Employed, tramping miles for days at a time, unable to find work for there was none, without government assistance or the help of charitable organizations, he had finally stolen in order that his family might not starve, and for this he was shackled and manacled in the galley of a ship where he was forced to row long hours at a time, was beaten repeatedly by over-zealous guards, lived on bread and water and slept where he worked with scores of other sweating prisoners.

But this was not the France of the Bourbon Louis. This was not the law of the French king who rule by "divine right," who seized four-fifths of the meager incomes of the peasants in order that the extravagant splendorings of their lavish courts might continue. This was not the France we hear so much about today when we think of what injustice, unfair political and economic systems, and the need for a change in all our established customs and practices.

This was AFTER the Revolution. When Jean Valjean was arrested for stealing a loaf of bread, when he couldn't find work and was sent to the galley for ten years, that pitiable wretch Louis XVI had already gone to the guillotine and that gay little butterfly, Marie Antoinette, had lost her head for the last time. The King had fallen, and Mirabeau, Danton, and Robespierre had each had their turn at giving to Frenchmen "liberty, equality, fraternity."

For the French Revolution was in 1789. During the two years that followed the traditional values and the social class system were completely destroyed. Thousands of men, women and children were killed. A new order was established in which the rights of the poor were to be equal to the rights of the rich. The old social system was destroyed. The nobles were stripped of their lands and titles. The peasants were to own their own land. The church was to be stripped of its property and its power.

Entire Ohio Town Halts Activities To Honor Doctor

100th Birthday Party Attracts Many Ho Brought Into World

BETHEL, Ohio, Aug. 9.—Many of the 1,800 babies he brought into the world during seventy-five years of practice thronged Main Street recently to celebrate Dr. William Eberle Thompson's 100th birthday.

It was the doctor's day and the town made the most of it. For one day, at least, the still-active censoring attended no patients. Instead he received honors from his fellow-townsmen.

The town weekly printed a special issue. Members of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, to which he belongs, named a class of initiates in his honor. The Ohio State Medical Association sent its president, Dr. John A. Caldwell of Cincinnati, to pay the respects of the profession.

Dr. Thompson, benign, white-headed, white-bearded, almost shy, called himself just an old-fashioned country doctor.

"It is very kind of you to so honor my 100th birthday anniversary," he said in a birthday message. "While my personal wish would be that I might spend this day with no more outward show of demonstration than any other day, I do appreciate the tributes which you wish to bestow upon a fellow-citizen."

"It has been my happy privilege and choice to spend my life throughout my life. It has also been granted to me to minister as a physician among a people more than seventy-five years. I have heard the first cry that means you have made a child, watched you grow from feeble infants into strong men and women."

"It was in this town where my home was established, where my relatives and friends have gathered to match the setting with the sun. It is your home and we have just reason to be proud of it."

Wrong Treatment Of Dogs By Owners May Bring Trouble

A local veterinarian yesterday issued a warning to all dog owners to be very careful about worming dogs in this hot weather. He says that the animals may seem to have worms, but usually at this time of year it is only a case of distemper.

According to this doctor, the first symptoms of distemper and worms are the same, and the dog should not be treated for worms unless the symptoms point conclusively to such an ailment. "Imagine the uproar in a dog's stomach when he is continually being fed worm capsules and more capsules, and he doesn't have worms at all," was the remark of the doctor.

The proper way to determine whether a dog has worms or not is to examine some of the feces under the microscope, and this will determine the type of worm eggs in the dog's intestines.

Then if the dog is found actually to be suffering from worms the process would be to find what sort of worms the kind of medicine that will cure this type of worm, and then proceed in the treatment.

The recognized treatment of the animal for worms is to fasten him for about eight hours before giving the medicine. Then, about four hours after the medicine follows with a laxative. But the doctor warned not to use a human laxative, for the reason that the dog's system is not adapted to a human laxative.

There are five types of worms which cannot be expected to get out of the system in a few days. If the dog only has distemper, usually the case is that the only thing that can be done is to keep the dog quiet and not feed him anything.
