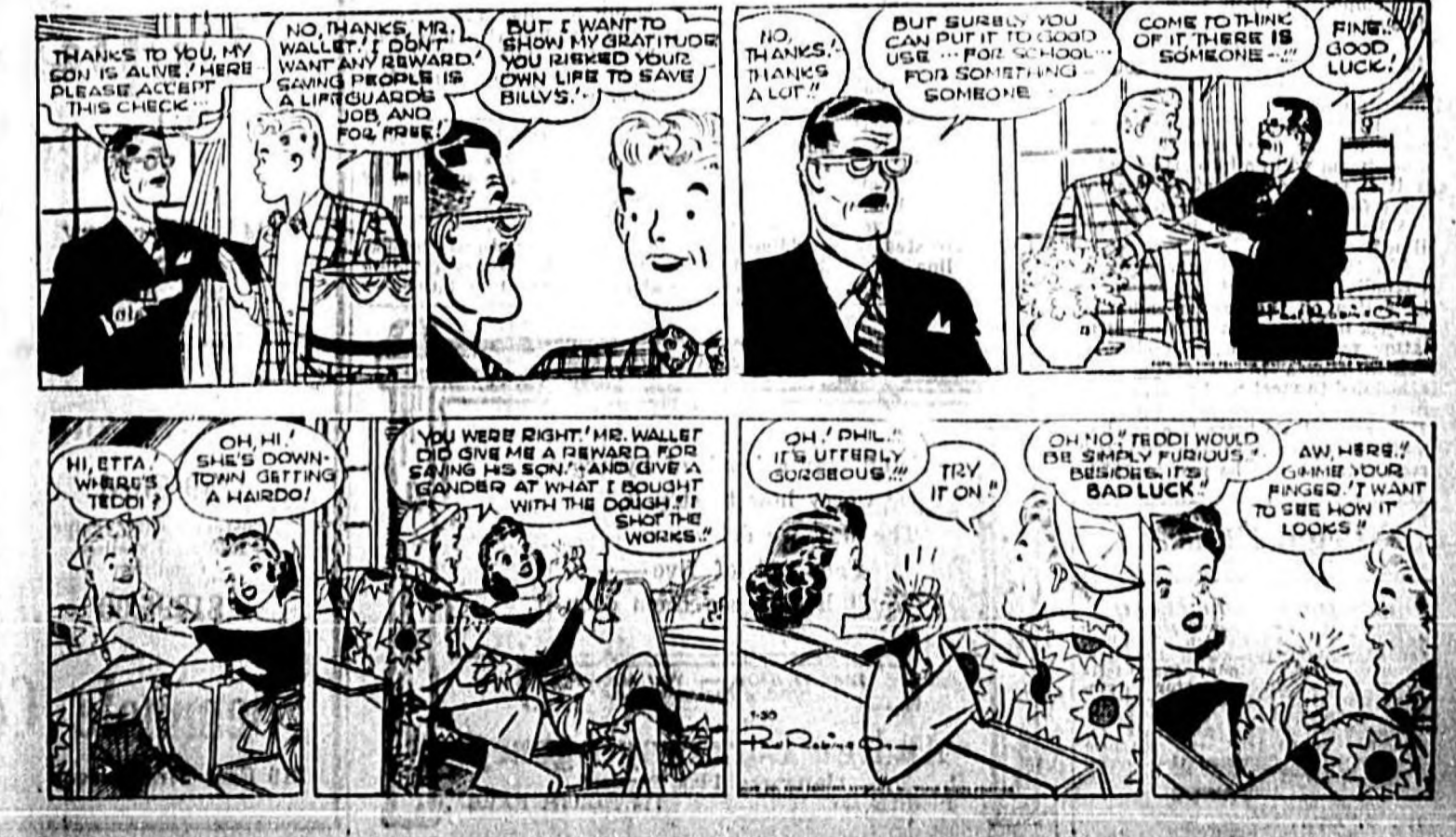

Dr. Garner Builds Charming Home

Boat House And Sunken Garden Are Features Of Beautiful House In Marvania

When Dr. Wade H. Garner wants to take a cruise in his motor cruiser on Lake Monroe or the St. Johns River, he has only a few steps to go from his new home, for the boat is located in a boathouse and snug little harbor right in his own front yard.

The spot where he chose to build his charming new home was just east of Marvania at the east end of the sea wall on Lake Monroe where a fishing camp was formerly located.

Friends tried to dissuade him from building there, he declared, pointing out that the low elevation was sometimes flooded by the rising water of the lake. To overcome this difficulty, Dr. Garner had an eight foot fill made and added a concrete wall two feet above the surface of the fill, and bounding the area on three sides.

Beyond the sea wall to the east is an L shaped channel forming the boat basin. Dr. Garner himself built the concrete walkway leading from the home to the boat house. Immediately back of the home, the ground slopes down to a sunken garden in which sennias are now blooming.

In common with the other new homeowners on Sanford's attractive water front such as Harry Tooke, Dr. W. V. Bitting and Albert Jarrel, Dr. Garner and Mrs. Garner have a modern one story, concrete block house architectural-ly planned to take full advantage of the beautiful outdoor setting and the Florida climate.

The house was designed and built by W. T. Clayton, Orlando builder, who at present is erecting a home of concrete block construction for Mr. and Mrs. M. L. Rahorn, a block west of the Garners at the foot of Virginia Avenue.

The interior of the Garner home shows an attractive blend of soft colors and the early American influence of white southern pine ceilings in natural finish. In the kitchen this includes the material and finish of the cupboards and cabinets.

The wall finish is novel with pastel shades applied directly to the concrete block. In the living and dining room, this is a coral brown shade. In the Garner's master bedroom overlooking the lake, the walls are a cool green, and in a nearby bedroom of their daughter, Rosemary, a light blue.

The 11 by 12 foot living room in the mid-portion of the house commands a beautiful view of the garden in the rear through a large picture window and glass-ja-lousies, and of the lake through another picture window of the adjoining screen porch. In cool weather the living room may be kept warmer by closing the sliding glass doors separating the room and the porch.

The porch was originally screened on the lake side, but due to driving rains, it was found necessary to add the picture window and ventilating ja-lousies. At present, the family, including Ronnie 17, a graduate of Seminole High School, and Wade Jr., home from the University of Alabama, enjoy breakfasts and other meals on this porch which is equipped with a metal table and chairs for this purpose.

In front of the screen porch is a terrace of Tennessee stone commanding a fine view of the lake and the shore line to the east where tall cypresses grow to the

water's edge. The wall of the boys' bedroom occupies the front bedroom occupied by the west. They have their own bath room. The other two bedrooms are on the east side of the house, all with windows affording a view of the lake. This is true also in the kitchen, which has north and south windows, and which may be enjoyed from the car porte on the west side of the house.

