



## Happy trails — but only if taxpayers ante up

SANFORD — Intent to keep Seminole County as Florida's Natural Choice, county commissioners agreed (4-1) Tuesday to put a referendum before voters in November to approve as much as \$25 million in bonds to build more than 100 miles of county trails.

The vote comes as Seminole County is making plans for the grand opening of the Seminole Wekiva Trail on Sept. 9 at the Seminole County Softball Complex in of environmentally sensitive land and to

**SANFORD** - With Hurricane Debby now reduced, for the time being, to a tropical distur-bance, and heading westerly across the southern end of Cuba, local officials are canceling efforts to prepare for a

The Seminole County Emergency Operations Center held a briefing this morning but Emergency Manager Joe McClaun said, "We're going to do nothing at this time.

"Of course, we'll continue monitoring the storm, but at the present time, it appears it's going out into the Gulf so we'll just cool it for awhile."

The State Emergency Operations Center, in Tallahassee, is continuing to stand at Level 2, (Partial **Activation of State Emergency** Response Team), keeping a close watch on the progress of the storm as it heads into the

"They have the entire state to consider," McClaun said, "so they'll continue to operate at Level 2 until the storm has disappeared.

**SANFORD** — A water line break Wednesday afternoon resulted in low pressure water in some areas and no water for a brief time at the Seminole Plaza.

According to Sanford Public Utilities Director Paul Moore, TCI Telecommunications Company was involved in trenching to install lines along Americana Boulevard at Logan Heights Apartments, near U.S. Highway 17-92, when they accidentally struck the top of the water line causing it to rupture.

The event was reported at approximately 5:30 p.m.

"There was some low pressure for about 30 minutes at the new apartments (Logan Heights) behind Walmart," Moore said. "But the only area







my appearance overnight. Could you please help me educate my family and others who know so little about what

the transgendered community goes through? We struggle to lead normal lives and try to be productive in society. We are teachers, lawyers, doctors and office workers. As few as we are, we are not mistakes as my father claims. Still, we face prejudice on a daily basis. We need our families to stand behind us as we make our way through this challenging journey. Please, Abby, help educate people to see that we are just like them.

DEAR TRANSGENDERED: You are not a mistake. Followed to its logical conclusion, your father's attitude would make the entire medical profession unnecessary. Transsexualism is inborn. Children as young as 3 have

insisted that their true gender is not their birth gender. I congratulate you for being honest about who you are, knowing it might be difficult

for some people to understand. I also applaud those family members who support

The usual gender transition involves a period of psychotherapy to consider all of the ramifications, followed by hormonal therapy, and then living full-time in the new gender for at least a year before seeking sexual reassignment surgery.

This is not an easy process for the transsexual person, nor for the family. Parents often experience many of the same emotions that occur in the grief process - shock, anger, denial, guilt, sadness, and finally acceptance. Learning to use the new name is difficult; new pronouns are even harder. All of this takes time and commitment, but is a necessary part of the process.

Loving parents who want their child to be happy must learn to be accepting. Many transsexuals live very suc-

cessfully in their new gender, and claim they are truly happy for the first time in their lives. Many families are proud of their "new" sons and daughters and report their relationships have vastly improved since their child's transition.

I would urge any family in this situation to contact PFLAG (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays). They have many resources available for transgendered people and their families. arity has produced a parade of winning story lines that have broken the mold during the 2000 NASCAR season. At Darlington, Ward Burton won his first race in nearly five years. Rookies Dale Earnhardt Jr. and Matt Kenseth quickly fulfilled their promise with victories. Steve Park shocked the Winston Cup series by taking his first checkered flag - on a road course.

But although fresh faces have filled victory lane, one veteran has remained conspicuously absent. More than halfway through his fourth season, Mike Skinner is well overdue for his first victory.

The 1995 Truck Series champion has started 132 Winston Cup races without a win. Nine active drivers have made more starts without a victory, but none has been in the hunt as much as Skinner has the past two seasons. The close calls naturally have worn on him.

"I have been guilty in getting caught up in, 'God, are we ever going to win? What's the deal? What do we have to do?' " said Skinner, who has won two exhibition races In Japan, "But we can't do that. I've never been in this long a drought since we've started racing, but Winston Cup is a tough league. I'm Just thankful we're in the top

Skinner has finished in the top 10 in six of the past 11 races and in more than a third of the races in his career. He has led more laps this season than Dale Jarrett, Dale Earnhardt, Mark Martin and Jeff Burton. He has been a strong qualifier with five career pole positions.

Yet the question still follows the 43-yearold everywhere: When will you lead the last lap instead of the first? Skinner just shrugs off the constant queries and chalks them up as the nature of a high-pressure business.

"We're a good story," he said. "People ask, 'Why hasn't Skinner won? Why hasn't that race team won? Have Mike Skinner and [crew chief] Larry McReynolds forgotten how to win?' ... We've had wins just right in our lap, and we figured out a way to lose them.

"It's not that we haven't run well enough to get the first victory."

