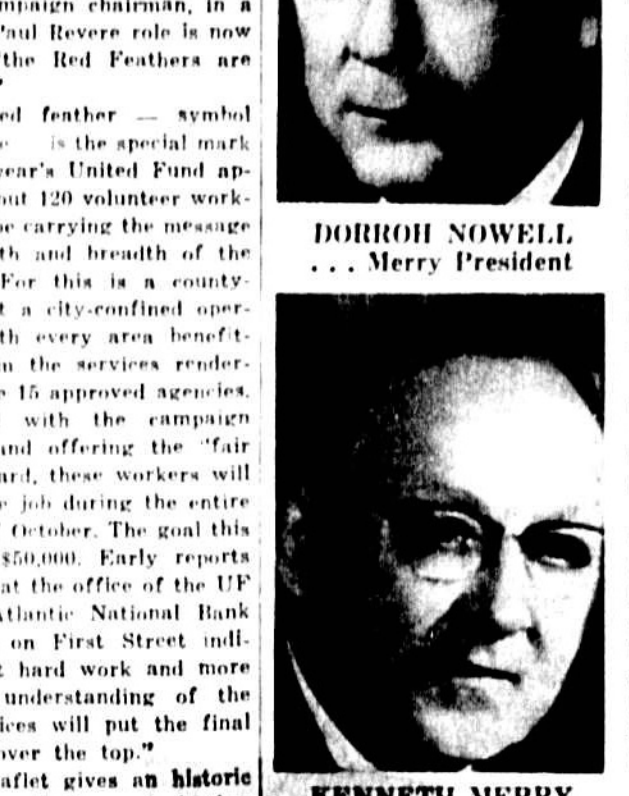

First Federal Cuts Dividend Melon

Almost a quarter of a million dollars will be paid in dividends Monday on savings accounts by First Federal Savings and Loan Association as earnings for the past three-month period of the year, according to President E. C. Harper Sr.

The S&L officer said that the savings accounts now on the books totaled \$10,000,000 and represented 6,750 accounts.

These figures include both the 4 1/2 per cent a year passbook accounts and the savings certificates that extra 2 1/2 a year on sums over \$5,000 and undisturbed for a six-month period.

Harper pointed out that the picture this year is considerably brighter than that of a year ago when the tight money situation "had all financial institutions in a tizzy trying to meet demands for funds."

Indications are that people are saving more money now than they did, a larger portion of the disposable income being "put to work" earning income from the former \$10,000 coverage may have influenced the surge in savings, Harper added.

Loans are now being made at a much accelerated rate, it was pointed out.

Medical News

A substantial number of cases of influenza can be expected to occur during the 1967-68 season. With this warning, the U. S. Public Health Service urged recently that persons likely to be susceptible to the disease be immunized. Among those for whom shots are particularly important, according to the government health agency are:

- People with rheumatic heart disease.
- Patients with cardiovascular disorders (heart and circulatory problems) such as hardening of the arteries and high blood pressure.
- People with diabetes mellitus and Addison's disease.
- Those with chronic ailments such as asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, tuberculosis.
- Men and women over 65, and particularly those over 65, are also in the high risk group, especially if they have any chronic diseases.

In addition, people living in nursing homes, chronic disease hospitals and crowded environments are at risk since the disease spreads quickly once it breaks out.

"Routine influenza immunization during pregnancy," the agency notes, "is not recommended unless the individual is in the high risk category."

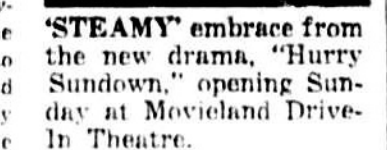