The main entrance is from the garden side through a small entry hall partly separated from the living room by the large fireplace of Tennessee stone. The fireplace also separates the living from the dining room. In the chimney above the fireplace in the living room are three recessed book shelves. Recesses in the dining room side provide cupboard space for dishes.

The pink and brown stone is also liberally used to provide planting bins on the south side of the house and within the screen porch. This material, which comes nicely with the white exterior and roof is used for the supports of the car porte.

Two boats are kept in the metal roofed boat house, Dr. Garner's 30 foot Chris Craft cruiser, and a small house boat which is propelled by an outboard motor, and which the boys enjoy.

A. F. Ramsay, florist, designed the garden and shrubbery layout. Dr. Garner finds much relaxation working in his garden.

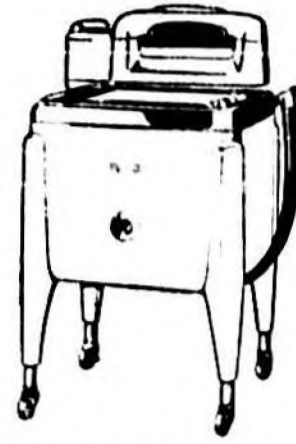

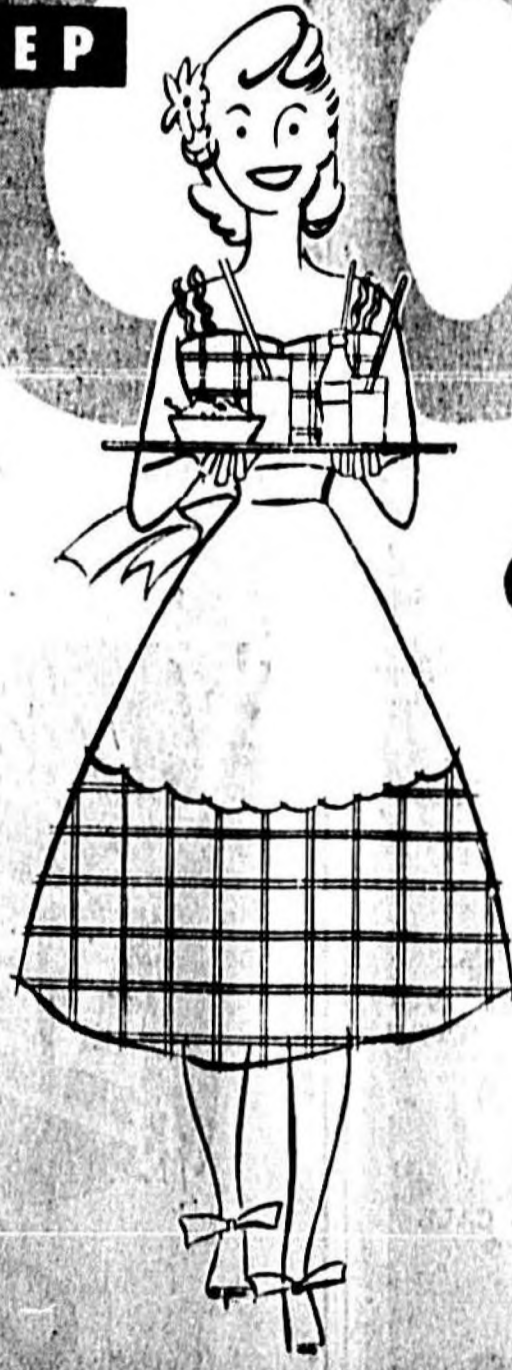

Careful Planning Is Special Need In Child's Room

A child's room must clean, bright, well organized so as to instill orderly habits, and be filled with interest for the child. It also should be planned to grow up with the child, from infancy to teenage.

Before choosing furniture and planning storage and play facilities, most interior designers choose the room's color plan. Even the very young child should be consulted as to his own color preferences, with adult guidance.

Moods of young and old alike are affected by color, and it is especially important that this be given careful consideration in a child's room. Drab, dull colors create a moody disposition; bright treatment of walls, floor and furnishings has an opposite effect. Wall color of canary yellow, hot green or rose can be accented with brilliant splashes of contrasting color in draperies and furniture trim. Woodwork should match the wall color to conceal finger-marks.

For the pre-school child, large sheets of wrapping paper thumb-tacked to the lower walls provide surface for drawing and protect the walls. When the paper is covered with drawing, it can be replaced with clean sheets of paper.

The floor should be part of the color plan, should be of sturdy, stain-resistant material, and, of course, sanitary and easy to clean. The wide range of colors available in floor covering permits easy coordination of floor and wall colors. Two or more of the floor colors can be combined to create floor patterns that will hold the child's interest and mark the room as distinctly his own. Extremely light colors are recommended for carpet floors to provide higher visibility.

Plenty of closet, shelf and cupboard space should be included in the room plan. The child should be taught from the beginning to keep his possessions in an orderly manner. Closet hanger rods should be lowered to be in easy reach, to obviate the excuse of too-high hangers.

A built-in toy chest with cushioned top of bright-colored washable material is a valuable addition. Hinges can be provided to hold the lid in any position when raised. For added safety, place rubber bumpers on the top edge of the chest so that fingers will not be injured by the closing lid.

Small Homes Can Appear Larger By Careful Designing

Although houses have grown steadily smaller, careful design of rooms and facilities makes them appear larger and gives them greater convenience and usefulness.

