



### RISKO LOSES TO TOM HEENEY FOR CRACK AT CROWN

New Zealand Boxer Wins From Cleveland Fighter After Slashing Whirlwind Finish; Detroit Dedicates New Arena

DETROIT, Oct. 27.—A blacksmith from New Zealand and a baker from Cleveland dedicated Detroit's new sport arena, the Olympia, to boxing last night and the blacksmith forced a neat victory at the new heavyweight elimination season is likely to see.

The grand opening of the fistic playground, the largest in the mid-west and another Madison Square Garden in size and equipment, was a glittering success for Tom Heenev and the promoters who represented the New Zealand and Johnny Risko, to a crowd of 17,000 that packed the splendid arena to capacity.

Heenev a heavyweight who has been consistently underrated since his arrival here last January had to come from behind to have his hand raised by referee Slim McClelland and he richly deserved the verdict.

Risko gave a whale of a fight for six rounds and was in front going into the seventh when he flew up as a result of Heenev's early rounds. Thereafter Johnny was wild with his far flung lefts and a mark for Heenev's prelate short punches.

Except for short rallies in which he bullied Heenev along the ropes, Risko was badly outpointed in the last four rounds and had nothing left for the tenth when a strong flash might have made it a close decision.

As we scored it Heenev took the third, fourth and the last four rounds. The fight drew a capacity house and many were turned away. The attendance approximated and the gate receipts about \$75,000. A new record for Detroit.

Risko was 6 to 5 favorite going into the ring and for six rounds looked like a winner although Heenev kept plugging along planting his shots to the body with excellent timing and precision. He couldn't dent Risko's concrete jaw. But the cumulative effect of the body lacing caused Johnny to lose his grip shortly after they swung into the last half.

Heenev thus earns his shot at Jack Sharkey on November 18.

### Knute Rockne Has One Hard Game Right After Another Tech Is Foe For Saturday

CHICAGO, Oct. 26.—In the opinion of Knute Rockne this 1927 season is just one "N-N tough ball game" after another. He would like to take his Notre Dame athletes to the six day bike race so they could get savage. But he has this Georgia Tech game on his hands next Saturday. And this outfit is rated as the prospective champion of the south.

"A smart young fellow from a newspaper asked me today what game I was pointing for," Rockne remarked. "I regarded that as a personal insult."

"To satisfy him I said that we were pointing for the Drake game at Des Moines Nov. 19," the little coach asserted. "Pointing for a game the way we have been forced to face 'em is foolish. We met Detroit and then came the Navy. After the Navy came Indiana, which had held Minnesota to a tie, and now Georgia Tech with, probably the greatest team in the south. I haven't time even to point for Southern California."

Rockne explained that his boys are fortunate in having a let up for the next two Saturdays because Notre Dame plays a pair of comical teams called Minnesota and the Army.

"I am working the Southern California game on the 'no scouting plan.' We are too poor at Notre Dame to send a scout to Los Angeles."

Rockne said one of the toughest things that he had to guard against with his players is "mental staleness."

"I am not worried about their physical condition," he said. "They are all right as far as that is concerned. But I am afraid that they will get sluggish above the neck and heaven knows they are dumb enough as it is."

Rockne pointed out that this business of keeping a squad of 50 players on mental edge from Saturday to Saturday was one of the biggest tasks that confronted any coach. "Their enthusiasm is likely to grow cold before a game," he said, and when they get to that stage all the Christy Flannagans in the country can't win for them."

