### Woman arrested after scuffle

## Woman reportedly died of inhalation in murder/suicide

DELTONA — A woman died of smoke inhalation after she fatally stabbed her sleeping husband and set their house on fire, police said.

Before dying, Lillian Johnson called 911 and told a dispatcher her daughter needed help. She then pushed the little girl out the front door, went back into the house and locked the door.

Five-year-old Sharon Johnson suffered minor burns and smoke inhalation but was in stable condition Monday night.

"Mrs. Johnson was under a lot of pressure, business and family pressure, concerning her husband," said Bob Vail, an

investigator with the Volusia County Sheriff's office.

According to police, John Johnson, 39, was sleeping face down on the bed in the house's master bedroom early Monday morning when Lillian Johnson, 34, used a hunting knife to stab him at least five times in the back and shoulders.

He turned to defend himself and his left arm was cut. She stabbed him at least three times in the heart and then set the fire almost immediately.

Vail said he believed Lillian Johnson had planned to kill her husband and herself.

## SCC gets input from surveys

SANFORD — In preparation for next year's accreditation visits by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), Seminole Community College is conducting a series of surveys to see where improvements are needed and where the college is doing a good job.

Every ten years the college is expected to take a hard look at itself and prepare for the reaffirmation of the accreditation by the SACS.

A self-study committee, directed by Dorothy Holtgreve, developed seven separate surveys to get the opinions of the faculty, the administration, the support staff, the community, the alumni, the students and the board of trustees.

In all about 1,200 surveys have been sent out. The committee has asked that the responses be returned to the school by Monday.

Holtgreve reports that the return rate has been "quite good" so far.

The self-study committee consists of volunteers from different areas at the college.

"These people have worked long, hard hours," Holtgreve said.

The committee had considered using a survey developed by the Educational Testing Service, but the \$2,000 price tag made them think again.

"In these tough economic times it was hard to justify spending that kind of money," Holtgreve said.

She said that the only expense the committee has incurred so far is that of the paper on which the survey was printed.

The results of the survey will be incorporated into the text of a report that must be presented to the SACS visitation team that will come to the college in the spring of 1992.

"It will not be a lot of figures," Holtgreve said. "We are more interested in perceptions about the college from the different groups."

The surveys for each group are different. Some have as few as 28 questions and others as many as 118 questions.

## School clerical union tries to settle contract

SANFORD — The Seminole Educators Clerical Union (SECU) is the next of the four school district employee unions trying to settle contract disputes with the assistance of a Special Master.

They were to meet with a negotiator today in the district boardroom.

All four unions failed to reach agreement on their annual contracts through normal channels of negotiation and Special Masters have been called in to mediate the process.

The bus drivers and non-instructional employees have met with their special hearings negotiators.

Union representatives said they are still waiting to hear from the Special Masters in both of those cases, though rulings should have been received by now.

The clerical employees union, like the other unions, has come to an impasse with the district on the matter of job security.

The district has for the last 15 years, union officials complain, refused to discuss the matter of job security. Employees may be fired, union representatives complain, without explanation even if they have had a clean work record, after their contract is up.

The teachers union will not meet with their Special Master on Dec. 16.

Once the Special Masters render their opinions on the hearings with each union, the case will be brought before the Seminole County School Board who will make the final decisions on the contract based on the impartial hearings.

Currently the employees are working at last year's salary without a contract.

## County planners OK land use change but nix subdivision

SANFORD — Seminole County planners have recommended approval of reconfigurations of two Markham Woods Road developments but rejected a proposal for a 7-home per acre subdivision adjacent to Heathrow.

County planners released their recommendations of the land use changes and rezonings Monday. Seminole County Planning and Zoning Commission members will consider the recommendations Wednesday. County commissioners will consider P&Z recommendations Jan. 14 and will consider final approval May 12 under the current schedule.

Staff planners balked at a request by Engineering Management and Design Inc. of Orlando for a 21-acre, 86-home subdivision southeast of Heathrow Elementary. County planners wrote the 7.2-home per acre density was incompatible with surrounding low-density development trends.

They recommended allowing no more than one home per acre if the residents would be able to drive to Markham Woods Road or three homes per acre if the subdivision can be reached only from Heathrow.

But planners recommend approval of a plan by Heathrow developer Arvida Corp. to shift

19 undeveloped acres of land they own adjacent to Heathrow into the subdivision. The parcel is located north of the Dawn Estates subdivision east of Markham Woods Road.

The plan calls for merging the 19 acres with a currently approved Heathrow neighborhood and redistributing the homesites. As a result, the original neighborhood density of three homes per acre would be lowered to 1.4 homes per acre. County planners wrote the land use scheme was consistent with county development plans and with area densities of one to three homes to an acre.

Residents of Dawn Estates have written letters to the

county opposing the plan, saying it would increase the housing density.

County planners also recommended approval of the rezoning, provided no access be allowed to Markham Woods Road, only one-acre homesites be built next to Dawn Estates homes and a 50-foot buffer be added along Markham Woods Road. They also recommended a survey for threatened or endangered wildlife be conducted on the property.

County planners also approved a request by developer Neal Harris to merge about 60 acres of Alauqua west of Markham Woods Road into neighboring Alauqua Lakes.

## After the sandwiches, use leftover turkey a new way

If you have some leftover turkey and everyone has had all the sandwiches they want, use what remains for some delicious main dishes. You'll be economizing as well as introducing some quick new microwave meals.

Leftover turkey and wild rice combine in a casserole that would be just fine for guests.

### TURKEY AND WILD RICE CASEROLE

- 4 cups diced cooked turkey
  - 4 cups cooked wild rice
  - 1 medium onion, chopped
  - 1/2 cup chopped celery
  - 1/2 cup chopped pimento
  - 1/2 cup sliced almonds
  - 2 Tbsp. butter
  - 2 eggs, well beaten
  - 1 cup turkey broth or 1 teaspoon instant chicken bouillon dissolved in 1 cup hot water
  - 1/2 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup dry white wine\*
  - 1 tsp. salt
- Mix all ingredients on a 3-qt. casserole. Cover. Microwave on 100 percent power 8-10 minutes or until center is hot. Stir twice during cooking.

\*If you prefer to omit the white wine, you can use apple juice or increase the milk to 1 cup.

Convenience foods (canned soup) and cooked turkey make a really quick supper. Add a crisp green salad, fruit for dessert.

### TURKEY FLORENTINE

- 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
  - 1 can condensed turkey vegetable soup
  - 1 1/2 soup cans of milk
  - 1 cup chopped fresh spinach
  - 1 cup cooked chopped turkey
- Combine all ingredients in a 3 qt. casserole. Stir until well blended. Cover. Microwave on 100 percent power 7-8 minutes or until hot.

In 4 cup glass measure, combine cornstarch, bouillon, and brown sugar. Stir in soy sauce, vinegar and pineapple juice. Microwave on 100 percent power 2-3 minutes, or until sauce is clear and thickened. Stir every minute to ensure smoothness. Fold sauce into turkey mixture, cover, microwave on 100 percent power 4-6 minutes or until heated through. Serve over cooked rice.