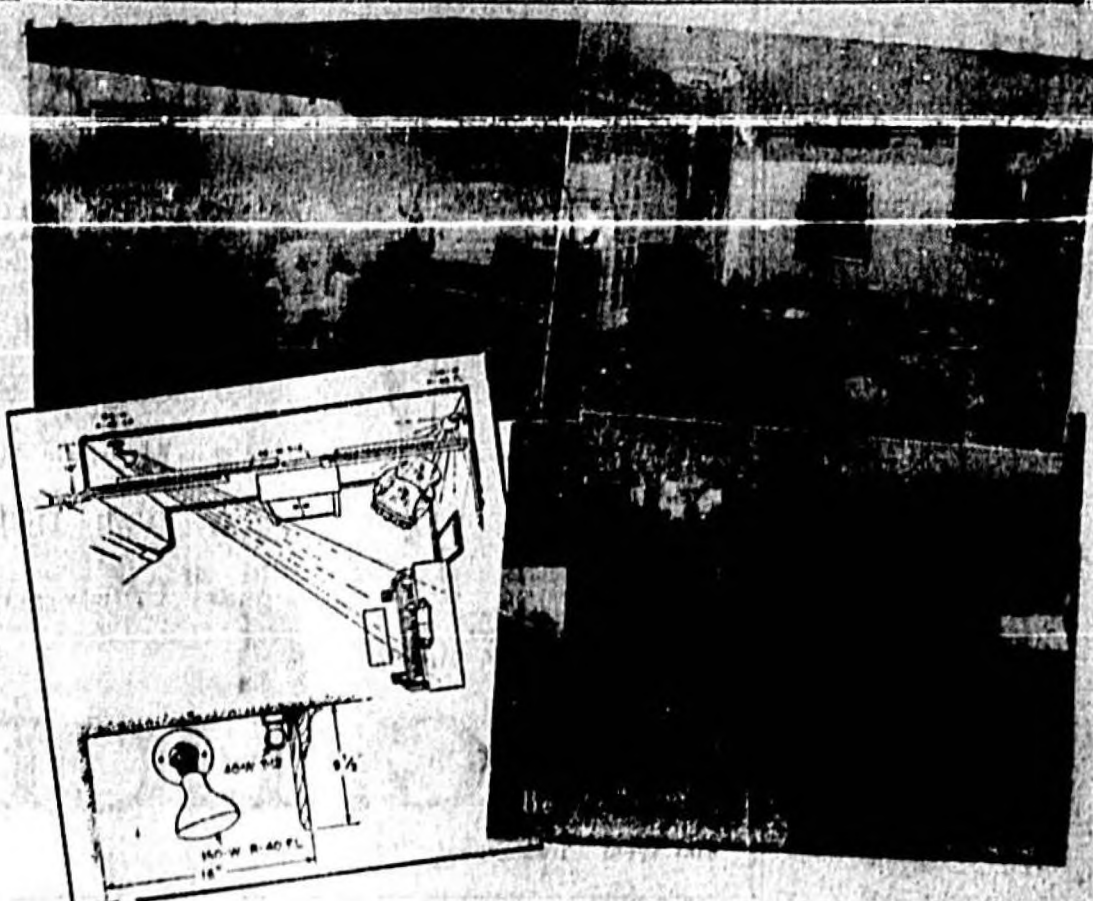
This is accomplished largely by open planning of rooms, eliminating partitions between rooms, as between living and dining room. Bedroom windows are placed shoulder-high to provide abundant wall space. Picture windows help bring the outdoors inside to create an effect of spaciousness. Other windows are placed at irregular intervals, rather than with geometric precision, to create maximum wall area against which furniture can be grouped without sacrificing space.

Furniture are lower, and thinner. Low storage walls are often used as room dividers. These provide valuable storage space and separate areas but do not give the closed-in feeling often engendered in separate cubicles.

Built-in furniture is favored for space-and-money-saving. In bedrooms, built-in substitute for dresser and closet, while built-in beds and desks add more trimness and eliminate the clutter of freestanding furniture which eats up space. Sliding door closets save space.

Special Care Needed to Prevent Warping

Warpage and heat boards in the floor and baseboards are a common problem. As a result, the floor and baseboards are often warped and cracked. This is due to the fact that the wood in the baseboard or the floor is not properly sealed.



Home Owner Is Delighted With New, Daylight Lighting Effect

"It's a shame that people get so accustomed to living practically in the dark, as we did, that they don't realize what they're missing." That was the reaction of the homemaker whose living room is pictured above. After she had lived with her new lighting for a few days, she volunteered that it had also given her home and family the greatest "lift" of any efforts they had ever made to improve their home.

If your home has a "dated" look, perhaps you will want to borrow a few of these ideas for your own home.

While transforming the dark, drab room, shown in the "before" picture above, the family wanted the new lighting to accomplish the following things:

1. They wanted light at davenport for reading that would also show off sentimentally-valued ancestral portrait.
2. They hoped to improve architectural awkwardness of window and bookcase arrangement.
3. They needed to create good lighting for television viewing and light at piano for young son's lessons.
4. Last but not most important, they wanted to eliminate portable lamps with dust-collecting shades because of family allergy to house dust.

Close study of the "after" pictures above will show how each of these things was accomplished in the relighting design of the room.

Notice how the davenport wall gained importance when bookcases were extended to ceiling and small windows removed and opening plastered. The shelf connecting the bookcases has an eight-inch shielding board which conceals four 40-watt fluorescent lamps in two rows.

In addition to abundant light for reading, the new lighting brings out the full splendor of the ancestral painting on the wall above the sofa.

The out-dated ceiling fixture with its glaring bare bulbs was replaced with a modern shallow-shaped semi-indirect one using five 60-watt bulbs. Notice how smoothly the new fixture lights the ceiling.

Eliminating floor and table lamps was an even greater change.

the davenport. On the window side of the room, two 75-watt reflector flood lamps were concealed at each end of the valance which he also made in his home work shop.

On the opposite side of the room a lighted wall-to-wall cornice (two 40-watt fluorescent lamps) and two 150-watt R-40 spot and door lamps concealed at each end to light piano and easy chair. Notice in the drawing above how bulbs (in swirl sockets) are aimed at the music rack and reading chair.

It is any wonder that the family remembers their living room of the past as a dark, dull room.

Man's Room Must Be Masculine And Simply Furnished

Comfort and masculine atmosphere, plain, rugged furnishings and simple decorative ideas are essential in a room that a man can call his own for reading or study, hobby work or play.

To mark the room as masculine and to remove the sleeping-room atmosphere, in case it must do double-duty both as study and bedroom, a bed without head or footboard should be used. By covering it with fabric which matches the draperies, decorative unity is attained.

Furniture should follow simple, straightforward lines. Chairs should be deep and roomy. Use

sectional drawer and cabinet units which can be fitted together in any desired combination to make dresser space, or build in drawers—cabinets with broad top along one wall.

For rugged, masculine atmosphere, cover walls and floor with the wood-grain of nature ranging from light oak to dark walnut.

If it is desired to use color on the walls, a floor of this material will harmonize with any color chosen. If little sunshine penetrates the room, yellow, orange or any of the red tones used as wall color will provide cheer. In a sunny room, blues, grays and greens are restful. For the ceiling, a stronger or lighter shade of the wall color, or a contrasting color, is recommended by interior designers.

A capacious wall magazine rack and a desk with a broad work

surface should be included. A desk may be built-in across one corner, filling it completely. Drawers under one end, open shelves on the other side, will keep papers and frequently-used books in easy reach.

Wall cabinets above the desk, a comfortable, adjustable, swivel desk chair and a lamp should be large enough to reflect light across the desk without glare or shadows.

Plenty of bookshelves should be provided, together with a deep, comfortable lounge chair; generous-sized table to hold ash tray and radio; floor lamp with high-wattage bulbs; and a bedside table with a broad top.

