**Land Deal OKd** On 'Leadership

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) The State Cabinet agreed to pay \$2.5 million for 100 acres of land on Cape Florida, pending the result of negotiations still in progress on the option date for more of the land in the proposed recreation area.