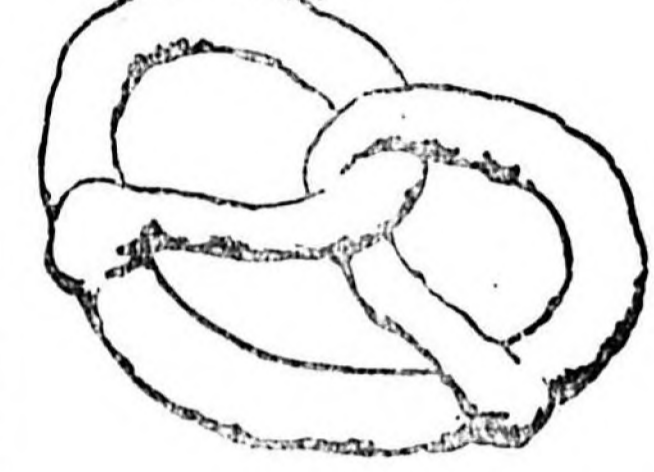

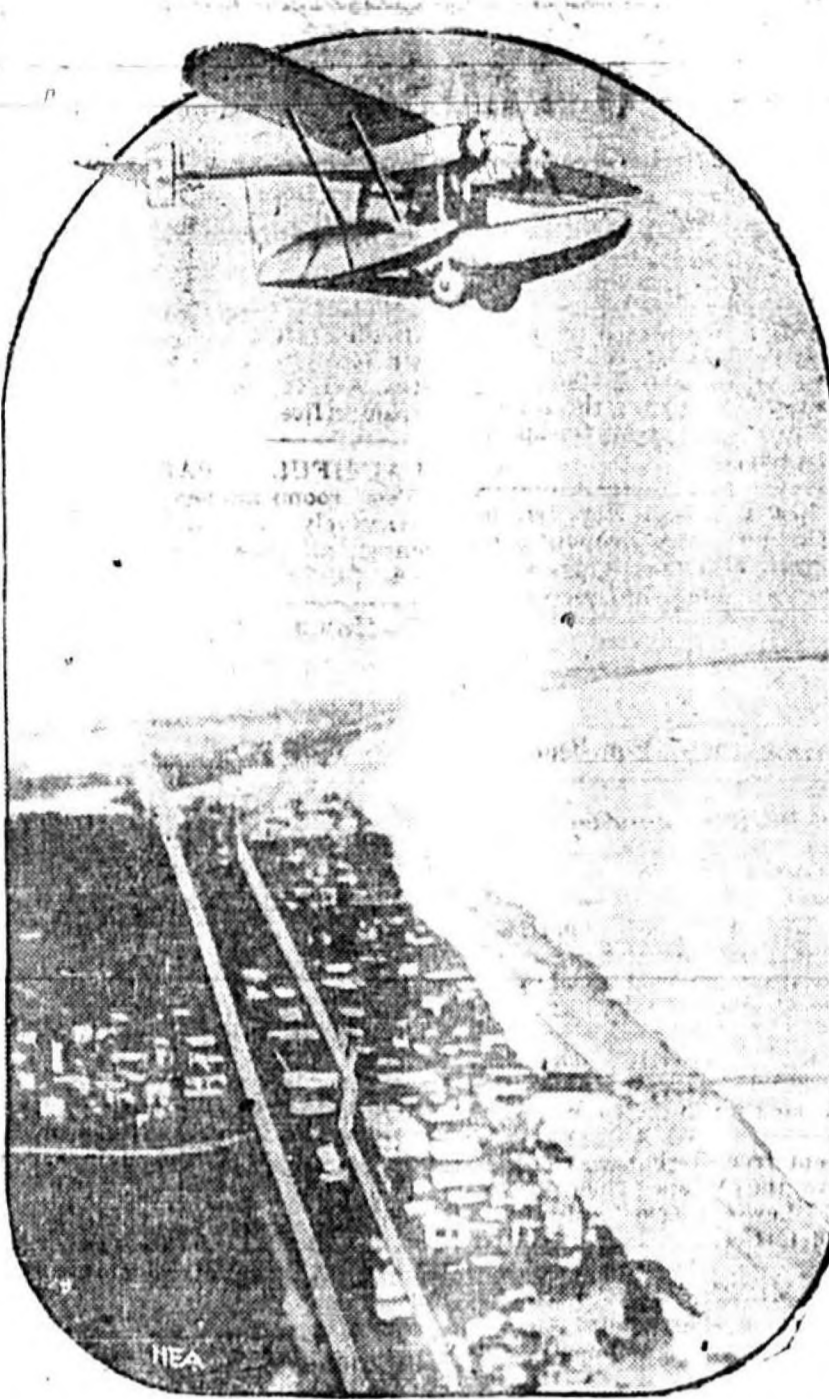

### FOUND BY WRECK OF BURST STILL

Memphis Police Believe Man Was Stool Pigeon Slain By Moonshiners Because They Thought He Betrayed Them

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Oct. 28.—(INS)—Mystery still shrouds the finding of human bones in a newly dug grave near the west end of the Harahan viaduct just across the river from Memphis in Arkansas at the scene of a destroyed still where a bonfire had been used to cremate the body of the murdered victim. The gruesome discovery was made by workmen who are constructing the new viaduct. Leg bones, a skull and toe bones were found in the grave while the remainder of the bones were later found in a pile of ashes where the cremation process had been taken place. Officers have two theories: First that a stool pigeon was burned at the stake by moonshiners who had lured to bury him alive in the newly dug grave to make their revenge more tortuous. Second, that the victim was slain and carried into the woods to be buried but on second thought the murderers burned the body to forever hide its identity before burying the bones. In either case moonshiners are held responsible for the murder. The fact remains that a still was destroyed by federal agents near the scene of the murder a week ago. The fact also stands that a grave was dug for some purpose and the murderers changed their minds, burning their victim and throwing the bones into the grave, probably not seeing the necessity of covering the bones. Camps of workmen more than half a mile from the scene of the murder declare they have not noticed a bonfire in the vicinity of the crime within the last two weeks.

