard will this fight be? Each man is picked for a certain reason, to get John experience against different types of opponents, but always the thought is "DON'T RUSH HIM."

#### Ayala Undefeated

Roberto Ayala started his career in 1970. He was undefeated when he met and stopped Perez in '71. As of today he is still undefeated and remains one of the hottest prospects in the country. To put a young boy in with Ayala, especially if it's his first fight, is like putting a wounded animal in with a shark, "there ain't no way."

John Pinney has a job, boxing. He is paid to get ready for matches by his manager Lou Viscusi. Anytime that you see Pinney in the ring he will be in shape, because there is no reason why he shouldn't be.

Vic Perez is a draftsman in Sanford. He has a wife and family to support. If he wants to do road work, he has to get up hours before he normally would, so he can run the five or ten miles he needs and still be on the job with the rest of the working world. If he wants to work out in the gym he has to do it after he has his supper. But he also has to get to bed early so he can get up and run the next morning. Anytime you see Vic Perez in the ring, it's doubtful he is really in shape. At least, not the shape he could be in if that was his only job.

#### Wants Boxing 'Job'

Vic Perez wants. He wants to be a "John Pinney." He wants a manager — a manager that can help him financially. He needs money to live on while he trains. He needs the connections that a Lou Viscusi or a Pete Ashlock could give him. Everybody says that Vic has the ability to become a great fighter, but he is frustrated in his attempts to prove it.

This is why Vic Perez challanged John Pinney. Pinney was just voted "Ring Prospect of the Month." This bothers Perez. He feels the parade is passing him by. He could be that prospect if given the chance, but managers are hard to come by when your record is less than .500.

#### Pinney On Paper

On paper Pinney is too big, he outweighs Vic by at least 10 pounds. His record says he is too strong, too fast, to much of everything, but Vic is fighting the biggest fight of his life. When I told Pete Ashlock of the reasons Perez is taking this light, Ashlock responded, "I know how hard it is for this boy to get ready for matches, if he can make a good showing against Pinney, then you can quote me as saying I will be interested in talking to him about his future."

When these two verypopular fighters meet on Nov. 14th, you will see a Victor Perez that is putting his career on one throw of the dice, and if they come up seven "Look Out World, Here Comes Vic."

Taxes Worry

Rich Man By HILARY ABRAMSON Copley News Service

George Power has one major worry in this world - to earn at least \$500,000 again this year. A Northern California lawyer, he is rich by most standards. Astronomically so. But not by his own measure. "I'm not ungrateful, baby. I want to make that clear. But realize this - before I turn the office key, I know I have to make \$2,000 today before I get a

dime out of it." The poor worry about food, shelter and clothing. The middle class, prices. The rich? According to Power, their nemesis is taxes. "I know people will not understand how I could possibly

have a problem," he says, "but if I lose my health tomorrow and can't work, my family will be on welfare." Welfare? Is ne kidding? Power figures it this way. Like a salesman who works on commission, he gets paid only for cases ne wins. And he is taxed twice - once as an in-

dividual, once as a corporation. "I don't know what I'll make next year and this is what keeps a me running," he explains. Last year, he earned about \$400,000 from his job and about \$100,000 from investments. He pays his taxes.

"I've tried tax shelters and I'm just not lucky with them. You run the risk of losing your investment with a shelter plus the residual between the tax on year investment and what you would have net. I pay through the nose with taxes." Last year, Power paid \$70,000 as an individual and \$168,000 as federal governments. About

salary of about \$30,000. And according to his figures, that leaves him about \$16,000 to

Where does it all go?
"I spend about \$3,000 of it. We spend about \$100 a week on receries for the wife and two kids and me. Per year, I have a \$16,000 alimony and child support payment, \$3,700 mortgage payment, and maybe as much as \$12,000 on trips. Traveling is my only hobby." He claims he saves only about

"What's killing is my overhead on the business. Runs over \$55,000 per month. That's right, per month. Catch this - if I didn't have an overhead I'd still net only \$2,400 from a \$100,000

Power figures it this way. If a lient wins a \$100,000 suit, 60 per cent of it is taxed by the federal government: that leaves Power \$4,000 which doesn't last long after 50 per cent of the overhead is chunked out of it.

This tycoon is nearly 50. But

He says he works at least 70 hours a week when a big case is brewing. After it's over, he may relax for a few days, but then "the nightmare begins again. "You pay a great price to be

wealthy," he muses, leaning back in his swivel chair in his opulent office. "I am beginning to feel it isn't worth the personal expenditure.
