

During Stop In Brazil

Carter Gives Begin Vote Of Confidence

BRASILIA, Brazil (UPI) — President Carter gave a vote of confidence today to Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin and said he believed the Begin government is completely capable of negotiating a settlement with Egypt.

In a news conference at the island capital Carter tried to play down the serious disputes with Israel over the question of human rights and President Brando Góes's \$6 billion agreement with West Germany for a nuclear reactor that can produce weapons-grade plutonium.

Carter, who has been given a public welcome in Brazil in sharp contrast to the warm welcome he received in Venezuela, conferred with Góes before flying on to Rio de Janeiro.

In a brief speech to the Brazilian congress after the news conference, Carter stressed the "common problems" of Brazil and the United States and asked for cooperative

questions from both the White House press corps covering his trip and from South American journalists.

Brazil is the second stop on Carter's four-month, 14,000-mile journey to South America and Africa. He flew later today to Rio de Janeiro for an unofficial visit and talks with two Roman Catholic cardinals who are outspoken critics of Góes's military government.

Carter's most forceful remarks concerned the Middle East and the search for peace there.

Carter called "completely false" reports that his administration was seeking the ouster of the Israeli Prime Minister in hopes of facilitating a Middle East peace settlement.

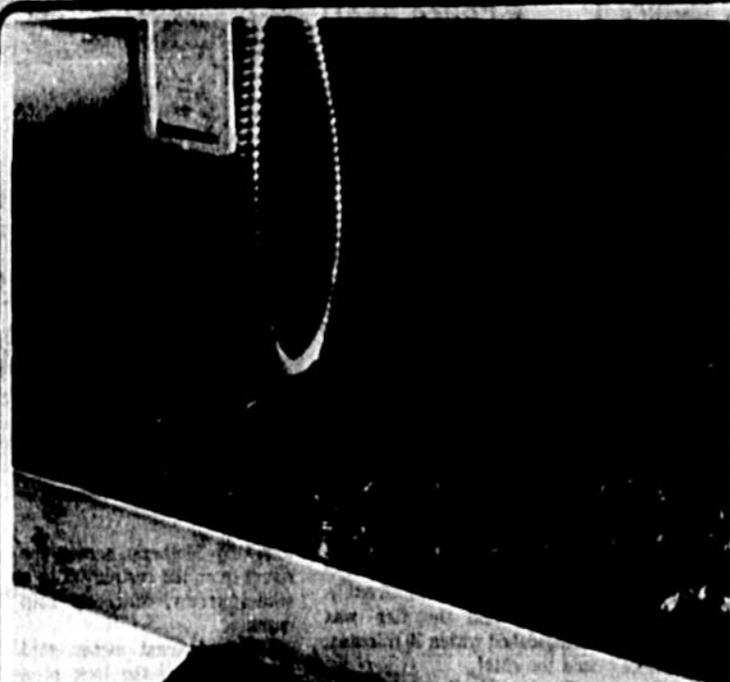
"I can say unequivocally that no one in a position of authority in the U.S. government has indicated that Prime Minister Begin is unqualified and should be replaced," he said.

"We are not giving up hope of a negotiated peace settlement in the Middle East," Carter said, adding that the visit to Cairo of Israeli Defense Minister Ezer Weizman represented a "step toward compatibility."

Weizman flew from Tel Aviv to Cairo today. Carter said there still are "big differences that must be resolved" including the Palestinian problem and Israel's interpretation of U.N. Resolution 242 calling for Israel to yield occupied Arab lands.

"I think the Begin government is completely capable of negotiating a settlement with Egypt," Carter said.

Carter defended his proposal to sell fighter jets to Saudi Arabia and Egypt as well as to Israel, a move that has been strongly criticized in Congress and in Tel Aviv.



BLIND MOSQUITOES TARGET OF SANFORD TASK FORCE
 Impact Study Unveiled

Mosquitoes:

Midge Toll: \$4.69 Million

The blind mosquito is costing property owners, government and the business community in Sanford \$4.69 million annually in terms of unsuccessful real-estate efforts, losses of sales and tax revenues and declining values of affected properties according to an economic impact study prepared by the Sanford Chamber of Commerce midge task force with cooperation from the University of Florida.

