

The gruesome discovery was made by workmen who are constructing the new viaduct. Leg bones, a skull and toe bones were found in the grave while the remainder of the bones were later found in a pile of ashes where the cremation rocess had been taken

Officers have two theories: First that a stool pidgeon was burned at the stake by moonshiners who had lanned to bury him alive in the newly dag grave to make their revenge more torteous. 
