Defense Alliance Powers Meet To Discuss Queries Submitted By Minister Lange

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8. (AP) A meeting of ambassadors of countries negotiating a North Atlantic Defense Alliance was called today in the midst of American discussions with Norway about the proposed pact.

The State Department announced a meeting with the North Atlantic powers, Canada, Britain, France, Belgium, The Netherlands, and Luxembourg, would be held in the afternoon.

Nothing was said as to the purpose, but it was believed Secretary of State Acheson wanted to discuss the questions submitted by Norwegian Foreign Minister Helmer M. Lange at a conference yesterday.

Lange is here for discussion designed to determine an effect the proposed admission for Norway into the North Atlantic Defense Alliance.

Brussels has been a center of activity in Norway and the defense alliance.

The Norwegian government delegation, which included the State Department, was questioned about what protection Norway could expect while considering and negotiating membership in the Alliance.

The meeting of the ambassadors of the Western nations, the first since Acheson became Secretary of State last month.

The last previous meeting was Jan. 11 when former Under Secretary of State Robert A. Taft was handling the negotiations.

Diplomatic affairs and Lange submitted some documents and numerous questions at yesterday's initial session with Acheson and his top aides. State Department officials said however, the Foreign Office did not submit their questions at yesterday's session.

Among other things, Lange was reported to have queried the department about the conditions of any pact which the American government would have with America's entry in a Scandinavian defense alliance made in connection on Page Six.

The court also ordered Mindszenty to pay a fine of 100,000 Hungarian crowns. He is also ordered to pay the costs of the trial.

Mindszenty is a Catholic priest and a member of the Hungarian People's Party. He was prime minister of Hungary from 1946 to 1949. He was arrested in 1949 and sentenced to a life term in prison.

The court also ordered the United States to expel Mindszenty from its territory. The court said that Mindszenty's activities in America were a threat to the security of Hungary.