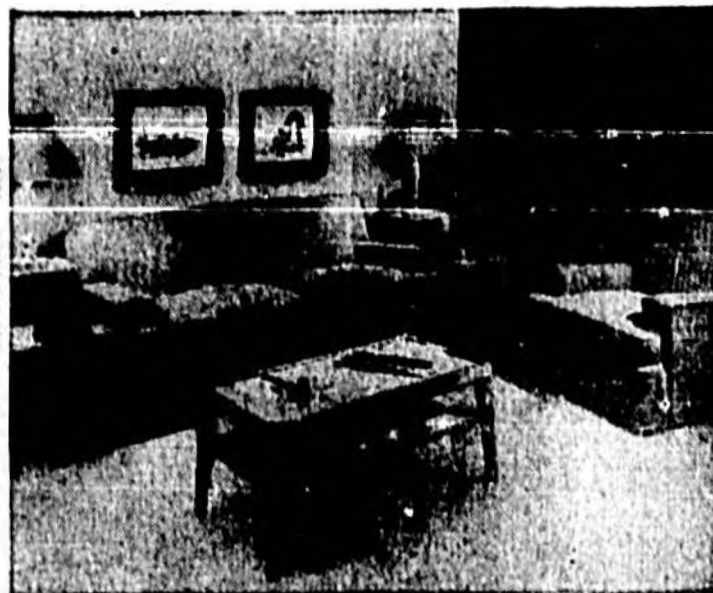
Full Utilization Of Space Is Help In Modern Kitchen

Before modernizing a kitchen, floor and wall space and also of cabinets and other equipment should be accurately measured so as to utilize all available space for work center and storage. Location of work centers should be planned so that work will flow from one center to another without waste motion. A great improvement will be effected in most old kitchens merely by re-location of work centers and using color liberally. Space should be fully utilized for cupboards and floor cabinets. In re-arranging the work centers, space can usually be found for many additional cubic feet of storage.

Studies show these minimum square feet of shelf space for each adult in the family: base or floor cabinets, not including range and refrigerator, 3 lineal feet for each adult. Additional space can be found on walls above refrigerator, range, sink and other equipment. A harmonious color plan for walls, floor and cabinets should be chosen. Since all-white kitchens are now obsolete, colorful grease-proof floors are recommended by interior designers, together with brightly-hued harmonizing walls, cupboards and cabinet tops. A black cove base of the material at the juncture of walls and floor helps add a contrasting note of color. The cove base is curved, making it easy to clean in corners.

A variation in heights of work surfaces makes a more comfortable kitchen. The average woman finds a 32" height for the mixing surface is most comfortable, with a 36" height for the range, and the bottom of the sink 32" above the floor. This means that sink drainboards and side counters, at least 2" x 36" in size, will be about 38" in height. Some home makers may object to these height variations for a continuous work surface along one or two walls of the kitchen, but the comfort attained deserves consideration. No shelf in the kitchen should be higher than 72" above the floor.

Each division of appliances, cabinets and work surfaces is called a "work center." These range center and mixing center, normally are the sink center, greatest convenience results when the sink is located between range and fixing center. The mixing center, which includes the refrigerator, should be near the service door. The refrigerator door should open away from the mixing counter. Besides being near the sink and mixing centers, the range also should be convenient to the dining area.



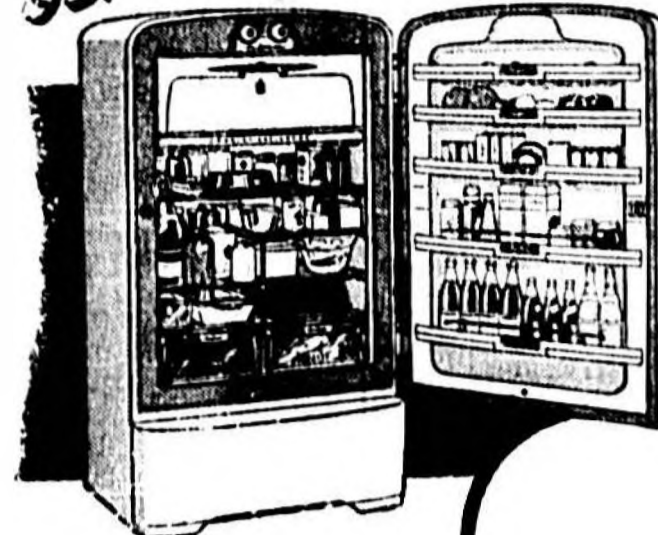

Keeping Hot Air Out Of House Is Summer Necessity

The summer cottage should have all the comfort and character of the year-around residence, yet draft walls, splintered floors, poor lighting, and lack of convenient storage and other facilities are common ills. A few days spent curing them now will be well worth while.

Since the purpose of a summer home is to permit a vacation, restwork and formal living, should be easy to clean and maintain, and innovations should be to the beauty, comfort and convenience of the cottage.

A new coat of paint inside and out will improve the appearance of the house and protect its surfaces from rot. Light colors make rooms appear larger and cooler. Choose a gloss paint for the interior that can be quickly cleaned with a damp cloth.

Good illumination is a requisite for the rainy days and evenings when outdoor activity halts. Fixtures recessed into the ceiling clean-lined modern reading lamps which do not require shades are another work-saver.

Covering existing floor with smart, colorful flooring will vastly improve the appearance of the interior, and because this material does not show wear and is cleaned with minimum effort, it affords a vacation from floor care. The asphalt tile can be walked on immediately after installing, with no interruption of the daily routine.

Shelves, cupboards and other built-ins are inexpensive conveniences and work-savers. Particularly handy is a wall cabinet, 50" wide and 42" high, with shelves concealed by a drop-leaf front which makes a table. The bottom of the cabinet should be 60" above the floor, so that the front when open is standard table height.

A vacation cottage living-room is often forced to do double-duty as a sleeping quarters. Studio couches placed along adjoining walls at right angles afford comfortable day-time lounging space and night-time sleeping facilities. A square built-in cabinet in the corner of the room, with its top about 15" above the couches, uses otherwise waste space and provides storage room. The interior is reached by doors in the two sides above the studio couches.

A chimney in a wall usually affords space where built-in storage shelves or cabinet can be used to good advantage.

Metal Venetian blinds or smooth-finished bamboo shades admit air, afford privacy and clean easily. Plastic draperies, available in a wide variety of designs, are cleaned simply by wiping with a damp cloth.

HOME OF DR. SMITH



Dr. And Mrs. Smith Have Garden Enclosed Home On 21st Street

When Dr. and Mrs. J. A. Smith found with advancing years that a two story home, and the necessary walking up and downstairs, was not beneficial to their health, they decided to do something about it and build a modest one story house more suited to their needs.

At the time they made this decision, they were living in the attractive two story house formerly occupied by S. H. Dighton at 112 West Twentieth Street. Only a block south on Oak Avenue was a well shaded lot at Twenty-first Street with a frontage of 100 feet and a depth of 146, and as it seemed ideal for the purpose, the Smith purchased it for their home.

