Westerns were the deal. All it cost for a ticket was a quarter. A soft drink was a nickel and you corn

For an hour or so we watched our heroes ride on horseback, lasso the bad guys and maintain law and order. These heroes

almost always were white hats. In this kinder era of the forties and early fifties, silver screen cowboys were tall in the saddle. Gene Autry, who died Friday

Gene Autry, who died Friday at age 91, was one of America's favorites - the first singing cowboy.

He came to Washington, D.C. in 1948 to ride his horse. Champion, and sing songs like "Tumbling Tumbleweeds" at the old Uline Arena. I was 8-years-old and couldn't have been more thrilled if I were going to the White House. My heart pounded when my dad and I entered the lobby of the arena.

There were posters inside and outside, posters of Autry holding his hat and waving as Champion kicked in the air. Gene Autry had come to my hometown. So had Champion.

Years later, when Autry was the owner of the Los Angeles Angeles baseball team, he wrote a kind letter thanking me for a baseball story I had written about his team. He invited me to visit with him when the Washington Senators came to Los Angeles.

Being with Antry at the ballpark was as rewarding an experience as having seen him at Uline Arena when I was a boy. He told me that when he was 19 he tried out for Tuisa, a farm team of the St. Louis Cardinals. "I was a frustrated ballplayer all my life," he said. "And now here is this might-have-been pro who winds up owning a team."

In subsequent trips to the west coast, Autry almost always took the time to say hello. Frequently, he'd have dinner with the baseball writers in the ballpark dining room.

As the years went by, everyone in baseball wished the Autry's Angels would play in the World Series. The 1998 Angels gave it a very good try. So did the 1986 team which lost in the American League Championships to Boston.

Autry touched the hearts of millions. He was a shrewd business man with a kind heart. He told the truth, he worked hard and helped those in distress. One of his rules was to keep clean in thought, speech, action and personal habits. Boys needed heroes like Gene Autry then

Man shot over card game Up at arms:

SANFORD - It was apparently a high stakes card game.

And one player could have paid with his life when he was shot in anger.

As many as 2,000 are expected to receive their influenzal vaccine at the county health department building at 400 West Airport Blvd. In Sanford. The shots will be given from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Call (407) 322-2724 to make an appointment to avoid having to wait.

Area family physicians also administer the vaccine. Dr. James Quinn in Sanford has already begun the process. The cost for the shots varies at different offices or clinics. Medicare covers the cost of the vaccine. HMO patients should go to their provider.

Influenza is a serious dis-

of deaths each year, mostly among the elderly. The influenza season in the U.S. is from November to March or April each year. The flu is caused by a virus that spreads from infected persons to the nose and throat of others.

The viruses that cause influenza change frequently, Because of this, the vaccine is updated each year by replacing at least one of the vaccine viruses with a new one. Protection develops 1 to 2 weeks after the shot and may last up to a year.

Ginder said that everyone 65 years of age or older should get the vaccine. So should those with serious long-term heart, kidney, or lung disease. Those with asthma,, anemia and other blood disorders and those with diabetes...

Anyone whose immune system is weakened because of HIV/AIDS or, other discases that affect the immune system also should get the vaccine.

Students and staff at schools and colleges should consider the shot as should physicians, nurses and anyone else coming in close contact with people at risk of serious influenza.

Those receiving the vaccine sometimes get the flu but experience a milder case than Please see Flu, Page 3A

Fast food coming to Oviedo

OVIEDO - There will be two more drive through fast food restaurants in Oviedo despite the protests of two city councilmen and some citizens that such establishments do not go with their vision of the city.

By a vote of 3-2, with Bob Dallari and George Viele objecting, the project was approved

The developer of a Taco Bell and a KFC franchise will be able to go ahead with plans to put the restaurants on property on Mitchell Hammock Road west of Alafaya Drive.

Those plans had been on hold due to objections by some council members and a few citizens opposed to further development in the area which abuts a wetlands area and which already contains nearly a half dozen other drive through fast food restaurants.

