



# 'Quiet Pro' Holds Up Bank, Slips Into Crowd In Mall

"He did nothing dramatic. He didn't say much." That's the picture which emerged today as police began piecing together the details of a robbery at the Sun Bank of Seminole is the Altamonte Mail, according to Sgt. Jim Perry of the Altamonte

The man, described as about six-feet, three-inches tall, athletically built with blond hair and wearing a leather jacket, entered the bank on the top floor of the mall at 2 p.m. and asked a teller for change of a \$100 bill.

According to FBI agent George Watt, he never showed the teller the \$100, instead he pointed a small caliber revolver at her and demanded \$20s and \$100s.

The teller complied and simultaneously a second bank employee touched off the silent alarm, Perry said. There were two

customers and five employees in the bank at the time. The man took the money from the teller, then moved to adjacent teller's window where he reached over the counter an grabbed a handful of bills from the cash drawer stuffing them in a

leather-like briefcase, authorities said. He ran outside the mall, along the mall's sidewalk, until


Authorities have been unable to trace his trail once he went inside the department store, FBI agents said. "We're very fortunate no one was hurt," Faye C. Agoes, chairman of the board of Sun Bank, said after arriving at the obbery scene Monday afternoon.


"We haven't determined how much was lost, we're still in th process of doing the accounting." FBI agents were still processing film from the bank's cameras this morning, but were doubtful they would come up with anything useful. "The film could have run out before then," Watt

He also said the FBI believes there is a "possibility" the same man could have been responsible for three other area bank robberies since November

However, in two of the three robberies the bank's camera failed to produce any visual evidence. "The only pictures we have are from the Dade Federal Saving and Loan robbery," Watt said. That banking institution, at 103

### IN BRIEF Osteopath Gets 3 Years For Phony Accident Claims

FLORIDA

MIAMI (UPI) - A prominent Miami osteopath drew a three year prison term Monday from a federal judge who castigated him for filing fake accident insurance claims. Dr. Mortimer Schaffer was convicted Dec. 27 of 54 counts of mail fraud stemming from the insurance claims.

U.S. District Judge Sidney Aronovitz spurned mercy pleas and said he was making the sentence stiff as a deterrent to other professional people who might be tempted.

The judge also criticized the insurance companies for paying the claims without investigating their validity.

### Supreme Court Appointment

FORT MYERS (UPI) - Gov. Reubin Askew will appoint a successor to Supreme Court Justice Fred Karl next week from the Judicial Nominating Commission's list of Supreme Court candidates.

"Under the Constitution we must send three names, we cannot send less, we cannot send more," said attorney Julian D. Clarkson, chairman of the nominating commission.

### **Bundy Trial Set For May 9**

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - Theodore R. Bundy, wanted for questioning about rapeslayings in five states and the disappearance of a Lake City child, will be tried May 9 in Tallahassee on charges of auto theft and

Prosecutors said the trial may be expanded to include 34 new charges, filed Monday, of forging the name on a stolen credit card and using it to purchase nearly \$300 in purchases. He could get up to 240 years in prison if convicted.

That works out to an expenditure of nearly \$212 per voter, which state authorities unerstandably consider a trifle exerbitant. Hawaii didn't undertake its minerity anguage voter assistance program on a whim. The state and its counties were making a conscientious attempt to comply with the federal Voting Rights Act.

That law, often called the most effective civil rights act ever adopted, was amended in 1975 to require voting assistance to language minorities in addition to blacks. Overnight, the law's overage - initially limited primarily to the Deep South - was extended to all or part of 30

A newly published study by the General accounting Office, the watchdog arm of Congress, uncovered widespread problems with the minority language provisions during their first trial in the 1976 elections.

FORT LAUDERDALE (UPI) - One of the things Billy Martin always does before the start of each new season is have a private little talk with his troops and he hasn't done that yet because he's waiting.