Skinner has been on the cusp of an initial triumph at least twice this season. His No. 31 Chevrolet was dominant before an engine failure at Atlanta. He battled Jeff Gordon to a runner-up finish at Talladega. An alternator problem doomed Skinner's strong car at Martinaville, and a late caution flag foiled a fuel-mileage plan at Pocono.

Being perched on the verge has earned a vote of confidence from team owner Richard Childress, who announced last week that Skinner will remain through 2001.

"The car has been competitive," Childress said. "It's led a lot of laps this year. It's been right there. But to put the whole day and package together, they've had a tough time."

Next season could be more difficult. McReynolds, the nee mechanic responsible for 26

Winston Cup victories by drivers such as Davey Allison

and Ernie Irvan, is leaving his post as team leader at the end of the year to become a TV analyst for Fox.

But Skinner is confident the loss won't be devastating Before Childress made his commitment, Skinner said he mulled over a few job offers from other teams. After meeting with team members who were adamant about their driver sticking around, Skinner decided to stay with Childress.

"If you've got a strong race team, one man isn't going to affect it that badly," he said of McReynolds' impending departure. "Whether it's the crew chief, the driver or the guy who sweeps the floors, we've got a strong race team. If I left, there'd be another guy in that car doing well."

Skinner has performed well at several of the remaining tracks on this year's schedule. Richmond, Atlanta and Talladega all offer a strong shot at that clusive victory.

"I'm sure we'll win races," Skinner said. "But if we never do, I'm living a lifetime dream: I made it to Winston Cup, and we're competitive. That we're in contention to win a lot of races, that's a pretty good feeling in itself."

## NASCAR ON TV: Questions prevail about new guys on pit road

It will never be the same. It may be better, it may be worse, but it will never be

The old gang at ABC-ESPN, from Nell Goldberg and Mike Wells in the icebox control center, to Benny Parsons and Bob Jenkins up in the booth, to Bill Weber, Jerry Punch and Ray Dunlap on pit road, and John Cernan back at the Charlotte weeknight news desk, are coming down the

home stretch of their final Winston Cup tour together. A team taken for granted for so long is about to be broken up; the best TV team in racing is about to become history. And what comes next season is anybody's guess.

NASCAR executives may cringe or scream when the TV issue is raised. But they've offered very few details since November's blockbuster announcement, and that has left journalists scrambling to piece together how things are

The question may be, "Where's the beef?" Goldberg, the best producer in the sport, is going with Fox, but Wells, his sidekick for so many NASCAR seasons, is going with NBC. Goldberg will be working with a new director,

apparently Artie Kemptner. Wells will have a new producer, apparently Sam Flood. Parsons is going to NBC to work with Motor

Racing Network's Alan Bestwick. But Weber and Punch will be staying with ABC, both for non-NASCAR assignments, and it's not clear if Duniap will get a call from NBC or Fox. Those three have been by far the toughest TV reporters on pit road, and without them policing the beat there will be more than a few questions about how politically correct both the pit-road questions and answers might be in the coming seasons.

The new guys on pit road, whoever they are, will be NASCAR-approved and possibly even on the NASCAR payroll, since NASCAR is getting deep into this TV project, with its own produc-tion vans and with The NASCAR Channel. Fox officials, who are helping NASCAR get The Channel launched, may have to wonder how hard NASCAR reporters will be judging NABCAR-sensitive issues.

So far it appears that Matt Yoeum and Dick Berggren will be on pit road for Fox, and Marty Snyder and Mike Massaro for NBC, with both networks still looking for more. There are questions about the guys in the booth, too. Mike Joy,

who will be Fox's anchor, working with colormen Darrell Waltrip and Larry McReynolds, has had a reputation for independence during his career, which hasn't endeared him to NASCAR execs. Insiders report that Eli Gold, the veteran MRN and lately TV man, was NASCAR's choice for the anchor job. But what hard-edged stuff has Joy done recently? Has he become too mellow?

And Bestwick, cool under pressure and extremely well-informed on every issue, has been so careful at company-owned MRN that outsiders are wondering if he will become his own man in the booth at NBC.

Crew chief McReynolds is leaving Richard Childress to join Waltrip and Joy in the Fox booth. Crew chief Jeff Hammond is leaving Jack Roush to join Steve Byrnes on Fox's prerace show, and the two will work from that NFL-type location set for drop-ins during the race. Bill Ingle may be the next ex-crew chief to get the call to the booth, from NBC. They're all good, talented people, and knowledgeable. But hard-edged, or just politically correct?

NBC and Fox executives both may be underestimating how rough it could be to keep big crews on the road for such long stretches. Fox apparently is looking at a three-on, two-off rotation. But NBC? It appears set to carry that record-breaking 20 in a row. How much creative energy these guys can muster after 10, or 12 or 14 straight is another question. Fox and NBC may need more people than they anticipate.

Friday's 'Classics' also give county fans a chance to get a first glimpse of the newest edition of their favorite teams.




