NEW YORK-"To defeat the aggressors is not enough to make peace," observed the Austrian-born free market economist Ludwig

von Mises. "The main thing is to discard the ideology that generates war." Von Mises conclusively demonstrated that the ideology of war was the belief in the allpowerful state. Significantly, his words quoted above from his magnum opus on economics 'Human Action,' were written in 1948 just as the first Arab-Israeli war was coming to its in-

conclusive end. The fighting in Palestine for the

establishment of a "Jewish homeland" was

horrors of Hitler's Nazism. However, unlike those refugees, Ludwig von Mises understood more clearly and profoundly his native Austria at the onset of Nazism in 1934. but he had forecast that conflict and those that have since engulfed the nations of the globe in

For example, in his 1944 work, "Omnipotent Total War," he wrote as the globe was engulied in World War U: "All the cratory of the advocates of government omnipotence cannot annul the fact that there is but one system that makes for durable peace; a free market economy.Government control leads to economic nationalism and thus results in conflict."

Any rational examination of the warring aggressors in every conflict since World War 1 to the present illustrates and confirms this ob-

The current and fourth Arab-Israeli war is a case in point. While most look upon the conflict as a clash between religions, in reality it is a clash between two forms of statism. The Arab nations tightly control their economies and their citizens by varying forms of state socialism. And imported from Europe via the Zionists.

The difference between the economic systems is only in degrees, not in principle. For



Cover-Up

WASHINGTON - The taxpayers were never supposed to find out how their money was squandered on President Nixon's San Clemente estate. When we started to investigate ast year, government officials played keepaway with the

The story of the cover-up is told in documents that have now fallen into our hands. The documents, though bearing the low classification "For Official Use Only," were treated They should have been open to the public under the Freedom of Information Act. But when we sought them, the

building supervisor at San Clemente, Carl Davis, suggested I assigned my associate Brit Hume in September 1972, to nvestigate the San Clemente renovations. Brit's inquiries touched off an alarm inside the General Services Ad-

ministration, which supervised the project.

struction engineer, William Robinson, on September 28, 1972. "Mr. Hume identified himself as being from Jack Anderson's office," reports a classified memo, "and was aware that Bill Robinson was the contracting officer at the Western White House, including the residence.

"It was apparent from the conversation that Mr. Hume was aware of all the contracts, scope of work, dollar amounts and contract numbers for all of the work which was done by Bill . . . Mr. Hume said it appeared there was something fishy going on and said he would like to see the records. Bill told him he no longer had any records . .

Instead of producing the records, however, GSA inestigated how we learned about the misuse of money at San Clemente. There were urgent calls between San Clemente and Washington. E. W. Baughman, the regional director in charge of public buildings, reported:
"I ...received a call from Rick Fanske who had been in

contact with Larry Roush and Frank Price (all GSA of ficials), and they wanted me to ascertain before the close of usiness who leaked the information to Hume, or how he

As part of the cover-up, the work done for the President t San Clemente was known by the secret code name, Project Sunrise." Recounted Baughman in his classified namo: "I called a quick meeting of those people who were knowledgeable on Operation Sunrise . . .

"I also at this time contacted Ernest Garbarino, building nanager, Western White House Field Office, and asked him o contact the City Building Department to determine what information they had available on the Western White House construction, and if this information was available to the "Ernie called back and reported that Mr. Carl Davis,

who is in charge of the building department at San Clemente. advised the files . . . are available to the public . . . These filed also carry the code name, 'Project Sunrise.' Dr. Davis indicated to Ernie that if so desired these files could be accidentally misplaced." Baughman, meanwhile, ducked a telephone call from

Brit. "The call was transfered to me and he was told I was not in," reported Baughman.

He added: "I informed the people having knowledge of Project Sunrise if they were contracted by Mr. Hume or any other news media, they are not to respond to questions, and abruptly and promptly refer such calls to the White House

Despite the effort to obstruct our investigation, we were able to publish the first report on October 3, 1972, that the President was renovating his old Spanish villa in San Clemente, in part, with public funds. We cited a \$13,500 bill that the taxpayers paid to buy the Nixons a new heating

The Secret Service bravely took the blame for the exenditure and offered us this imaginative explanation. "The heating system," said a spokesman, "was changed as a result of our suggestion that it be changed. We considered the former system to be in such condition that it was a threat to the President's security."

Yet the suppressed documents in our possession show that the President's architect, Harold Lynch, wrote White House aide John Ehriichman on June 18, 1969, listing the expected expenses that should be charged to the President personally. One item was \$11,807 for a system "to provide adequate heat for the residence."


There was also no mention of a new heating system in the original requests that the Secret Service made for government funds. Not until July 2, 1969, was the heating system added to the government expenses. Noted John F. Galuardi, a GSA official, in a memo to the



vandalism since the strike by the International rotherhood of Electrical Workers began midnight Wed-But the union denied responsibility with vandalism. 'They're going to blame every little thing that happens on

us," said Leonard Spring, president of IBEW local 359. Police arrested five strikers at FP&L's Port Everglades plant Friday when they allegedly interfered with a supply truck and authorities said a nonstriking worker was injured when he was struck by a rock. FP&L said it had 800 supervisory employes in the field to

restore service interrupted by vandalism. "We have the personnel to restore service, but they aren't being allowed to do the job," said FP&L spokesman Stan Hugunin. "It's difficult when the strikers follow you out and threaten you and slash your tires."

Management and union representatives said they were ready to re-open negotiations but both sides said the other would have to make the first move.

"We'll be ready to talk any time of the day or night," said FP&L industrial relations official John Stall. "It's up to them to call a meeting. After all, they were the ones who left us." "We're ready to meet them any time," said Spring. "They're the ones who left us."