Fire chief helps after Hurricane Georges

LAKE MARY - One of the first people to respond when Hurricane Georges hit the Florida Keys was Lake Mary Fire Chief Craig Haun. Haum is the deputy incident

commander of one of three Incident Management Teams in the state. The teams are part of a system developed by the Department of Agriculture's Division of Forestry. The division is the first entity to institute incident command on a large scale, said Haun.

"Whenever there's a disaster," said Haun, "the state will assign one of our teams."

When Georges threatened the Florida Keys, the IMT was activated and assigned to Homestead. Haun said the Incident Command System was split, out of Tallahassee, because the state anticipated a need in the Panhandle should the hurricane continue to follow its westward course.

Once he got to Homestead and helped establish an operation center, Haun lead a miniteam into Monroe County.

Monroe had requested a team to manage the storm. Haun said. The initial task of Haun's team was to evaluate the needs of the local emergency response personnel. Haun said the IMT shadowed the county's personnel and provided some relief. They were still in control of their situation, but it was our team coaching and belping them get things done."

The IMT oversaw search and tescue efforts, the meeting of humanitarian needs, and the organization of debris removal.

organization of debris removal. In large, it was the storm surge that caused most of the damage in the Keys, said Haun, not the wind. He said he saw places where water had crossed an Island, from the Atlantic Ocean to Florida Bay.

Haum was part the of 20 to 25-person team which assisted with Georges. The team went in on Saturday and came out of Tuesday, a short stay, compared to the weeks needed to cleanup after Hurricane Andrew, said Haun.

Haun has served in the ICS for six years. Prior to accepting the position as Lake Mary's fire chief, in June, Haun was the Senior Director of Fire and Emergency Services for Lake County.

Insect and arthropod venom

What it is and what to do when you are stung

Millions of people in the United States are injured from venom produced by insects and other arthropods each year. Of these injuries about 25,000 result in severe injuries and about 32 result in deaths.

Types of venom: Venomous insects and other arthropods produce venom's that can be classified as venom's that produce blisters (blister beetles, certain stinging caterpillars. millipedes), venom's that attack the central nervous system (black widow spiders, bark scorpions, certain ticks), venom's that destroy tissue thre ants, ground scorptons, mites, chiggers, wheel bugs, brown recluse spider), and toxins that prevent blood from clotting (lice, fleas, ticks, mites, true bugs, bitting flies).

Allergic reactions: Humans differ greatly in their reaction to arthropod venom's. Allergie reactions are often more important than the toxic effects of insect and other arthropod venom's. Of individuals who die from arthropod venom's, 96 percent had an allergic reaction. Allergie reactions to stings or bites are when something happens to a part of the body other than the immediately affected area. It can vary from a slight general reaction (inflammation, welts, and itching) or a general reaction (a

slight general reaction plus two or more of the following symptoms: swelling, wheezing, abdominal pain, nausea or vomning), or severe general reaction; any of the above plus two or more of the following (difficulty in breathing, difficulty in swallowing, hoarseness, confusion or feeling of impending disaster) or, shock reaction (any of the above plustwo or more of the following: fall in blood pressure, collapse, unconsciousness or in-

continence). Toxic effects: Insect stings result in rapid progression of toxic effects. Of 208 deaths studied in one survey, 80 percent occurred less than one hour after being string by bees, wasps, yellow Jackets, or hornets. Spider bites, however, have a longer time interval between bites and death with 89 percent of 54 victims dying more than 12 hours after being bitten. Statistics also reveal

deaths, seventeen percent died one to 12 hours after being bitten and 64 percent between 12 hours and two days.

What to do: Insect stings require prompt action. The insect must be captured, saved and identified. If a general allergic reaction is suspected, or the victim has a history of hayfever, allergy or asthma, a doctor should be contacted immediately or the local Potson Control Center. If marked swelling or discoloration occurs at site of bite or sting, the venom is probably haemolytic, haemorrhagic or vesicating. Keep victim warm and quiet until a physician is reached. If little or no swelling or discoloration occurs at the site of the bite or sting, the venom is probably neurotoxic. Apply fee to the site or immerse the affected part of body in ice water until a physician is reached. Persons who have exhibited a severe allergic reaction in the past to arthropod venom's or have a history of asthma, hayfever or allergies should undergo skin testing to determine hypersensitivity to arthropod venom's, carry iden-

that of snakebite victim tification or tags noting hypersensitivity, or carry an insect sting kit (available only with a physician's prescription).