### U. S. RECOGNITION OF RUSSIA ASKED BY MANY PEOPLE

Governmental Department Swamped With Messages Supplemented By Calls; Officials Maintain Silence  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 28.—Increasing pressure from many directions is being brought to bear on the Coolidge administration to have the United States recognize Russia. The campaign, which is now on in full swing, is being sponsored in conservative American business circles. Administration officials are being deluged with letters, most of which ask for an early settlement of the Russian problem. Some of the correspondents favor recognition; others believe the time for complete resumption of relations is not yet ripe. The letters are being supplanted by personal calls at the White House and state department, officials of the latter department having in the last several weeks received more than a hundred visitors who have aired their views on the Soviet question. Meanwhile, administration officials refuse to comment on the pro-Russian drive, although from reliable sources it is reported that the government's Russian policy is in the process of being overhauled. The administration has taken cognizance of the change in financial and commercial opinion

### Alabama Governor Asked To End Klan

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Oct. 28.—(INS)—A demand that Governor Graves of Alabama, start a movement for the disbanding of the Ku Klux Klan in the state was made today by John Bankhead, defeated candidate for United States Senator and son of the late Senator from Alabama. Bankhead traces the deplorable conditions in the state to the situation within the Klan, and says that should the governor be unwilling to kill the organization he should at least clear his official household of every official who sets an example of contempt of the courts and of disrespect of the laws of the state. QUAKE IN TOKIO LONDON, Oct. 28.—(INS)—An earthquake of serious proportions occurred in Tokio today, according to an exchange telegraph dispatch. Considerable subsidence is reported but as yet no casualties.

### Mammoth Airships Have No Commercial Value, Is Claim Of English Expert

LONDON, Oct. 17.—(INS)—Declaring that mammoth airships designed for world communications have no real commercial future; that they are not worth their cost; that they are dangerous; and that they compare unfavorably with other and older types of transport, Edward J. Spenser, a great authority on naval architecture and late of the Royal Corps of Naval Constructors, issued a call to the British Government to stop airship building at a conference of the Institute of Marine Engineers here. Spenser's criticism of the airship has awakened wide interest here, coming as it does at a time when the British Government has under construction two giant airships which are to be used commercially on the proposed Egypt-India route. Grave Weakness "May I hope that this conference will take some step which will result in the Institute putting it on record that it has faith in the technical, practical or commercial aspects of the airship policy of the British Air Ministry and wishes to see that policy dropped forthwith?" Spenser said. "I have come to the definite conclusion," he continued, "that there are grave weaknesses in the airship projects on which the British Air Ministry are at present engaged. Not only do I hold this opinion, but I am convinced that there is knowledge of weaknesses in the minds of the scientific and technical experts. Limitations of weight make it essential to select and dispose the material of an airship that quite small faults in workmanship, minor damage in operation, or slight corrosion are mischances, any one of which is likely to cause sudden and complete failure of the whole structure. The gas-bags are formed of cotton fabrics covered on the inside with gold beaters' skins. These animal skins are difficult to preserve properly, and as some quarter of a million were required in the British airship R33, it was not surprising that efforts have been made, with indifferent success, to find a substitute. Not Immune To Conditions "It is very certain that this gas-bag material was far from uniform and reliable material it should be for such an important service as preserving the buoyancy of an airship carrying passengers. There is no reasonable proof that an airship can be rendered immune from the effects of electrical disturbances in the atmosphere. By reason of the fact that the designers of R33, lacked certain data regarding aerodynamical stresses on an airship circling, that ill-fated ship had a factor of safety actually considerably lower than the standard on which she had been nominally designed. PETS HAVE LIFE PRESERVERS Pets of passengers are assured safety by a French ocean liner which is providing life preservers for them. The life belts for dogs are made in three sizes for big and little canines, and may be quickly strapped on the animals' backs. Humane societies have commended the innovation.

### Downtown Chicago Thrown Into Panic By Blast And Fire

CHICAGO, Oct. 28.—(INS)—A mysterious explosion followed by fire in a five-story building directly across Clark Street from the city hall and county building, threw downtown Chicago into a panic early today. The wrecked building stood between two theatres, the Erlanger and the Four Cohans. Both were threatened by flames. The fire did little damage as the four upper floors of the building were unoccupied. The ground floor is an Italian restaurant. Police are checking the ruins for possible victims and to ascertain the origin of the blast. The fire started on the fourth floor. Bits of plate glass windows were thrown across the street by the blast.
