



Store manager accosted during theft

CASSELBERRY — An altercation with a store manager and a customer led to an arrest of a Fern Park man Tuesday evening at the Winn Dixle store, 944, SR-436 in Casselberry.

According to Police Lt. Dennis L. Stewart, police responded to a call regarding a fight in progress, shortly after 9:30 p.m.

The store manager, Chad Hardy, 25,

upon hearing an anti-shoplifting device sound, reportedly confronted a man as he was leaving the store. Hardy followed the man to the parking lot and attempted to get the car's license tag number. Stewart said the man became angry

and attacked Mr. Hardy by pushing him and then picking him up and body slam-ming him to the parking lot pavement. The man then attempted to fice the scene in a white Chevrolet.

The Chevy was being driven by a

female companion of the assailant. Hardy suffered potentially serious head injuries as his head struck the hard pavement during the attack and he began having seizures. He was not conscious upon the arrival of law enforcement per-

Volunteers needed to monitor local program at lakes

Florida LakeWatch is looking for Seminole County residents who are ready to roll up their sleeves, get their elbows wet, and make a valuable contribution to the future of Florida

All that is needed is a boat (almost any kind) and a few free hours each month, to be a volunteer lake monitoring vol-

David Watson, Plotida LakeWatch regional coordina-tor for Seminole County described how the program

works. "Florida LakeWatch trains volunteers across the state to collect water and algae samples and water clarity information that can be used to document a lake's nutrient levels," he said. "Over time, baseline data are established, proving citizens useful tool for managing

The lakes and reservoirs in Seminole County are valued for fishing and as wildlife habi-tat, yet very little is known about them. With LakeWatch expanding in Seminole County, lake residents will gain a rare opportunity to gather valuable baseline data for their lake.

Becoming a LakeWatch volunteer is one more way to enjoy your lake and learn more about

them at the same time.

Watson explained that while the operation is underway in all counties of Central Florida, there is a lack of volunteers

specifically in Seminole
County,
"We operate on a grant,"
Watson said, "and in order to
continue receiving the full
amount, we must have adequate representation in

In seturn for participation, persons will receive individual-ized training in monitoring ized training in monitoring procedures, supplies and use of sampling materials, periodic reports of their monthly data (including an annual report concerning their lake), quarterly educational newsletters, access to aquatic science experts at the University of Election and invitations to rese Florida, and invitations to regularly scheduled LakeWatch activities.

"We will come to you at your lake and train you on site,"
Watson said. "Then, once a
month, you will take your samples to our nearest drop-off
place and they will forward
them to us." them to us."

On the 232 acres of the Boggy Creek Gang Camp in the hills of Lake County, kids can be seen riding horses, swimming in the pool, playing basketball, climbing on the ropes course or fishing in the lake.

But this isn't your average summer camp. The children attending Boggy Creek have cancer, HIV, heart disease, hemophilia, epilepsy, spins hillds and other life-threatening or chestic Masses.

Roggy Creek, located in Cassia, was founded by General H. Norman Schwarzkopf and

More than 80 percent, or four out of five, child safety seets are used incorrectly, said Alan Harris, Altamonte Springs Pire Department Public Information

"These are laws requiring a shild must be in a car sent if they are 4 and under," Harris said. "They have to be used right."

Inspectors are looking for several things when examining car safety seets, including whether the device has been recalled. According to Harris, sometimes a car seet is recalled but the consumer isn't aware of it.

Inspectors also make sure a child is not too big or small for a car seat, that the device is placed in a secure, safe area within the car and that it is compatible with the car."

"Last month, a mother came in here with the top-of-the-line car seat," Harris said. "But, it was too big for her car."



"I just want the week to last forever. I don't want to go back," she said. While the kids are at camp

they stay in air conditioned cabins and meet other children with similar conditions. Each week the camp focuses on a different illness.

Communications Manager Ann Mikell said that the camp helps kids because it allows them to meet others with the same illnesses and diseases as themselves. Cancer patients no longer feel out of place when they are surrounded by others with bald heads and heart patients compare scars on their chests, she said.

They come here and do things they've never done before and they leave camp with the knowledge they can do things they could never do before," Mikell said.

"It's nice to see the boldness come out in the kids as they begin to feel more sure of them-

Felicita Rodriguez of Winter Springs said that she noticed a positive change in her 9-year-old son Aaron after he attended the

"It's like he comes alive again," Rodriguez said. "When he comes home he talks about camp all day."

Aaron, who will be a fourth grader at Highland Elementary in the fall, attended camp for his

fourth year in June. He has acute lymphocytic leukemia, which causes abnormal cells to take over his bone marrow and prevents it from producing re blood cells. His illness requires him to take three different medications and he is prone to getting sick at any time.

Rodriguez said that her son is still recuperating from chemotherapy treatment he completed about two months

"It's very hard for him," Rodriguez said. "When he goes to camp, he forgets he's sick."