Prevention of stings: Several procedures can be used to minimize the danger of being stung by venomous trisects. Avoid mowing lawns or working with flowering ornamentals when bees and wasps are collecting nectar. Don't walk barefooted in the yard. Sweet items like soft drinks ripened fruits and watermelons attract bees and wasps. Keep these items covered outdoors. Pick fruit as it ripens and dispose of rotten fruits.

Chemical control of bees and wasps: Bees and wasps can be easily controlled by applying insectfeldes to the nests. Generally, sprays are more effective for aerial nests and dusts are more effective for below ground nests. Sprays should have a quick knockdown agent such as synergized pyrethrum or pyrethroids mixed with it to minimize the rtsk of being stung by the insects. 

Interpreting blood sugar levels

By Peter H. Gott, M.D.

DEAR DR GOTT: One day, after bingeing on sweets, my blood sugar was 100. The next day it was 80, and 1 had eaten no sweets. What do these values mean? I'm 64, female, and tire easily

DEAR READER. When a normal person consumes carbohydrates (in the form of sugar or starch), the pancreas is stimulated to secrete insulin. a hormone that enables the products of digestion to enter cells and provide fuel for energy. Your blood sugar of 100 was normal following the ingestion of sweets; the next day's value of 80 was also normal. These figures. prove that your body can handle carbohydrates by producing the exact amount of insulin necessary for proper metabolism.

If you were diabetic, your blood sugar would be much higher - 180 milligrams per deciliter or above. Your fatigue is probably not due to an abnormality in sugar metabolism. I suggest that you and your doctor search for other causes

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've had breastenlargement surgery. Could a liny cancer be missed by a doctor or mammogram if it is under or near the implant'

DEAR READER: Without a doubt. Breast prostheses are smooth, therefore, your doctor probably could feel a lump that lies close to them but not always, especially if a tumor were to appear beneath the implant.

Also, the material in implants has different X-ray characteristics than the surrounding breast tissue, so a mammogram should, in theory, differentiate a lump from the prosthesis. But, again, not always. Because women with breast

implants are at the same risk as other women for breast cancer, they should have periodic mammograms and breast exams, even though such studies are often more difficult to interpret. Follow your doctor's advice about this issue. DEAR DR. GOTT: In a recent col-

WIN AT BRIDGE

Another slam-going cue-bid

By Phillip Alder

Let's have a second look at the use of a cue-bid to express slam interest and to show a side suit control. Usually, this cue-bid occurs once a trump suit has been clearly agreed on, and combined game-forcing values have been established. Sometimes, though, a bid will logically be a cue as in this auction


South was nervous about opening only one spade, but he was a little weak for a stronger bid. North made a limit raise, showing four-plus trumps and 10-12 support points. Now, if South had a minimum, he would pass. With some extras, he would raise to game. But with this strong a hand, he could envisage a slam. Yet there was a risk the opponents could cash the ace and

four clubs, simultaneously telling partner that he had a slam in mind and that he held the club ace (or perhaps a club void). North, having a respectable hand too, cue-bid his diamond ace. As West this was exactly what South had wanted to hear, he jumped to six spades... Declarer won the first trick with | ◆ K Q 10 9

king of diamonds. So, South cue-bid

dummy's diamond ace, drew two | 10 8 3 rounds of trumps, unblocked the acequeen of clubs, crossed to dummy with a spade, and discarded his diamond loser on the club king.

Now South had to avoid two heart losers. One possibility was the text book safety play: low to the ace, followed by a low heart, intending either to finesse dummy's nine if West played low, or to rise with the king and lead back toward the jack if West discarded. Instead, South ruffed dummy's remaining diamond, then led a heart to the nine. Whatever happened now, the contract was ensured.
