#### Thousands Of French Jews March Against Neo-Nazis

PARIS (UPI) - Thousands of French Jews, many wowing to form themselves into self-defense groups against neo-Nazis, marched through the streets of Paris Saturday to protest the bomb attack on a synagogue that killed three people and wounded 16

Members of Jewish community groups called for the self-defense movement as a means of stemming a rising tide of anti-Semitic attacks in the country "now that Jewish blood is being shed again." Some Jews said they would avenge the attack.

The powerful bomb blast outside a synagogue near the famed Arc de Triomphe during Friday evening services was the first outright terror attack on Jews in France since World War II, authorities said. It followed a wave of machine-gun and bomb attacks against institutions and shops of the 700,000-strong French Jewish community in the last two weeks.

#### Iran Says City Recaptured troops and militant civilians regained control of the besieged city of Khurramshahr in fierce hand-to-hand fighting with Iraqi forces in the vital oil port on the

Shatt Al-Arab waterway. Iran's claim came as there was mounting evidence in the 13th day of the Persian Gulf war that Iranian forces were counterattacking effectively against Iraq's posh into oil-rich Khuzistan province. "During the past 48 hours Khurramshahr has been the scene of one of the bloodiest battles and most glorious epics of the Muslem nation," Iranian Prime Minister Mohammed Ali Rajai said in a statement broadcast by Tehran Radio.

Said Carter, "I am willing to take the chance." That won a round of applause, and he added, "I don't say that in a silly way. Even if I knew I would die ... I would still run for the office because I think it's the most exciting and challenging and important position in the free world. It's an office revered by the American people and for anyone in politics it's the ultimate achievement."

Finally, the House Ethics Committee opted for a tougher policy. It voted 10-2 to recommend the explusion of Rep. Michael Myers, a Pennsylvania Democrat, who was convicted in August of accepting a \$50,000 bribe in the FBI's Abscam

Myer can argue that what he did is no more rievous than what some of his colleagues and their predecessors have done in the past without losing their seats. Only last June, Rep. Charles Wilson of California got off with a vote of censure after being convicted in a bribery case. But the record of the House in the past need not govern its ethical standards in the future. A legislative body, like a weak-willed person, can always seek the JACK ANDERSON path of redemption.

One can only speculate on how many of the embarrassments Congress has suffered from influence peddling and pay-off scandals over the years could have been avoided if its ethics code had been given more credibility. A bribery conviction in a court of law should be grounds for expulsion of a House member for the balance of the session. The House has finally established that



The Micklers of Chuluota specialize in books that pertain to Florida. Maps, newspapers, documents and nemorabilia, all of which have something to do with the Sunshine State are for sale.

Mickler's Floridiana is the name of their business. It started almost 20 years ago with an interest of Mrs. Mickler for tracing out-of-print books. Searching for books and filling orders slowly grew into a business for

handle.'' explained Mickler. He would go on the road for a week at a time taking orders, then drive back home and fill them. Back on the road he went delivering the books. All the traveling got to be more than he wanted, so they decided to cut down. In cutting down time on the road, the mail orders increased and additional help had to be hired to handle the orders and the growing stock of Florida-related

In addition to dealing in books, the Micklers are also publishers. Two recent books published by them are "The Billy Bowlegs War" by James Covington, a story of the third Seminole war of the 1850s, and Alma Hetherington's "River of the Long Water" which tells about the days when steamboats ran from Kissimmee south to Lake Okeechobee. The Micklers do business mainly with schools and libraries, filling their needs-for Floridiana, but in-


dividuals may also purchase items. Each year they put out a catalog listing Florida material they have acquired from hundreds of publishing companies. This year's catalog lists over 800 books, maps and other publications, many of which are now out-of-print. "And that's not 20 percent of what we have," Mickler said. Those items listed in their catalog are books they expect to be able to supply for a full year which occupy

only one room of the Micklers home. Subject matter

The Micklers have over 3,000 newspapers dating from 1759 through 1870. All have at least one article pertaining to Florida though few are from Florida. Mickler explained that there exist very few