"I enjoy playing with my friends and doing archery, Aaron said. "It's fun over there." Although Boggy Creek has

The best man who won't be president

Colin Powell's public trust rating is at such an all-time

high that America might as well scrap the presidential election process and coronate the ex-general and chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. If Powell's trust rat-

ing gets any higher, he'll sprout wings. One of the reasons

Gen. Powell is so popular is the very reason Russ he isn't going to be our next president. He prefers action to distraction. He hasn't the time for the game nor its shame.



Yes, for the sake of the Grand Old Party, Powell stirred the ranks on opening night in Philadelphia. He spoke from the heart, saluted the man who would be president and

> rose a few more notches on the ladder of integrity - if that is possible. Of all the statements Powell made on Monday, the most

poignant was that he was more proud of the fact four public schools bear his name. That, he said, was more meaningful to him than his military campaign

and Purple Heart citations.
Powell wants to overhaul school systems that aren't working. He wants to clean up the garbage young people are seeing on television or at the movies. He believes education will reduce crime in America crime that has put 2 million inmates behind bars.

Unless he decides later to be a candidate, Powell will probably go down in history as the best man who was never president. No one in the political arena comes close right now. The second most admired man in America, I believe, is golfer Tiger Woods.

When Colin Powell was

growing up in Harlem, most black Americans were treated as second class citizens. He was 10 when Jackie Robinson broke baseball's color line to play for the Brooklyn Dodgers. He was 20 before America's schools were integrated. He was 30 when Martin Luther King was assassinated. He was 40 when Tiger Woods was born.

At 63, Powell carries the scars and stars of new America — a country which craves for leadership and integrity. On Monday, he challenged the Republican Party to be more diverse and to reach out to the poor. He said that presidential candidate George W. Bush


could "Help bridge our racial divides."

Political insiders expect Bush (if elected) would ask Powell to be his Secretary of State. From the passion in his speech Monday - and the hundreds he has been making the last five years - Powell may prefer the Secretary of Education position.

Whatever course history takes, Colin Powell exemplifies the spirit and valor of a great country. America will go on if he never becomes president but it may go more proudly if he does.





How Bush can lose

George W. needs to stay on right track to win

PHILADELPHIA - George W. Bush arrives here to claim his party's nomination for president with a double-digit lead over Al Gore in the polls and with his party more united than at any time since the glory days of Ronald Reagan. It is his election to lose. Here are some ways he could lose it.

Cal **Thomas**

ONE: Let Al Gore set the agenda. Liberal Democrats have long enjoyed the presumption that they have a divine right to government, and it is only their philosophy, goals and methods that are legitimate. Bush cannot ignore Gore's proposals for improving our lives, but he can offer better ideas while refusing to dwell on Gore's. Bush must not fight on Democratic turf or he will lose. No one can out-promise, out-spend or out-tax better than a liberal Democrat. So, Bush should respond quickly to misrepresentations of his record, but quickly articulate his own proposals and say why they are superior.

TWO: Let the media set the agenda (interchangeable with ONE). Reagan's greatest skill was transcending the media. While Bush does not

have the acting skills of Reagan (Clinton does, but without the substance), Bush presents himself at a time when the public, exhausted by Clinton-Gore shenanigans, wants change. Voters won't tolerate a holier-than-thou campaign because, while cleanliness may be next to godliness, they don't believe most politicians are clean or godly. Bush must find a way to connect directly with the public, answering media queries about his compassion and tolerance by putting the questioner on the spot, for example: "Is it compassionate to sentence an entire generation of African-American children to failed inner-city schools and rob them of their future, or is true compassion to empower parents to choose what is best for their children?"

THREE: Let government set the agenda. Assume that the only thing wrong with government programs is that they don't have enough money. Negotiate with Gore, not over the whether a particular program or government agency ought to exist but with the level of its funding. Instead Bush should detail waste, fraud and abuse (remember those \$700 toilet seats in the Reagan years that Democrats used to great political effect?). Feature daily, or weekly, a new example of how the people's money has been misspent under Clinton-Gore. Continually remind voters whose money it is, and that government holds the money it obtains by the sweat of our brows in trust and has a responsibility to spend it wisely and give back what it does not legitimately

FOUR: Fail to say that we can do better. Bush should rather follow the lead of John F. Kennedy, who mostly declined direct attacks on war-hero Dwight Eisenhower. JFK simply said, "We can do better." Reagan's strength was his constant reminder that real power does not lie in government but within each American. He reminded us that right decisions by individuals are more powerful than wrong decisions made by bureaucrats. Reagan's optimism, which Democrats derided, was nothing more than the collective decisions of millions of us taking

more responsibility (and receiving greater benefits) for our lives, rather than waiting for government to do something for us.

FIVE (a natural follow-up to POUR): Fail to remind the people where real power comes from Democrats are the party of bigger, cost-lier and all-intrusive government. Bush should ask, "Who is better equipped to run and care for your life and your children's lives — you consumment?" Commencent like the covers is not had in its place. or government?" Government, like the oceans, is not bad in its place, but it can drown initiative when it is constantly in your face (and pocket). "Ask not what your country can do for you," Bush might again gets out of the way."