They secured the aid of J. T. Pope, builder, and the result was a one story dwelling of concrete block construction which fits in artistically with its well landscaped setting of lawn and garden, well shaded by tall trees. Dr. and Mrs. Smith moved into their new home last March. They came here from Charleston, W. Va. in 1943. With them lives a cousin, Miss Bettle Smith, who serves as an assistant to Dr. Smith in his office in the Bramley-Paleston Building.

A son, Dr. J. S. Smith, is also a physician and practices at New Smyrna Beach. Another son, William P. Smith, maintains the Mercury Outboard Motors Co. on the Orlando Highway.

The white exterior wall finish and white asbestos tile roof of the Smith home reflects a crisp heat and forms an attractive contrast

to the lush green surroundings. Typically modern is the slump brick flower bin outside of the triple window of the living room. From the entrance way the living and dining room appear much larger than they seem when viewing the house from the outside.

The living room measures 15 by 22 feet and adjoining the dining room which is 10 by 19 feet in size. Back of the dining room is a screened porch which is seen from the living and dining room area through glass jalousies. This, and the triple window in the living room result in ample lighting for the two rooms.

Two bedrooms and a bath are reached from the south side of the living room through a small hallway.

The front bedroom, reserved for guests, is 12 by 14 feet in size, and the high posted bed is of the early American type. The rear bedroom, occupied by the Smiths, measures 14 by 15 feet. A door to the right of the brick fireplace on the north side of the living room leads to another bedroom, which has a bathroom adjoining.

Walls throughout the interior are of cream yellow, sand texture finish. The living and dining room area has sage green carpeting which harmonizes with furniture covers in shades of green and rust. On one side of the fireplace are built in book shelves. A grand piano lends dignity to the room.

When Dr. and Mrs. Smith came here from Charleston they brought with them dining room furniture of early American type and of Cushman maple, hand finished and stain resistant. The dining table is of "saw horse type". Chairs have a solid appearance. The tall buffet is of the same material, and is flanked on either side by "tidle backed" scones" supporting

Modernistic Furniture Design Dominates Merchandise Markets

CHICAGO, July 30. —(AP)— Modernistic furniture again dominates the summer international home furnishings show at the merchandise and American furniture marts in Chicago.

Market experts said two out of three furniture pieces exhibited at the show are modern compared with three out of five at the January showing.

The show attracted buyers from 48 states and several foreign countries. Traders described buying as moderate to dull. Furniture and home furnishings bought at this semi-annual show will reach dealer showrooms by fall. The show is not open to the public.

Manufacturers appeared to be shooting for sales among young married couples and families who live in today's small apartments and modern homes. At the same time good taste is emphasized. "We're aiming for people with limited budgets but unlimited good taste," said one manufacturer summing up his company's future plans.

Many companies are plugging their merchandise as aimed at budget prices. Furniture has deeper tints as natural and wood grains take on warmer hues of dusty plum to candle type electric lamps.

The adjoining 9 by 15 foot kitchen has a cheery, colorful appearance with its red linoleum floor, and its breakfast nook with a maple bench and chairs. Keeping Heat Out Is Secret Of Being Cool In Summer

The secret of maintaining a cool home is to keep hot air outside and to generate as little heat as possible inside the house. This will mean cool comfortable nights and greater daytime comfort.

- Here are some of the rules:
1. Keep windows closed when hot winds are blowing.
 2. Draw the shades on the sunny side of the house.
 3. Replace heavy draperies with materials having a large open-weave.
 4. Use light-colored linen or cretonne slip-covers on upholstered furniture.
 5. Use light colors for walls and floors, including smooth, cool flooring.
 6. Ventilate the attic throughout the day and night, either with an exhaust fan or by opening windows in opposite gables.
 7. Open all doors and windows as soon as the sun sets and place two or three electric fans in windows in various rooms, blowing inward, to draw in cool night air quickly.
 8. Replace high wattage electric bulbs with lamps of less intensity and use electric lights sparingly.
 9. Avoid top-of-stove cooking as much as possible and use the insulated oven for preparing hot meals.
 10. Keep the kitchen-dining-room door closed while cooking, and open kitchen windows wide, to expel heat rapidly.

Rise In Property Values Caused By New Restrictions

Higher down payments required on new home purchase contracts, shorter periods for mortgage financing and other government controls designed to curb residential construction, plus general inflationary pressures, have been causing a sharp increase in realty values.

Many home owners today are finding it more profitable and more economical to modernize their homes than to buy new homes. Others are buying older houses with the intention of remodeling.

Before buying an old house, the foundation, roof and framing should be checked carefully to make sure the structure is basically sound and can be remodelled economically.

Cracks in plaster walls generally indicate that the foundation is settled. Almost any building will settle to some extent, and hairline cracks are not serious; however, new cracks in an old house probably indicate the build-

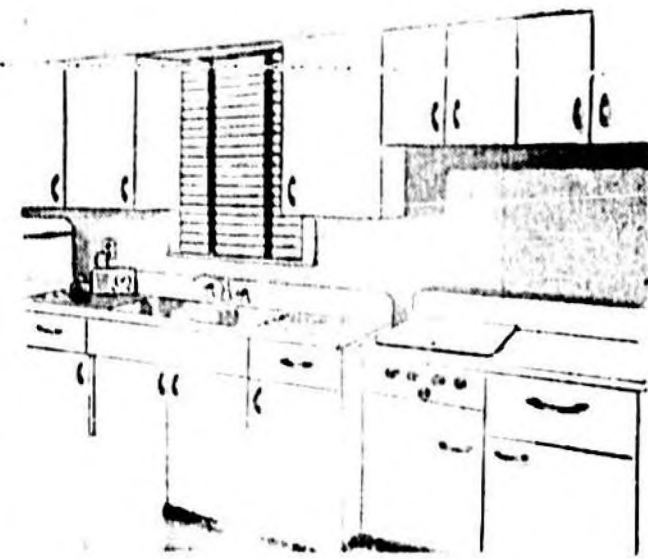

Money Goes Into Recreation Rather Than New Housing

More money for clothes, doctor bills, insurance, recreation, television and less for housing. That's the way the average wage earner spent his money in 1959, as compared with the 1935-1939 period.

In announcing the figures, the National Association of Home Builders pointed out that consumers now spend only 11c of each budget dollar for shelter, whereas in 1935-1939 the figure was 18c.

There is a moral for the nation's builders in these figures, says the NAHB: Many families could have much better housing than they now do if they spent anything like the same proportion for shelter today as they did a decade ago; also, the figures show there are additional sources to be tapped for better housing.

as home builders compete aggressively with television manufacturers.

