Wilcox Bill  
Attacked As  
To LegalityConstitutionality Of  
Act Questioned  
In Suit Filed In  
New Orleans Court

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 26.—(AP)—The constitutionality of the debt readjustment act under which municipalities are permitted to go into federal court and seek a re-financing plan was attacked today in federal district court here in an intervention filed by the state's legal counsel.

The state attorney general argued against the validity of the Fletcher-Wiley bill, which was approved by Congress last May 24.

The petition further was signed by Attorney-General Gaston Porter and his assistant in the Hugie Long administration.

It alleged that the court cannot hear the case because the debt relief program of President Roosevelt and sponsored by the National Conference of Mayors of Cities and Towns is unconstitutional and violates the constitutional interference by the Congress of the United States.

New Orleans was the only town that signed the petition.

The bill was signed by the state's attorney general.

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


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
