LONDON, June 2.--(INS)--The end of the two-year civil war in China loomed today as the Northerners prepared to retreat into Manchuria and allow the Nationalists to take the city of Peking without a bombardment, Marshall Chang Tso Lin, who for years has been the dictator at Peking, has dispatched officers to the battlefront at Liuliho, 30 miles away, to prepare for an orderly rethrement into Manchuria, dispatches from Tokio and Peking state. Chang has assured the representatives of the foreign powers in Pelling that foreignera will have full protection and need have no fear of bombardment by the Southerners or looting by his troops.

In order to facilitate the handling of the returns an office will be fitted up on the second floor, where all the returns will be received, tabulated and then transferred to slides to be thrown on the screen,

The service will be the most complete ever offered in Sanford on an election. The returns will begin coming in at 8 p'clock and will continue until a late hour. They will be shown as fast as they come in and the service will be offered as late as the crowd