Statistics from the Bureau of Labor Statistics reveal that the relative outgo for food in 1959 (35c), was about the same as in 1935-1939 (34c).

Expenditures for clothing were up about 20 percent and house furnishings about 40 percent—a clear indication of an improved living standard.

Even more notable evidence of this kind is the similar increase in the "miscellaneous" expenditures, which includes recreation, radio-television and nonessential expenditures.

At the same time, relative outlays for fuel and shelter were both down more than one-third from 1935-1939 base.

This difference, noted the NAHB, is partly due to the persistence of rent control in many key areas, but more probably results from increased income and changing spending patterns which diverted the increase in other directions.

Keystone Of Home Building Advice Is Carefulness

27,600 persons were killed in accidents around the home in the United States last year and millions were painfully injured. While we are now in the midst of the painting season, with amateurs scrambling up and down ladders, it's timely to look into some of the dangers that lurk in innocent dabbling.

You'd never think there were hazards in painting lawn furniture, newspapers on the garage floor, would you. You spread some stir the paint and start to work. But look out! Any paint splatters or paint that spills can floor you faster than a banana peel when you inadvertently step on them. You'll find that wiping up paint as you go along will not only prevent accidents, but will make your cleanup job easier afterwards.

And put out that cigarette. Some paints, lacquers and quick-drying enamels give off vapors which are highly inflammable. When such vapors are mixed with air in proper proportions, they will explode

from a static spark, a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette.

Ventilation is a must while you are painting indoors. Many persons are allergic to the odor and fumes of paint, and all other persons can be affected by over-exposure.

Men who know paint never underestimate the importance of ventilation. Douglas C. Arnold, president of the Keystone Paint and Varnish Corp., developers of the new odorless paints, says that being unable to smell paint is no excuse for not ventilating while painting. The big advantage of odorless paint is the absence of paint smells in the newly decorated room. But the evaporation rate

and flash point inflammability of odorless paint are no more nor less than those of comparable ordinary paints.

Ventilation is stressed because of the hazard of poison. The National Bureau of Standards lists thinners and solvents, such as turpentine, naphtha, benzol and the amyl and ethyl acetates as toxic in varying degrees.

Then there is the danger of poison through the skin or mouth. Pigments containing lead, mercury and chromates are among the most dangerous. Their poisons can be absorbed when left in contact with the skin for a length of time. After painting, clean your hands thoroughly not only with the pro-

per solvents but also with plenty of water and soap before eating or handling cigarettes.

It's a good idea to prevent babies from chewing paint off toys, cribs, etc., unless you know that the ingredients of the paints are non-toxic.

And guard your eyes when painting. Methyl alcohol (methanol) can paralyze the optic nerve, causing temporary or even permanent blindness. When painting a ceiling be careful not to let any kind of paint fall in your eyes.

Wear a cap with a visor and put a shield on your brush to keep paint from dripping down the handle. Sometimes a painter will slit a sponge and pass it up the

handle or part of a rubber ball is slit and pressed on, cup side up.

Ceiling jobs are risky in general. If you attempt to patch the plaster get a helper to support loose parts while you remove pieces carefully to avoid an avalanche of falling plaster.

Use only a sturdy step ladder for reaching high places. To pile up chairs, tables and boxes to climb upon is an invitation to that haggard ghost with a scythe.

Whenever you place a can of paint on top of a ladder, or on its drop shelf, be sure it sits securely. If you move the ladder, take the paint can off first. Never attempt to move a ladder with a

can of paint on it.

Don't try to save time by reaching far out from the ladder. Get down and move the ladder. That's the way to save time in a hospital.

When you have finished painting, your job is not done. Pick up every piece of equipment, clean it and store it safely. Don't leave tools around for someone to trip over and be careful of sharp tools when children are around.

Dispose of all inflammable rags and oily rags to put them away for future use risks spontaneous combustion.