And the anticipated future loss is \$6.8 million, according to a formula used by the State Department of Commerce to calculate such losses.

The economic impact study will be delivered to the Sanford Chamber of Commerce at a breakfast meeting at the Holiday Inn at 11:30 a.m. Friday.

John Krider, chairman of the task force, said that the legislature to provide \$200,000 in state money to initiate a research program to find an ecologically and environmentally safe method of controlling the insects.

In addition, the University of Florida, which would be directing the research program at its Sanford research center if funding is approved, has agreed to include the \$200,000 in its budget.

Krider said the special legislation is the best being used in case the legislature cannot be included in the university budget for these reasons.

Along with the impact study, the chamber committee of which Krider is chairman, is submitting photographs and Evening Herald news accounts illustrating the problem with the midges including automobile accident reports.

Other cities in the state are also being urged to submit information about their mosquito problems to the University of Florida.

Also being submitted are letters from the nine Central Florida and South Florida counties which are plagued with similar midge mosquito problems.

"We have heard no opposition to the requested funding of the proposed research program," said Krider, adding, "This program will have more impact on the City of Sanford than any other program."

"The massive program of these pests has been and is continuing to be a source of personal suffering and economic loss to the health, welfare, safety and well-being and to property of the citizens of Seminole County," according to the preamble to the impact study.

Krider said the midge problem has been reversed with increasing severity over recent years.

"The South Seminole County area has been hit by a two-week period of breeding of blind mosquitoes. By 1977, the severity of the problem has increased to now cover a six to eight-month span of more than a year."

Health Plan Faces County Opposition

A program to control mosquitoes in Seminole County will meet stiff opposition in the county commission unless information being prepared by Terry Tuck, director of Human Services, sways current opinion.

A preliminary sampling of commissioners indicates a majority are presently opposed to spending up to \$100,000 for a county-wide mosquito control program. Seminole is the only county in central Florida without a spraying program, said Tuck.

Volusia and Brevard counties spend about \$1 million annually to control mosquitoes, said Tuck. He noted they are not spraying because they are rural counties and it would be too costly for the comfort of the tourists as for health reasons.

Recently Dr. Humada Battie, county public health director, submitted a memo to the county commission urging such a program to prevent an outbreak of St. Louis encephalitis.

Last year, according to Dr. Battie, three persons died in Seminole County as a result of encephalitis.

"We ought to look at the correlation with other counties," Commissioner Bill Kirshoff, "to see if there is a relationship between us and other counties in the number of encephalitis cases here and in counties that spray."

"There is no specific vaccine for St. Louis encephalitis," said Dr. Berra Iyengar, pediatrician and member of the Seminole Memorial Inflection Control Committee. He noted the only effective method of controlling the disease is to eradicate mosquitoes.

The disease is carried from birds by mosquitoes to humans, according to Dr. Battie.

"If the money is to be used to save lives," said Kirshoff, "we ought to look at the program and the need and see if there is a more effective way to spend money to save lives. Perhaps we should look at our mosquito and see what we can do to save lives in our counties last year. We should not spend the money unless it is cost effective."

"I'm still opposed to the program," commented Commissioner Bill French, "until someone proves to me that it is needed. He can't just claim an epidemic that we are going to have an epidemic."

French indicated he would favor the program if there is a need.

"I don't see how it is needed or someone shows me that we are going to have a health problem unless we do it, I'd have to be convinced," said Kirshoff.

Casselberry Spray Plans Start

Casselberry's mosquito control program begins as planned this morning, said Mayor Bill Orin.

The plan for the operation calls for the entire city to be covered during a two-day, eight-hour a day, period weekly for the next five months in the mosquito breeding season.

Equipment is being placed on "roll-in" mosquito breeding areas around town and cash.

When the shipment of chemicals for the program had not arrived by Wednesday morning, Orin said he would like to see the city officials in Sanford to lead Casselberry the necessary chemicals.

Paulucci To Lake Mary

Deal Asked On Lawsuit

A representative of industrial and real estate development companies, Joe Paulucci, urged the Lake Mary City Council Thursday night to offer a compromise to the county commission to encourage the board to withdraw a lawsuit against the city in connection with a 100-acre tract.