So far, the Bush-Cheney team is doing everything right. Cheney was particularly direct and truthful in response to questions asked of him on the Sunday talk shows, a refreshing change from the rope-a-dope of the Clinton-Gore administration. But it's a long way to the finish line. If Bush-Cheney want to lose, they'll follow ONE to FIVE above.



Liberal media puts spin on Republican convention

The party of George W. Bush and Dick Cheney began its quadrennial convention this week in the City of Brotherly Love. Not since its 1984 convention in Dallas, when Ronald Reagan

was renominated for the presidency, has the GOP been so stoked about its prospects of winning the White House.

But the Republican faithful ought not get too giddy about Philly. For Bush and Cheney can hardly expect a grand coronation. That's because the

4,132 Republican delegates (and alternates) are vastly outnumbered • by members of the media (more than 90 percent of whom are Democratic sympathizers who have every intention

of voting for Al Gore in November). So, much of what the American public reads and hears about the four-day convention comes from the perspective of reporters and correspondents and analysts and commentators who have a built-in political bias against the Grand Old Party.

That bias is reflected in convention "story lines" that cast a less-than-favorable light upon Bush and Cheney; that really border on deliberate misrepresentation of political reality.

Such as:

But the reality is that Bush continues to enjoy the modest lead in the polls that he has had since shortly after the presidential pri-

tial candidate.

Indeed, the latest CBS News/New York Times poll shows the Texas governor leading the vice president by a margin of 46 percent to 40 percent.

But the gap between Bush and Gore is even wider when looking at state-by-state poll numbers, which is a far better indicator of how the presidential race

is shaping up. In the most recent electoral college poll by the Rasmussen polling organization, Bush was ahead in states boasting 310 electoral votes compared to 140 for

What bodes particularly ill for Gore is that he trails his Republican opponent in a halfdozen states - Iowa, Michigan, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania and Washington — that went Democratic the past two presidential elections.

McCain was the media's Republican darling. Not because they really wanted the Arizona senator to become president, but because they thought he could do sufficient damage to Bush to make the Republican front-runner easier pickings for their preferred candidate, Gore.

When Bush prevailed over McCain, the media would not let the rivalry go away, as they did with Gore and Bill Bradley. Instead, they continued to give the vanquished McCain more coverage than any presidential also-ran in recent memory. Now the punditocracy is speculating that McCain will challenge Bush, somehow, at the party's convention, revealing that the party has not truly united behind its presidential nominee.

But McCain has made his peace with Bush and threw his full support behind his party's standard-bearer.

A recent ABC News/Washington Post poll revealed that on the 17 issues the American public rated most important, they supported Bush over Gore by a margin of nine to three (with five a toss up). Yet, in Philly, much of the coverage is focusing on issues which Republicans appear to be vulnerable, including abortion, guncontrol, gay rights and campaign-finance reform.

But the reality is, none of these is really a losing issue for the GOP ticket.

For one thing, none of those selected issues rates among the top 10 in importance to the American people, according to the poll. For another, while a plurality of Americans may part ways with Bush and Cheney on these issues, the Republican ticket also enjoys substantial support for its positions.

On abortion, for instance, 39 percent in a recent CBS News/New York Times poll say it should be available, but under stricter limits. Another 22 percent say it should not be permitted at all. These figures shoot down the myth that the majority of Americans favor abortion-ondemand, with no restrictions whatsoever.

These are the realities of the presidential race that are not mentioned during coverage of the GOP convention. For the very last thing that the Democratic-biased political media want to do is contribute to a Bush-Cheney convention bounce that the Democratic ticket will find impossible to over-



that will consistently and effectively identify cancer in healthy people. Rather, doctors focus their attention on high-risk patients or on adults with a history of fatigue, weight loss and any change in bodily functioning. True, there are blood tests that can indicate the presence of hidden cancers in the reproductive tract and other organs, but these tests are not reliable or sensitive enough to discover small cancers as part of a general screening procedure. One exception to this observation is the PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) blood test for prostate cancer. It is a good screening tool and, despite the fact that most insurance companies (including Medicare) will not reimburse patients for the cost of annual or bi-annual PSA tests, I routinely order them on any male patient over the age of

DEAR DR. GOTT: I suffer from spastic colon. Nothing I do or take in the way of medicine seems to help; I continue to have five bowel movements a day, consisting of small, marblesized feces. Should I pursue this problem?

DEAR READER: The answer depends on how extensively the problem has been investigated to date. Spastic colon (now fermed irritable bowel syndrome) is a diagnosis of exclusion, meaning that other, more serious intestinal disorders must first be ruled out. For example, part of the investigation should include a stool analysis for infection, a sigmoidoscopic examination to check for polyps or inflammation, perhaps a colonoscopy (which is a more involved test), and blood tests

to make sure that you don't have pancreatic or thyroid dis-Calsas

If you have not had these and other tests, you should. It you have had them, you need — in my opinion - a referral to a gastroenterologist who can confirm the diagnosis of irritable. bowel syndrome and offer advice about how best to cope with this nuisance. IBS is a common disorder (associated with bowel frequency, constipation, gas and bloating) that is related to stress in many cases. It is not harmful to health.