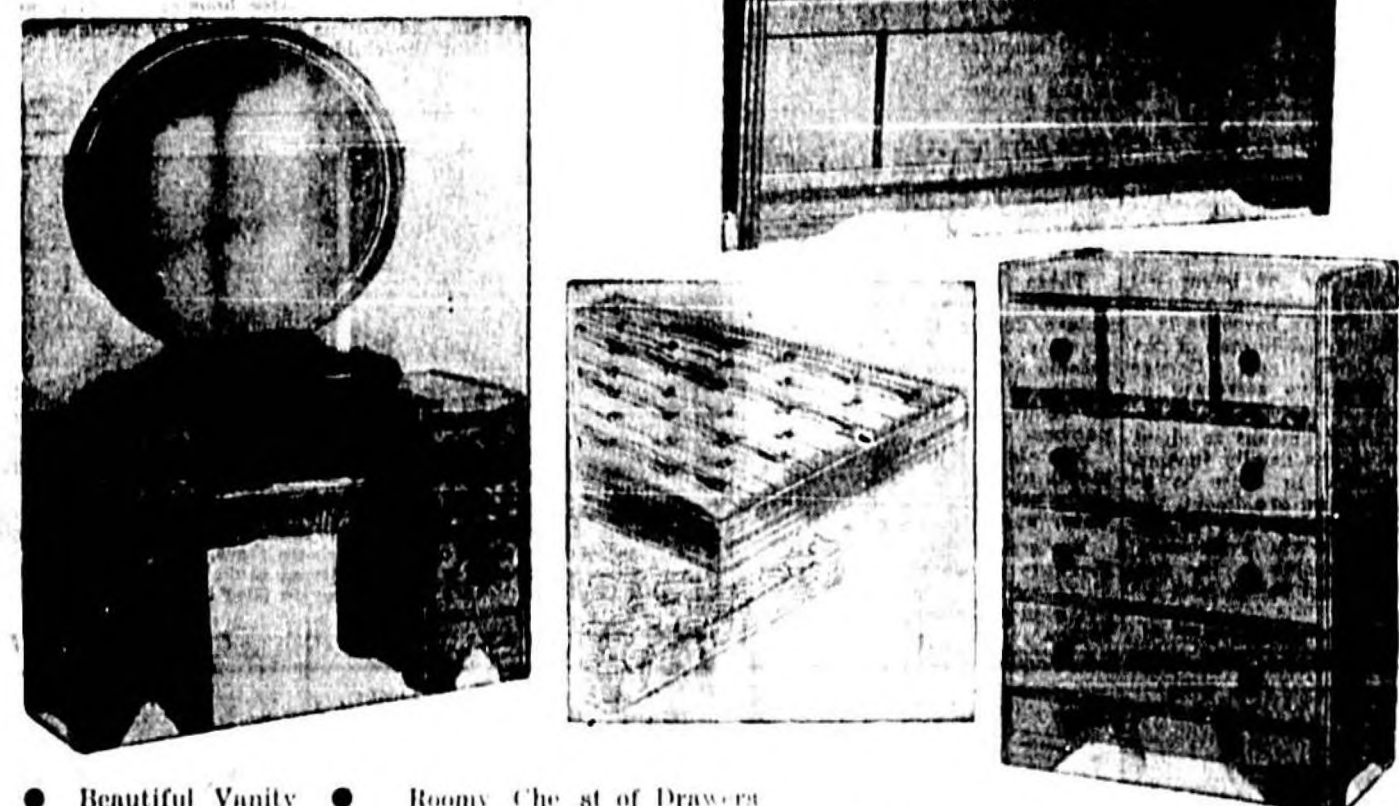

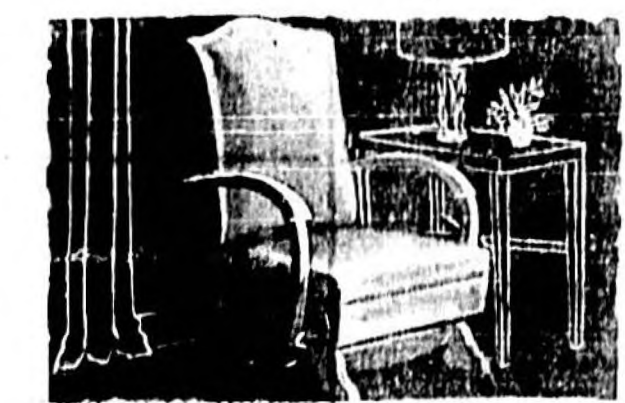

Challenge Of Sub-Standard Housing Is Met

Sanford's Low Rental Housing Is Result Of Meeting Held Jan. 26 '50

Castle Brewer, Clark And Higgins Projects Solve Acute Housing Shortage

Three low rental housing projects representing a total outlay of more than \$2,000,000 designed to house more than 1,000 persons provide the answer by the Sanford Housing Authority to the challenge of sub-standard housing revealed here, especially in Negro sections, by a survey made early in 1950.

These are Castle Brewer Court, comprising 56 modern, attractive concrete block buildings with 125 apartment units and costing more than \$1,300,000, a project for Negro tenants due to be completed during October, and two projects just started, William Clark Court, an 85 unit project for Negroes immediately west of Castle Brewer Court, and Edward Higgins Terrace, a 40 unit project for white tenants located at Fern Avenue and West Third Street.

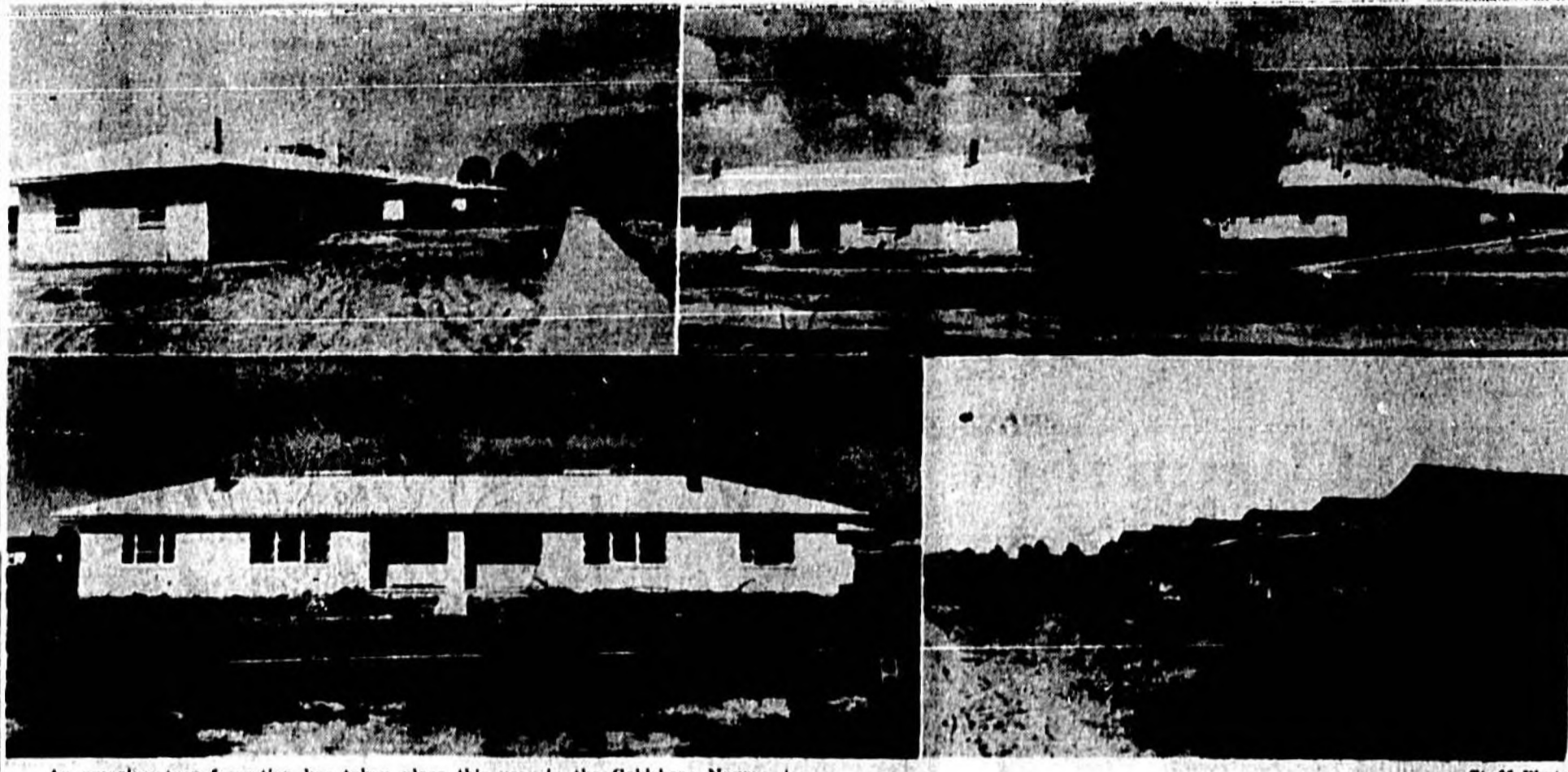
Castle Brewer Court is located in the Goldsboro section, the major portion of it being in eight blocks bounded by Olive and Murray Avenues, Eighth and Tenth Streets. In this area are 50 one-story duplex apartment buildings placed in courts. These include 22 buildings with two bed room units, 8 with three bed rooms per unit and six with four bed room apartments.