Attorney Joe Davis, representing the Paulucci interests, said if the city were willing to donate the 40 acres west of Banana Lake the county may follow a path in an suit with the City of Sebring and drop the lawsuit challenging the commission by the city of 1,000 acres north of Lake Mary bounded by Mountain Woods Road, one half section above Fuchs Road and west of Interstate 1.

The property owned by the city last summer included the Paulucci Subdivision, the former Planned Unit Development, Interstate Corridor and the Lee Tract.

In Davis' statement, the result of the meeting was that a decision pending advice from City Attorney Guy Paulucci.

Davis added the main obstacle in the county's challenge of the commission are that the property is not contiguous — physically breaking other city land — and that the commission creates an enclave. The attorney said the property is certainly contiguous and in the opinion no enclave is created.

But, Davis said the de-commission would resolve the county's contention concerning creation of an enclave.

The definition of the word enclave has not been determined by the courts. The county insists the word means a county area partially surrounded by city property while the city contends it means a county area completely surrounded by city property.

Davis said he is suggesting the compromise because of the time involved for the court case to reach an ultimate conclusion and because of the costs of litigation.

He said that while the circuit court approval Paulucci wanted the suit on Lake Mary's behalf, the county appeared that decision to the Appellate Court and that matter has not been resolved.

Davis added that apparently whatever party — the county or the city — wins the commission suit at the circuit court level, it will be appealed to higher courts.

If the Appellate Court rules that Paulucci cannot enter the suit on Lake Mary's side, Davis said he would appeal the suit as "a friend of the court" and submit briefs on various aspects of the commission.

He noted that the county dropped a threatened challenge of a Paulucci subdivision after that city donated a small tract from the same land.

"We are trying to find a solution where the property can be used for its intended purpose," Davis said.

At 26, Hons Oldest In U.S.?

What may be the world's oldest German Shepherd is still alive in Water "City," and had a stroke only six weeks ago, is celebrating her 26th birthday today. The dog's name is Gertie, and she was born in 1944 to Mrs. and Mrs. James Hottel, (Gertie and Henry), of Water "City."

Other dogs have strayed, but when a German Shepherd lives 20, 30 or 40 human years, there's a little more news.

According to Altamonte Springs veterinarian William Hottel, a 26-year-old German Shepherd is unheard of for a large breed.

"This must be some kind of record, at least as far as this office is concerned," he said.

The oldest dog he has seen was a small dog 20 years old, he added. The average lifespan for a German Shepherd is 11 years, Dr. Hottel said.

The Osteen Public Library reported the average lifespan for dogs is 12-15 years, but said the German Shepherd of Hottel's was a record holder who was killed in 1958 in Australia at the age of 20 years, she stated.

Mrs. Hottel reported that, when full grown, Gertie was 18 inches tall, from a hound in Ohio as a young pup.

"This dog was being maintained for some reason."

"The man wouldn't even let her out with the rest of the puppies and had to be planned to do away with her. I took her, and she lived for 26 years. She has been a very contented dog all her life, she has suffered with age," she stated.

Laughing, she added, "She still greets and greets her family when I come home from work." Mrs. Hottel also admitted to having been bitten 20 times on her hands.

Another German Shepherd, "Dingo-Ling," is a member of the Hottel household. "They are both old, but get a little better," she said, referring to Mrs. Hottel.

She added that she feeds the dogs to their appetite.

"I never give them any fat. I give them chicken bones and meat and milk and eggs. After a while, I remove all the fat and add three-fourths of a cup of the mixture to their dry food. I thought old people pander to the food side."

The oldest part of the dog diet consists of raw vegetables and fruits, including carrots, tomatoes, lettuce, celery, apples, oranges and mangoes. "They are very easy on the stomach and when they get it, they get better," she said.

Mrs. Hottel also said "Dingo-Ling" has been hit with arthritis and walks with difficulty.

"She is getting hard-of-hearing now and she can't hear when I call her name, but her appetite is still tremendous," she said.

The dogs are available to the best of Mrs. Hottel's ability through Coleman's help. She said she will be glad to give any information on the dogs to anyone who is interested.

"I've been interested in dogs since I was a child. I've owned many dogs and I've had a lot of fun with them," she said. "I'm glad to help anyone who is interested in the dogs."
