

Busing Aids Integration WASHINGTON (UPI) - Broad school desegregation programs that cover entire metropolitan areas are proving much more effective than programs confined o city lmiits, a 14-city study says. The two-year study found that broad school desegregation programs, which often force busing on surrounding suburbs, give white families no place to run" as well as incentives to live in integrated areas where their children can attend neighborhood schools. The result is such a sharp increase in housing integration that some cities may be able to eliminate

school busing sometime in the future, the study says. Thurmond Aims Federal Cut