In a block immediately west of this and bounded by Jasmine, Cleander, Tenth and Eleventh Streets are four "sextuple" buildings, each containing six apartments of the one bedroom type. Other buildings in the project include a caretaker's building and a maintenance building which will contain a recreation hall. Ample space has been provided in the area for a playground for children, and this will be an attraction of the other two projects as well.

Designed by Elton J. Moughton, Sanford architect, the buildings of concrete block have been made as roomy, attractive and fireproof as possible. All materials have been furnished to strict specifications, including concrete floors, cement tile roofing and stucco exterior surfaces. The buildings, said Mr. Williams, have been designed with the view of minimum cost of upkeep.

An average apartment has a living room about 12 by 16 feet in size, several bed rooms, 11 by 12 feet, a kitchen 11 by 11 feet in size and a 7 by 7 foot storage room

CASTLE BREWER COURT NEARING COMPLETION



An amazing transformation has taken place this year in the Goldsboro Negro section of Sanford where the City's first low rent, public housing project, Castle Brewer Court, is nearing completion. The pictures above and at left show the modern, concrete block, duplex type of buildings which have replaced small shanties such as those at lower right which are across the street from the project. Costing about \$1,300,000 and with 66 buildings containing 125 apartment units, the project

will take care of about 500 persons now in need of better housing accommodations. The buildings are grouped in court style, and will be surrounded by lawns and landscaping. Playgrounds will be included for the children.

which houses the fuel oil heater. Bath rooms are of ample size including built in tubs and modern fixtures. Bedrooms have plenty of closet space.

Kitchens include modern electrical appliances including refrigerators and ranges. Sink and cabinet fixtures are provided also. Bradford Builders of Miami are contractors for the project. Richard A. Belsham has charge of the mechanical and electrical engineering. Fred H. Williams directed the civil engineering operations. H. Doyler Marx and Associates have charge of the grading and landscaping.

Ralph T. Cowan, chairman of the board of directors of the Sanford Housing Authority, has devoted much time to the planning and building of the project. The au-

thority includes Harry Lee, vice chairman, The Rev. J. F. McKinley, J. R. Hall, George Williams, Jr., and Elton J. Moughton, Vice Williams, Jr. is attorney for the SHA.

Rentals, instead of being set according to the size or type of apartment, will be based instead on the total annual income of the occupying family, said George Williams, executive secretary of the Sanford Housing Authority.

This rent will amount to about 20 percent of the family income, he pointed out. In order to be eligible to rent an apartment, the tenant may not have an income higher than certain maximums, determined according to the size of the family and the number of children.

Although these standards of income have not yet been set, it has been suggested that \$2,000.00 will be the top for a family of two; \$2,500.00 for families of three, and \$2,800.00 for families of five or more.

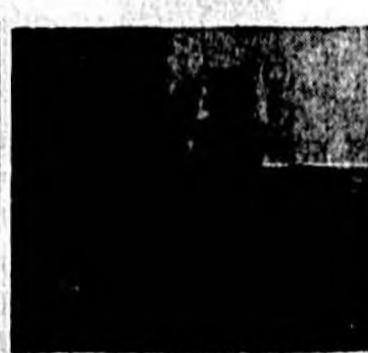
These figures refer only to admittance. Since incomes may increase during the period of occupancy, another set of maximum income standards will be set. For continued occupancy, this would be about \$2,500 a year for two persons.

Rentals may be as low as \$18 a month and up to \$42, and will include utilities such as electricity, water and fuel oil.

Preference for rentals will be given to veterans, especially disabled veterans, and to people now living in sub-standard quarters or homes.

The history of Sanford's three new low rental housing projects, Castle Brewer Court, William Clark Court, and Edward Higgins Terrace, goes back to Jan. 26, 1950, when officers of the Sanford Housing Authority, headed by the late Edward Higgins, conferred here with Public Housing Administration officials in regard to the need and extent of new low cost housing in Sanford.

They met with George W. Simons, PHA planning consultant from Jacksonville, and a group from Atlanta, Ga., including Walter E. Conklin and Roger Sullivan of the Project Planning Section, Maury R. Moore of the Lands Section.

In addition to Mr. Higgins, who at that time was manager of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce and chairman of the board of directors of the SHA, local officials of that group present included George H. Williams, executive director; Fred Williams, engineer; Ralph T. Cowan, who is now chairman of the board, and Elton J. Moughton, architect.

The survey was approved, and it was estimated that it would cost about \$3,000 and take in about 1,500 to 2,000 homes in order to determine the standard of housing for people in the lower income brackets in Sanford.

On Feb. 2, 1950, the crew picked for the survey met with Mr. Simons, to plan the work in order to prepare a report for the PHA. Fred H. Williams was field supervisor of the crew which included Hugh Duncan, T. V. Crawford, Earl Bourquardes, Charles Hobson, Oswald Roberts, Robert von Herbulis, Ralph Lassing and Joe Davis.

The survey of the Sanford area was the first to be made in the entire South under the vast low-rent public housing program then getting started under the Federal Housing Act of 1949. Detailed forms were filled out in regard to both dwellings and tenants.

On Apr. 3, the survey disclosed that of the 2,279 dwelling units occupied by Negro families, 2,100 were of sub-standard classification. Of 306 homes of white tenants surveyed, 259 were sub-standard.

Of the dwelling surveyed, the report showed that 1,140 were considered to be in dilapidated condition. More than two-thirds of these homes had inadequate sanitary facilities.

On the day following the report, the City Commission reached an agreement with the SHA providing for City improvements in connection with the proposed housing project in Goldsboro. These included sewer connections and paving, part of the expense of which was to be defrayed by the Housing Authority.

would not assess taxes against the project, but it was provided that in lieu of taxes, 10 per cent of the shelter rentals would be paid to the City and County. Shelter rent does not include amounts set for utilities.

On July 7 it was reported that the Housing Authority had voted to name the 125 unit project in Goldsboro, Castle Brewer Courts, after the Rev. Castle Brewer, who died 18 years prior and who had been pastor of the St. Paul Baptist Church. He officiated in Sanford for many years, and spent a good portion of his time in the advancement of his race.

At the time of the vote, Mr. Moughton was completing plans for the project to submit to the Atlanta field office of the Federal Housing Administration for approval.

On Aug. 10, the Sanford Housing Authority met at the office of George Williams and adopted a development program for Castle Brewer Court, which it was then estimated would cost more than \$1,425,000.

Five days later the City Commission granted the Housing Authority an option of 60 days duration on two pieces of property in Goldsboro for the project. On Sept. 25, a temporary loan of \$137,000 was made the Public Housing Administration on the project. Up to June 30 of this year PHA loans have totalled \$1,119,713, according to George Williams, were sent late in September to the PHA by Mr. Moughton, Bradford Builders, Inc., of Miami, started construction operations about Dec. 10.
